IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets, in all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto, for a period of five years from 1st January, 1964.

The waters of that part of Cockburn Sound at Kwinana Beach extending one-quarter of a mile north and south of the "Kwinana" wreck and extending seawards one-quarter of a mile measured rectangularly from the foreshore.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which, by Act of Legislature or by Order in Council, may be vested in the heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in Eric Arthur Jenkins or any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Eric Arthur Jenkins and any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3162/62.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 686 for the purpose of Conservation of Flora at Tenterden should be placed under the control of the Shire of Cranbrook as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Shire of Cranbrook as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1079/53, L. & S. 5387/52.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the 23rd day of November, 1953, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposals had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 39 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Great Southern Towns Country Water Area.
