WHEREAS it is enacted by the Second Schedule to the Stamp Act, 1921-1963, that the stamp duty payable on any statement written out or caused to be written out by the manager of a dairy produce factory registered under the Dairy Industry Act, 1922, or his agent pursuant to the provisions of the Dairy Cattle Industry Compensation Act, 1960, in respect of the sale of any butter fat, whether payment of the purchase money in respect of any such sale is or is not made in full at the time of the sale or is to be made by instalments or is otherwise deferred is, for every £1 and also for any fractional part of £1 of the amount of the purchase money in respect of any butter fat sold,

the amount of twopence (or such amount, being not more than twopence, as the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation declare); and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, desirable that an amount be so declared: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act first abovementioned, do hereby declare that, as from and including the 1st day of January, 1964, the stamp duty payable shall be an amount of one-eighth of one penny, in lieu of the amount of twopence.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section four of the Alumina Refinery Agreement Act, 1961, that after a date to be fixed by Proclamation, which date shall not be earlier than the date of the construction of the deviation railway and the deviation road referred to in subclause (1) of clause 3 of the agreement, a copy of which is set forth in the schedule to that Act, so much of the railway made under the Coogee-Kwinana Railway Act, 1952, as is necessary to give effect to that agreement, shall cease to operate and so much of the public road known as the Perth-Naval Base Road, as is necessary to give effect to the agreement, shall be closed and all rights of way over it shall cease; and whereas that deviation railway and that deviation road have been constructed and it is expedient that the date abovementioned now be fixed: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby fix the 13th day of December, 1963, as the day on which that portion of the line of the said railway constructed upon the land described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to operate and the day on which that portion of the public road known as Cockburn Road, described in the Alumina Refinery Agreement Act, 1961, as the Perth-Naval Base Road described in the Second Schedule shall be closed and all rights of way over it shall cease.

Land Act, 1933-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2950/62.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1962, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27094 (King Location 247) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Lands in trust for the purpose of Use and Requirements of the Government: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held

by the Minister for Lands in trust for Use and Requirements of the Government with power to the said Minister for Lands to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Appointment of Commissioner.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1089/63.

WHEREAS it is provided in section 31 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where a municipality has no council the Governor may, by order, appoint such person as he thinks fit to be a Commissioner of a municipality; and whereas a new municipality designated the Shire of Exmouth has been constituted as from the 1st January, 1964; and whereas that municipality has no council; and whereas it is considered expedient to appoint a Commissioner to administer the affairs of the district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby appoint James Peter Kenyon Murdoch, O.B.E., to be Commissioner of the Municipality of the Shire of Exmouth as from the 1st day of January, 1964.

Severance of Area from Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya and Constitution of Shire of Exmouth.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. G. 431/63.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor upon the presentation of a petition by a majority of the ratepayers who occupy rateable land in a portion of a district may sever a portion from a district and constitute that portion as the district of a new Shire; and whereas it is further provided in subsection (4) of the said section that the Governor may give such directions as he thinks necessary in order to make the number of offices of member of a Council conform to the limits imposed by the Act; and whereas it is further provided in subsection (3) of section 10 of the said Act that the number of offices of member of a Council is determined according to the provisions of the subsection; and whereas it is considered expedient to grant the prayer of the petition and to sever the portion of the district and constitute it as a new Shire: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby sever from the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya the area specified in the schedule hereto and doth constitute that area as a new municipality to be known as the Shire of Exmouth with five members.

This order is to take effect as and from the 1st day of January, 1964.

Severance and Annexation of Land and Directions Concerning Elections.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 28/53.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor, upon the presentation of a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers who occupy rateable land in a portion of a district, may sever from one district and annex to another district the portion of the district concerned; and whereas a majority of the ratepayers who occupy rateable land within that portion of the district specified in the schedule hereto have submitted a petition praying that the area set forth in the schedule should be severed from the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu and annexed to the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Yalgoo; and whereas it is further provided in section 20 of the said Act that upon the exercise of a power conferred by section 12 the Governor may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office, and when, and may direct the holding on a day appointed by the order of an election of such members so affected as the case requires; and whereas it is considered expedient to grant the prayer of the petition: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) sever from the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu and annex to the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Yalgoo to form part of the Paynes Find Ward thereof the land specified in the schedule hereto;
- (b) direct that the councillor representing the North-East Ward of the Shire of Dalwallinu shall retire from office on the 23rd day of May, 1964, and that an election shall be held on that day for returning one member for the North-East Ward;
- (c) direct that the members at present representing the South Ward of the Shire of Yalgoo shall retire from office on the 23rd day of May, 1964, on which day an election shall be held to return three members for that Ward.

This order shall take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1964.

## Town of Geraldton.

Alteration of Wards, Increase of Membership  
and Direction concerning Election.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 2221/52.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraphs (g) and (h) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, upon effectual presentation of a petition bearing the Common Seal of the municipality, alter the boundaries of wards existing in a district or create new wards in a district; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (j) of the said subsection that the Governor may, within the limits prescribed by this Act, determine and alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) that the Governor may give effect to an alteration in the number of members of a council; and whereas it is further provided by subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election to elect members so affected; and whereas the Municipality of the Town of Geraldton has submitted a petition under its Common Seal praying for the division of the East Ward into two Wards to be known as the North Ward and East Ward respectively and to increase the membership by three members; and whereas it is considered expedient to grant the prayer of the petition: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and the consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (1) alter the boundaries of the existing East Ward by the creation therefrom of a new Ward to be designated the "North Ward" as described in the schedule hereto, leaving the remaining portion as the East Ward, as set forth in the schedule hereto;
- (2) describe the boundaries of the Wards of the district after the alteration, as set forth in the schedule hereto;
- (3) alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to the municipality from nine to twelve and determine that the three additional members shall be allocated to the North Ward;
- (4) direct that on the 23rd day of May, 1964, the three members now holding office for the East Ward shall retire from office and an election shall be held on that day to elect three new members for the East Ward and three new members for the North Ward;
- (5) further direct that the three members now holding office for the East Ward shall continue to represent that Ward and also the new North Ward until an election is held on the 23rd day of May, 1964.

## Town of Geraldton—Redivision of Wards.

## (a) Central Ward.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre line of Bayly Street, and extending south-easterly to and along that centre line to the centre line of George Road; thence generally south-westerly along that centre line to the centre line of Durlacher Street; thence generally southerly along that centre line to the centre line of Maitland Street; thence south-westerly along that centre line to the centre line of Augustus Street; thence westerly along that centre line to the centre line of Gregory Street; thence northerly and north-westerly along that centre line and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian

Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally north-easterly along that low water mark to the starting point.

## (b) North Ward.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Victoria Location 2114, and extending easterly to and along that boundary to the western side of the North-West Coastal Highway (road number 1977); thence south-easterly and southerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 1713; thence easterly and along that boundary and the southern boundary of location 1712, to the north-western corner of location 2276; thence southerly along the western boundaries of that location and location 1954, the eastern boundaries of Geraldton Town Lots 1194 (Reserve 1858) and 1202 (Reserve 21614), and the eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of lots 1184 and 1182, to the southern side of a one-chain road passing along the southern boundaries of the lastmentioned lot and lot 1181; thence westerly along that side to the north-western corner of location 2048; thence southerly along the western boundary of that location and onwards to the northern boundary of location 1956; thence westerly along that boundary and onwards to the western side of Rowe Street; thence southerly along that side to the centre line of Bayly Street; thence north-westerly along that centre line and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along that low water mark to the starting point.

## (c) West Ward.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre line of Gregory Street, and extending south-easterly and southerly to and along that centre line to the centre line of Augustus Street; thence easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Maitland Street; thence north-easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Durlacher Street; thence south-easterly and generally southerly along that centre line to the northern boundary of Victoria Location 181; thence westerly along the northern boundaries of that location and location 6848, and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally north-westerly, generally northerly and generally easterly along that low water mark to the starting point.

## (d) East Ward.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of Victoria Location 6848, and extending easterly to and along the northern boundaries of that location and location 181, to the centre line of Durlacher Street; thence generally northerly along that centre line to the centre line of George Road; thence generally north-easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Bayly Street; thence south-easterly along that centre line to the western side of Rowe Street; thence northerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 1956; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the north-western corner of location 2197; and thence southerly along the western boundary of that location and onwards to the southern side of Eastward Road; thence easterly along that side to the northernmost north-eastern corner of location 2185; thence southerly, westerly, again southerly, again westerly, and again southerly and again westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the north-eastern corner of location 8072; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location and the southern boundaries of locations 8071 and 673; and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 8056; thence southerly, south-westerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to its south-western corner; thence southerly in prolongation of the western boundary

of that location to the northern boundary of location 4940, thence westerly along that boundary and onwards to the north-eastern corner of location 181 aforesaid; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the northern boundary of location 664; thence easterly, southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the western side of Geraldton Highway (road number 417); thence south-easterly along that side to the south-eastern corner of location 1298; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally north-westerly along that low water mark to the starting point.

Murchison Regional Vermin Council.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G.D. 593/63.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act, 1960-1962, it is provided that the Governor, at the request made by the councils of two or more municipalities, may, by order, constitute as a regional district for local government purposes, whether under that or another Act, the whole or portion of the combined area of the district of those municipalities; and shall in the order assign a name to the district and specify the number of members to be allotted to the district and to be nominated by each constituent council; and whereas the councils of the municipalities of the Shires of Cue, Meekatharra, Mt. Magnet, Sandstone and Yalgoo have made a request that the whole of their districts be constituted as a regional district for the local government purpose of the rehabilitation and maintenance of the No. 1 Vermin Fence: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute as a regional district, for the local government purpose of the rehabilitation and maintenance of the No. 1 Vermin Fence the whole of the area of the districts of the Shires of Cue, Meekatharra, Mt. Magnet, Sandstone and Yalgoo and doth assign to the district the name "Murchison Regional Vermin District" and doth specify that ten members, of whom two shall be nominated by each constituent council, shall be allotted to the district.

Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott.

Increase in Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 626/59.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor, on presentation of an effective petition under the Seal of the municipality, may alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas the Municipality of the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott has submitted a petition under the Seal of the council praying that the number of members should be increased from eight to nine and the additional member allotted to the Roleystone Ward; and whereas it is considered desirable that the prayer of the petition should be granted; and whereas it is further provided in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that where the Governor exercises a power relating to the number of offices of member of a council he may by order direct the holding on a day appointed by the order, being a day within a period of six months from the date of the order of an election of such members so affected: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to the municipality of the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott from eight to nine councillors and direct that the additional

councillor be allotted to the Roleystone Ward, and doth further direct and declare in accordance with the power conferred by section 20 (1) (a) (ii) that an election shall be held on the 23rd day of May, 1964, for the purpose of returning an additional member for the Roleystone Ward.
