NOTICE is hereby given of the intention of the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the works hereinafter described by virtue of the powers contained under the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962.

> Description of Proposed Works. Metropolitan Main Drainage. Bayswater-Swan Guildford. Hamersley Avenue Branch Drain. Hampton Park Drainage Area.

(a) Construction of an open channel and piped drain approximately 9,800 feet in length between Perth Avenue and Wonga Road. The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking.

(b) Some improvements to the existing drainage between Wonga Road and Bennett Brook.

The Localities in which the Proposed Works will be Constructed or Provided.

Portion of the Shires of Bayswater and Swan-Guildford as more particularly described hereunder and shown on Plan W.M.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8992.

(a) Commencing at a point in lot 25, Perth Avenue, Hampton Park, and proceeding in a south-Avenue, Hampton Park, and proceeding in a south-erly direction through lot 24, Perth Avenue, thence in an easterly direction through lot 3, Ivanhoe Street, to and across Ivanhoe Street and through lots 57, 58, 59 and 60, Araluen Street and lots 100, 99 and 98 Hamersley Avenue, thence southerly through lot 97, Hamersley Avenue, and proceeding south-geasterly across Hamersley Avenue south-easterly across Hamersley Avenue, and proceeding south-easterly across Hamersley Avenue, to and through lot 15, Hamersley Avenue, thence easterly from the said lot 15, across lot 16, Hamersley Avenue, and Hampton Square and through lots 17, 18 and 19, Hamersley Avenue, to the eastern boundary of lot 20, thence north through the said lot 20 to Hamersley Avenue and across Hamersley Avenue in a north-easterly direction, thence northerly through lot 84, easterly through lots 83, 82, 81, 80 and 79, Hamersley Avenue, and through lots 73 to 78 inclusive, Araluen Street, and across Beechboro Road into location 1180, thence in a southerly direction towards the southern boundary of location 1180, thence along the said boundary to a point opposite lot 307, Doris Crescent, thence in a north-easterly direction across location 1180 to the northern boundary, thence easterly along the said boundary within location 1180 to a point on the south side of Wonga Road, approximately 1,200 feet west of Altone Road.

To provide drainage for the area through which the drains pass.
