IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in the schedule hereto for a period of five years as from date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

- (a) All that portion of the Moore River between its junction with the sea and Boobabbie Bridge situate approximately eight (8) miles by water from the mouth of the said river.
- (b) All that portion of Western Australian waters lying seawards within a radius of one-half mile of the mouth of the Moore River.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia by and with the consent and advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of five (5) years from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

All that portion of the Canning River from a line starting at the intersection of the eastern side of Canning Beach Road (road number 8869) and the southern side of road number 10002 and terminating at the westernmost corner of lot 3 of Canning Location 37, as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 11877, a point near the northernmost intersection of Melville Parade and Canning Highway, to a line starting at the intersection of the south-eastern side of Canning Highway and the eastern side of The Esplanade and terminating at the intersection of the eastern side of Leonora Street and the north-eastern side of Wooltana Road.

Town Planning Scheme No. 6—Acanthus Road
Area Redevelopment Scheme.

RESOLVED that the Canning Shire Council in pursuance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962, prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situated wholly within the Canning Shire and enclosed within the inner edge of a blue border on the plan now produced to the Canning Shire Council and marked and certified by the President and the Shire Clerk of the Council under their hands dated the 27th day of August, 1962, as Plan No. 1 and Plan No. 2.

Details of Scheme No. 6.

1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for the administration and enforcement of this Scheme is the Canning Shire Council hereinafter referred to as the Council.

2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan No. 1 and on Plan No. 2. The said land is herein referred to as "the Area."

3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—

- (a) to improve and develop the area to the best possible advantage;
- (b) to plan within the area suitable roads;
- (c) to ensure proper drainage of roads and of those parts of the area which require drainage;
- (d) to plan the subdivision of the land within the area;
- (e) to facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the area;
- (f) to make the area available for light industries and restricted types of industry and for show rooms and warehouses, shops and for residences in manner shown on Plan No. 2;
- (g) to encourage the use of the land within the area for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (f) hereof;
- (h) to make provision for public open space.

4. Method of Carrying out Objects: It is intended that the area shall be zoned for the uses and in manner shown on Plan No. 2.

5. It is intended that as and when owners of land within the area desire to develop and subdivide their land such development and subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development for the area.

6. The plan of subdivision shown in Plan No. 2 forms a basis for subdivision and development of the area but the Council may permit alterations or variations to the plan where circumstances justify such action, provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it shall impede the subdivision and development of the area as a whole.

7. Subdivision: An owner of land within the area who desires to subdivide and develop his land either alone or in conjunction with other owners shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

8. New Roads: All new roads within the area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the area of the land owned by him.

9. In cases where the situation of a new road within the area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them then the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

10. If the Council shall construct or drain a new road within the area prior to subdivision of the land adjoining such road the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land paid by the Council shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land as and when their land is subdivided and the provisions of paragraphs 8, 9 and 12 shall apply in respect to such payments.

11. (1) The portion of Sixth Avenue hatched yellow on Plan No. 2 shall be closed. Upon the owners of land adjoining the said portion of Sixth Avenue subdividing their said land in accordance with Plan No. 2 the said portion of Sixth Avenue

shall vest in such adjoining owners without any payment so that they each shall become entitled to the respective portions shown on the said plan.

- (b) that the said owner will make the said land coloured orange on Plan No. 2 available to the owner of all that piece of land being—

Portion of Canning Location 25 and being portion of lot 1134 on Plan 4394 and being portion of the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1153, folio 225, to be incorporated with such land upon its subdivision on such terms as shall be agreed upon by such owners and in the event of disagreement upon such terms as shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained; and

if the said offer shall not be accepted the said land may be retained by the Council and may be used or disposed of as the Council shall determine.

12. Drainage: Each owner upon the subdivision of his land shall pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion to the estimated costs of drainage of the area as the area of his land bears to the whole of the privately owned land within the area at the coming into operation of this Scheme and the Council shall at an appropriate time carry out the drainage scheme of the area in accordance with the drainage plan approved by the Council with such modifications as may from time to time be determined by the Council, and shall recoup its expenditure from the moneys so obtained. This clause shall not apply to any drainage works undertaken in the area by the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Department.

13. Land Reserved for Public or Local Authority Purposes: It is intended that the tract or tracts of land coloured green on Plan No. 2 shall be reserved for public recreational purposes and those hatched green on Plan No. 2 shall be reserved for roads.

14. The Council may acquire the land hatched or coloured green either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.

15. The Council shall do all things necessary in order to raise a loan for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the acquisition of the said land hatched or coloured green on Plan No. 2. If the Council shall be unable to raise the said loan it shall be under no liability to the owners of land within the area or to any other person by reason of its failure to provide the said land as public open space or roads.

16. If the Council shall raise the said loan or make finance available from other sources it shall acquire the said land hatched or coloured green on the said Plan, or so much thereof as the said loan or finances permit.

17. Each owner shall when subdividing his land pay to the Council an amount equal to one-tenth of the value of his land at the date of which the subdivision of his land is approved by the Town Planning Board.

18. For the purpose of clause 17 of this Scheme the value of the owners land shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department

of Western Australia. If any owner objects to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the value and in that event the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with clause 26 hereof.

19. The Council shall apply all moneys paid to it in pursuance of clause 17 hereof in reduction of the said loan and interest thereon or if the Council has made finance available from other sources then in reimbursement of such moneys. In the event of the moneys received by the Council in pursuance with clause 17 being insufficient to repay the said loan and interest or other moneys the Council shall repay the balance thereof from its general fund.

20. In the event of the moneys received by the Council in pursuance of clause 17 hereof being greater than the amount necessary to repay the said loan and interest thereon or other money the balance thereof shall be applied by the Council in further improvements and facilities within the area of the Scheme.

21. Land Acquired by the Council: If the Council shall resume land so that it may be used for a specific purpose other than that of public or local authority purposes it may sell or otherwise dispose of such land upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit to any person who shall agree to use the land for that purpose.

22. Zoning: The land within the area shall be zoned for the uses shown in Plan No. 2. The Council shall amend its by-laws to provide for the land to be zoned accordingly. Uses existing at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme shall be allowed to continue subject to the provisions of the Council's by-laws relating to non-conforming uses.

23. In accordance with the proposed zoning of the area as shown on Plan No. 2 certain lots are zoned partly for residential purposes and partly for industrial or light industrial purposes. In those cases the owners of the lots shall use each portion of the lot only for the use or uses permitted in the Zone in which such portion is situated.

24. Change of Zoning: Nothing herein shall prevent the change of the zoning of any of the land within the area if the usual procedure for change of such zoning be followed.

25. Powers and Authorities of the Council: In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the area.
- (b) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the area.
- (c) If any owner of land within the area does not proceed with the subdivision and development of his land in accordance with the terms of this Scheme and his failure to do so in the opinion of the Council will unduly delay the completion of the Scheme the Council may resume the land of such owner and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (d) In the event of the Council exercising its power under clause (c) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land but before selling the land so subdivided and developed it shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption subdivision and development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision and secondly

in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance if any of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.

- (e) If the offer mentioned in clause (d) hereof be not accepted the Council may retain all or any part of the said land but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (f) The Council may resume any land within the area for public or local authority purposes or in order to make it available for a particular use shown in the said plan in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (g) If after any portion of the area has been developed in accordance with this Scheme the owner of any land in the portion of the area so developed is not using such land for the purpose for which it is zoned and is in the opinion of the Council preventing or impeding such use by refusing to sell or lease the said land or only agreeing so to do on terms which the Council considers unreasonable the Council may resume the said land and resell it or otherwise dispose of it on the condition that it will be used for the said purposes but otherwise upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit.

26. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under this Scheme or as to the valuation of land under clause 18 hereof may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council.

27. Moneys Received by the Council: All moneys received by the Council under the provisions of this Scheme shall be held by the Council and used for the purposes of this Scheme and shall not form part of the general revenue of the Council.
