### FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1963.

Department of Labour,  
Perth, 23rd December, 1963.

F. and S. 184/61.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the Factories and Shops Act, 1963, and the Interpretation Act, 1918-1962, has been pleased to—

(a) revoke regulation 41B of the Factories and Shops (General) Regulations, 1939; and

(b) make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder;

so that both the revocation and the regulations take effect on and after the 1st day of January, 1964.

#### Schedule.

#### Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Factories and Shops (Rostered Extraordinary Trading Hours) Regulations, 1964.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Factories and Shops Act, 1963;

“Appendix” means the Appendix to these regulations;

“Part” means a part of the Appendix;

“Regulation” means one of these regulations; and words and expressions used have the same meanings as are given them under, and for the purposes of, the Act.

3. Those portions of the State described in Division 1 of each of the respective Parts are prescribed, pursuant to section 92 of the Act, as zones and may be referred to by the respective numbers, names or both assigned to them in the Appendix.

4. (1) The shops mentioned in Division 2 of each of the respective Parts are prescribed, pursuant to section 92 of the Act, as those which, subject to these regulations, may be, and are required to be, opened during extraordinary trading hours for the sale of requisites.

(2) Where Division 2 of any or all of the respective Parts is amended by the substitution of a new Division 2, the substituted Division shall come into operation on the first day therein mentioned.

5. The respective days (in these regulations called “the rostered extraordinary trading period”) on which the shops prescribed by regulation 4 may be, and are required to be, opened are those shown in Division 2 of each of the respective Parts opposite the shops mentioned in the Division.

6. The respective times (in these regulations called "the extraordinary trading times"), during the rostered extraordinary trading period, when the shops prescribed by regulation 4 may be, and are required to be, opened are those set out in Division 3 of each of the respective Parts.

7. The requisites that shops prescribed under regulation 4 are, pursuant to section 92 of the Act, required to sell, during the extraordinary trading times, are—

- (a) fuel;
- (b) oil;
- (c) lubricants;
- (d) tyres;
- (e) batteries;
- (f) distilled water; and
- (g) such other requisites (within the meaning of the Act) as the shopkeeper has in stock at the shop.

8. (1) Where Christmas Day or Good Friday is included in any rostered extraordinary trading period, every shopkeeper of a shop in a zone shall keep his shop closed for the whole of that day; and, where Anzac Day is included in any such period, every shopkeeper of a shop in a zone shall keep his shop closed for the whole of that day, unless that shop is one mentioned in Division 2 of any of the respective Parts, in which case the shop shall be kept closed until 1 p.m. on that day and thereafter may be, and is required to be, kept open during the extraordinary trading times prescribed for a Saturday in that zone.

(2) For the purpose of preserving uniformity in each rostered extraordinary trading period, the hours during which, but for this regulation, a shopkeeper would have been permitted to, and been required to, keep his shop open for the sale of requisites during extraordinary trading times shall be deemed to be included in the rostered extraordinary trading period, as though the shop had been open during those times.

9. Where the shopkeeper of a shop prescribed by regulation 4 intends to cease carrying on the business of selling any of the requisites prescribed by regulation 7 he shall, at least fourteen days before so ceasing to carry on business, give to the Chief Inspector notice of that intention and of the day on which it is to take effect.

(b) is not the Commissioner of Police, it shall—

- (i) remit to the Commissioner, not later than the fifteenth day of the month following the issue of the licenses and transfers, the amount of stamp duty payable on those licenses and transfers; and
- (ii) furnish to the Commissioner, not later than the fifteenth day of the month following the month of issue of any licenses or transfers, a statement, in duplicate, in the form of Form K in the schedule to these regulations together with the valuation forms in respect of those licenses and transfers.

(2) Every license or transfer on which stamp duty is paid to a Local Authority, pursuant to this regulation, shall be endorsed as follows:—

## STAMP DUTY.

7E. An application for a motor vehicle license by a dealer shall be in writing and shall be accompanied by a declaration in the form of Form M in the schedule to these regulations.

- (a) by adding after the word, "bet" being the last word in subregulation (2a) of that regulation, the passage— but the Board may pay to a person any dividend or refund that is payable in respect of a totalisator ticket issued for a bet in cash without the presentation and surrender to the Board of the totalisator ticket if the person making the claim for the dividend or refund—
    - (a) proves to the satisfaction of the Board that the totalisator ticket has been lost or destroyed;
    - (b) proves to the satisfaction of the Board that he is the person entitled to the dividend or refund; and

- (c) makes his claim for the dividend or refund to the Board at its principal office in Perth, or any district office of the Board, or at the collating centre of the Board in Perth, not later than two hours after the scheduled starting time for the horse race in respect of which the totalisator ticket was issued; and
- (b) by adding after subregulation (2a) the following subregulation—
  - (2b) The Board has power to—
    - (a) require a person making a claim under subregulation (2a) of this regulation, to verify the claim in such manner as the Board requires including verification of the claim by statutory declaration;
    - (b) pay the dividend or refund to which the claim relates at such time as the Board determines; and
    - (c) deduct from the amount of any dividend or refund paid under this subregulation the amount of the out-of-pocket expenses actually incurred by the Board, including stamp duty if any, in connection with the establishment and payment of the claim for the dividend or refund.

2. By-law 1 of the principal by-laws is amended—
  - (a) by inserting immediately after the word, "contained", being the last word in the interpretation, "duplex house", the passage, "the building being so designed as to give an external appearance of a single dwelling"; and
  - (b) by adding, after the interpretation, "S.A.A. code or specification", the following interpretation—
 

"set back line" means the line fixed by a by-law of the council of a municipality, under the authority of paragraph (26a) of section 433 of the Act, or by a town planning scheme, made under the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928, as the nearest point to a building line at which buildings, generally, or buildings of a specified class, may be built;
3. By-law 12 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the passage, commencing with the word, "and", in line three of paragraph (e) of sub-by-law (1), and ending with the word, "whatsoever", in the last line of the paragraph, the passage, "and, if particular parts of the building and lands



are intended to be used, as distinct from other parts, and for purposes different from those for which another part is intended to be used, setting forth the purpose or purposes for which each part is to be used".

4. By-law 32 of the principal by-laws is amended—
  - (a) by inserting, immediately after the word, "between", in line three of sub-by-law (1), the passage, "the building line of any site and the set back line, as fixed by the municipality, by by-law, for that particular street or part thereof, or, where a set back line has not been fixed by the municipality, between";
  - (b) by inserting, immediately after the word, "The", in line one of sub-by-law (2), the words, "set back line and the"; and
  - (c) by substituting for the word, "building", in line three of sub-by-law (3), the words, "set back".
5. By-law 34 of the principal by-laws is amended—
  - (a) by deleting the word, "not", in each case, where occurring in line three, and in line four, of paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (1);
  - (b) by substituting for paragraph (d) of sub-by-law (1) the following paragraph—
    - (d) that, together with any buildings appurtenant thereto, is of a total gross area that—
      - (i) in the case of a dwelling of one storey, exceeds a plot ratio of .33 ( $\frac{1}{3}$ );
      - (ii) in the case of a dwelling of two or more storeys, exceeds a plot ratio of .5 ( $\frac{1}{2}$ );
      - (iii) in any case, exceeds a site coverage of  $\frac{1}{3}$ ; or
      - (iv) in any case, exceeds a maximum area prescribed under the provisions of by-law 43 of these by-laws. ; and
  - (c) by inserting, immediately after the word, "dwelling", in line one of paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (3), the passage, "other than a duplex house,".
6. By-law 35 of the principal by-laws is amended—
  - (a) by inserting, immediately after the paragraph designation, "(c)", in paragraph (c) of sub-by-law (1), the passage, "except where adequate mechanical drying apparatus is provided to the satisfaction of the surveyor,";
  - (b) by substituting for the passage, "20 ft. by 20 ft.", in line one of paragraph (c) of sub-by-law (1), the passage, "400 sq. ft.";
  - (c) by substituting for the passage, "shall, by declaration approved by the Minister, declare", in lines one and two of sub-by-law (3), the words, "may by by-laws prescribe"; and
  - (d) by substituting for the words, "shall declare", in line three of sub-by-law (3), the words, "may so prescribe".
7. By-law 39 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the words, "as the case may be", in line two of paragraph (a) of sub-by-law (3), the words, "but not a duplex house".
8. By-law 43 of the principal by-laws is amended by revoking sub-by-law (4) and substituting the following sub-by-law:—
  - (4) **Maximum Heights, Plot Ratios and Site Coverage.**—A municipality may, by by-laws, prescribe maximum heights, plot ratios and site coverages for any part of its district, but so that—
    - (a) in any district designated by the municipality as a single occupancy residential district—
      - (i) the height of buildings does not exceed 30 ft.;
      - (ii) in the case of single occupancy dwellings of one storey, the plot ratio does not exceed .33 ( $\frac{1}{3}$ );
      - (iii) in the case of single occupancy dwellings of two or more storeys or a duplex house, the plot ratio does not exceed .5 ( $\frac{1}{2}$ );

- (iv) in the case of a single occupancy dwelling of two or more storeys, the site coverage of the ground floor does not exceed  $\frac{1}{3}$ ;
- (b) in any district designated by the municipality as a residential flat district, the plot ratio and site coverage does not exceed that set out in Table 35B of these by-laws; and
- (c) in any other district the plot ratio does not exceed five.

9. By-law 46 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for Table 46 the following Table:—

10. By-law 62 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting, immediately after the word, "shall", in line two, the passage, " , except as otherwise provided by these by-laws,".

11. By-law 67 of the principal by-laws is amended by adding, after sub-by-law (5), the following sub-by-law:—

(6) A municipality may permit the construction, in buildings of a Class II Occupancy, of a combined bathroom, laundry and water closet, if—

- (a) the floor area of the combination is not less than 78 sq. ft. and each of its walls, measured horizontally, is not less than 5 ft.; and
- (b) the closet pan is enclosed within a closet having a door, to ensure privacy, and an area of not more than 18 sq. ft. .

12. By-law 74 of the principal by-laws is amended by deleting the passage, "II, III", in line two of sub-by-law (2).

13. By-law 170 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the word, "stumps", appearing in the last line of column two of Table 170C, the word, "stirrups".

14. By-law 222 of the principal by-laws is amended by revoking sub-by-law (2) and substituting the following sub-by-law:—

(2) Each unit of facing, other than tiles of a thickness of less than 1 in., up to a height not exceeding 11 ft., or mosaic tiles under 1 in. square, used on the outer face of reinforced concrete or masonry walls, shall be tied to the structural walling, with substantial, non-corrosive metal wall ties.

15. By-law 245 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the passage, "235 to 240," in lines one and two, the passage, "234 to 240, inclusive,".

16. By-law 322 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for paragraph (b) of sub-by-law (1) the following paragraph—

- (b) to a greater length than 24 ft., between cross walls.

17. By-law 358 of the principal by-laws is amended by deleting the passage, "other than such as is mentioned in sub-by-law (3) of this by-law," in lines one and two of sub-by-law (4).

18. By-law 372 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting, immediately after the word, "shall", in line two of sub-by-law (1), the passage, " , unless an exhaust fan is installed immediately above the stove,".

19. The principal by-laws are amended by adding, after by-law 401, the following by-law:—

**401A. Walls Dividing Duplex Houses.**—The dividing wall separating the two dwellings of a duplex house shall comply with the requirements of by-law 251 of these by-laws; and, if constructed of brick, shall have a thickness of not less than 9 in. and shall be carried to the underside of the roof.

20. By-law 405 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the numerals, "251", in line three, the numerals, "354".

21. By-law 411 of the principal by-laws is amended by adding, after sub-by-law (4), the following sub-by-law:—

- (5) Timber may be used in the construction of shop fronts, but—
- (a) any timber so used shall be hard wood of first quality;
  - (b) brick, stone, masonry, concrete or other impervious material, and not timber, shall be used in any construction within 18 in. above footpath level; and
  - (c) the floor having the shop front shall be separated from other floors, either by a horizontal floor projection of 2 ft. beyond the wall alignment, or by a vertical wall, not less than 3 ft. in height, having a fire resistance rating of not less than two hours.

22. By-law 421 of the principal by-laws is amended by inserting immediately after the word, "not", in line three of sub-by-law (7), the passage, " , without the special approval of the Council,".

23. By-law 425 of the principal by-laws is amended by substituting for the word, "building", in line one of subparagraph (i), and again, in line one of subparagraph (ii), of paragraph (a), the words, "set back", in each case.

24. The Appendix to the principal by-laws is revoked and an Appendix is substituted, as follows:—

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960.

The Municipality of the Shire of Perth.

By-laws Relating to Beaches and Bathing.

L.G. 972/63.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on the 15th day of October, 1963, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-laws:—

The by-laws of the Shire of Perth published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th June, 1960, are hereby amended in the following manner:—

By-laws 276 to 316 inclusive are repealed and the following new by-laws are inserted in their place:—

276. By-laws 277 to 296 inclusive shall apply to—

- (a) all rivers, water courses, tidal and non-tidal waters in or outside but adjoining the District;
- (b) the area which adjoins the District and extends for a distance of two hundred yards seawards from low water mark at ordinary spring tides;<sup>1</sup> and
- (c) all public places and public reserves adjoining the places mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this by-law and which are under the care, control and management of the Shire.

## Definitions.

277. In by-laws 278 to 296 inclusive unless the context otherwise indicates—  
 "Surf Life Saving Club" means a Life Saving Club affiliated with the Western Australian State Centre of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia or any branch thereof and which Club has its mean sphere of activity within the District.

*Bathing Areas.*

## Dangerous Areas.

278. No person shall bathe in an area indicated by a notice or notices erected by the Council and bearing the words "Danger. Bathing Prohibited."

## Restricted Bathing Areas.

279. (1) The Council may from time to time erect, move, replace and remove or cause to be erected, moved, replaced and removed, flags of at least thirty inches square coloured red and yellow, or signs painted red and yellow bearing in black lettering at least three inches high the words "Bathe Between Signs." The said signs shall be of not less than 24 inches in diameter and when erected shall not be less than seven feet nor more than ten feet above ground level.

(2) The said flags and signs may also be erected, moved, replaced and removed from time to time by a Beach Inspector or by an office bearer or a member of a patrol then on duty of a Surf Life Saving Club.

(3) If the said flags or signs have been erected by a member of a Surf Life Saving Club the Club shall so long as the flags or signs remain in position maintain a surf life saving patrol at the area indicated by the flags or signs.

## Dangerous Conditions.

280. (1) If at any time the weather conditions are sufficiently dangerous to warrant the action of the Council, a Beach Inspector or an office bearer or a member of a patrol then on duty of a Surf Life Saving Club may erect a notice of at least three feet by two feet bearing in red lettering at least three inches high the words "Beach Closed. Surf Dangerous."

(2) The said notice may be removed by any of the persons mentioned in the preceding paragraph when the weather conditions justify such action.

(3) No person shall bathe at any place or in the vicinity thereof where the said notice is erected.

#### Shark Alarm.

281. (1) If it is suspected that a shark be in the vicinity of a beach a Beach Inspector or a member of a Surf Life Saving Club may cause a shark alarm to be given and may when the danger is believed not to exist cause the all clear signal to be given.
- (2) The following shall be shark alarm signals:—
- (a) A prolonged ringing of a bell.
  - (b) A long blast of a siren or whistle.
  - (c) The hoisting of a red and white quartered flag.
  - (d) From a surfboat at sea—the waving of a red and white quartered flag or the raising of oars.
- (3) The following shall be "all clear" signals:—
- (a) A series of short rings of a bell.
  - (b) A series of short blasts of a siren or whistle.
  - (c) The removal of the red and white quartered flag.
- (4) No person shall bathe at any place or in the vicinity thereof after a shark alarm has been given and before the all clear signal has been given.

#### Surf Riding.

282. (1) The Council or a Beach Inspector may mark by the erection of notices places where surf riding with surf boards is forbidden and may similarly mark places where surf riding may be practised without restriction or with restriction as to the nature and size of the surf boards.
- (2) No person shall use a surf board in an area marked by notices as one in which the use of surf boards is forbidden.
- (3) Where an area is marked by notices as one in which the use of a surf board of a restricted nature or size only is permitted no person shall use a surf board of a nature or size other than that permitted.

#### Life Saving Equipment.

283. (1) A Beach Inspector or an office bearer or a member of a patrol then on duty of a Surf Life Saving Club may—
- (a) place any life saving equipment, gear, appliance or boat on or near a beach;
  - (b) set aside a roped enclosure not greater than twelve feet square in area for the exclusive use of a life saving patrol.
- (2) A Life Saving Club shall not, except in such manner as may be approved by the Council, construct any tower or permanent structure.
- (3) No unauthorised person shall touch, use or interfere with any life saving equipment, wear, appliance or boat or tower, or enter an area set aside for the exclusive use of a life saving patrol.

#### Rescues and Patrols.

284. (1) No unauthorised person shall hinder any person carrying out a rescue or a beach patrol.
- (2) All persons not engaged in rescue operations shall keep clear of any person engaged in rescue operations in order to give such person ample space to carry out the rescue.
- (3) Each member of a life saving patrol shall whilst on duty wear a red and yellow quartered swimming cap.

#### Surf Life Saving Competitions and Carnivals.

285. (1) The Council may from time to time and for such period and upon such conditions as may be determined by the Council authorise a Surf Life Saving Club to—
- (a) set apart an area for a competition or carnival;
  - (b) enclose the area or part thereof so set apart;
  - (c) divide the area so set apart into areas to which the public may be admitted and areas reserved for use by competitors and officials;
  - (d) designate the said areas by means of notices;
  - (e) prescribe the terms and conditions of entry to the said areas and define the terms and conditions of entry by notices erected at such entrance.

(2) No person shall—

- (a) enter upon or remain within an area set apart as aforesaid except upon compliance with the conditions indicated by the said notices;
- (b) unless duly authorised interfere with or interrupt the competition or carnival.

#### Launching, Beaching and Leaving Boats.

286. (1) The Council may set aside areas for the launching and beaching of boats and may indicate those areas by means of notices.

(2) The Council may erect notices prohibiting the launching and beaching of boats (other than boats owned by a Surf Life Saving Club) in any particular area or other than at an area set aside for that purpose.

(3) The Council may set aside areas where boats may be left and may indicate those areas by notices.

(4) The Council may erect notices prohibiting the leaving of boats (other than boats owned by a Surf Life Saving Club) in any particular area or other than at an area set aside for that purpose.

(5) No person shall launch or beach or leave a boat (other than a boat owned by a Surf Life Saving Club) in any area where the launching, beaching or leaving of a boat is prohibited by notice erected by the Council as aforesaid.

(6) A person using a vehicle to tow, launch or beach a boat shall use the road or area if any set aside for that purpose, and after launching or beaching the boat shall remove the vehicle and trailer if any to a place where it may be lawfully parked or stored.

#### Boats in the Vicinity of Bathers.

287. No person shall, unless carrying out rescue operations, propel or cause to be propelled any boat (other than a boat owned by a Surf Life Saving Club) in the sea among bathers or within 50 yards of any person bathing or in any manner in which the boat, its wash or anything towed by it, shall cause inconvenience, danger or injury to a person bathing.

#### Water Skis.

288. No person shall ride a water ski among bathers or within 50 yards of any person bathing or in any manner which shall cause inconvenience, danger or injury to a person bathing.

#### Fishing and Spear Fishing.

289. (1) The Council or a Beach Inspector may mark by the erection of notices—

- (a) places where fishing is forbidden;
- (b) places where fishing is forbidden except during certain hours;
- (c) places where fishing with spear guns is forbidden.

(2) No person shall fish at any place contrary to the terms of a notice erected as aforesaid.

(3) No person shall—

- (a) clean fish or cut bait on any seat or handrail;
- (b) leave or deposit fish offal on any beach or in the sea within 200 yards of any portion of a beach where the public customarily bathe;
- (c) fish by the use of set or buoyed lines or use blood or any other bait or lure which might attract sharks;
- (d) load or discharge any spear gun except under water;
- (e) load or discharge any spear gun within fifty yards of any person bathing.

#### Costumes.

290. (1) All persons over four years of age when exposed to the public view shall be suitably clad so as to secure the observance of decency.

(2) In any case where any person's bathing costume is indecent, inadequate or the material thereof is too thin or is not in a proper state of repair or is for any reason unsuitable, a Beach Inspector may direct such person to resume at once his ordinary dress.

(3) If any person fails to resume immediately his ordinary dress when directed so to do by a Beach Inspector he shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and may with any necessary force be removed to a dressing enclosure or shed by the Beach Inspector; provided that this power of removal shall not be exercised by a Beach Inspector appointed under by-law 296 (2).

#### Dressing in Public View.

291. A person shall not dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view; provided that this shall not prevent any person already clad in proper bathing costume from doffing or donning any dressing-gown or outer robe.

#### Use of Dressing Enclosure or Sheds.

292. (1) A dressing enclosure or shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. A person shall not play games or without reasonable excuse loiter in or in the vicinity of any such enclosure or shed.

(2) A person shall not bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in any such enclosure or shed.

(3) A male over the age of four years shall not enter any dressing enclosure or shed set aside for females.

(4) A female shall not enter any dressing enclosure or shed set aside for males.

(5) The Council may charge or authorise a lessee or licensee to charge for the use of dressing accommodation and requisites or for the safe custody of valuables or for entry to and use of a dressing enclosure or shed such fee as shall from time to time be fixed by the Council.

(6) Every person shall before entering or attempting to enter any bathing or dressing accommodation enclosure or shed for the use of which fees have been fixed pay the fees fixed by the Council.

(7) Persons dressed in bathing costumes who have paid the appropriate fees, and whose ordinary clothes are within a dressing enclosure or shed, shall enter such enclosure or shed by an entrance marked as "Entrance for persons in bathing costume," or marked to the like effect.

(8) Persons wearing their ordinary clothes, persons whose ordinary clothes are not within the dressing enclosure or shed and persons who have not already paid the appropriate entrance fees, shall not enter such enclosure or shed except by way of an entrance marked "Main Entrance," or marked to the like effect.

(9) A person suffering, or appearing to the lessee, licensee, Beach Inspector or person in charge of a dressing enclosure or shed to be suffering from any infectious, contagious or offensive disease or skin complaint, shall not visit or use any dressing enclosure or shed.

#### Animals.

293. (1) A Beach Inspector may, when in his opinion inconvenience may be caused to the public by the bathing of animals, order any person in charge of any animal not to send or drive such animal into the water, or permit such animal to enter the water, at any place where the public are bathing.

(2) A Beach Inspector may order any person in charge of any animal to remove such animal from a beach if such animal's presence on the beach causes inconvenience or danger to the public.

#### Conduct Generally.

294. No person shall—

- (a) sell any commodity, food or drink on a beach or let or hire any commodity, tent, umbrella, surf board or other facility or device without a license from the Council or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of the license;
- (b) create or commit any nuisance or behave in a disorderly or offensive manner or use indecent or improper language;
- (c) enter, pry or look into or loiter outside any lavatory, dressing shed or other building or portion of a building expressly reserved for the use of the opposite sex;



- (d) unless he be a member of a Life Saving Club acting in the course of his duty, climb on or over any building or structure;
- (e) alter, mutilate, deface or damage any building or structure or expectorate or throw lighted matches thereon;
- (f) break or permit to be broken any glass, metal, bottle or utensil or deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china or litter of any kind except in receptacles provided for that purpose;
- (g) injure, cut, break, pull up, pick, remove or destroy any tree, shrub, flower, grass or plant of any kind or description, or, without the consent of the Council, plant any such tree, shrub or plant or sow any seed thereof;
- (h) drive any mechanically propelled vehicle except upon a roadway, turning place or parking place constructed for such purpose;
- (i) play games in such a way as to cause inconvenience and annoyance to persons bathing or using the beach;
- (j) interfere with, move or damage any flag or notice unless authorised to do so;
- (k) place any clothing, towel or any other object, matter or thing on any notice, life saving gear or appliance;
- (l) unless he is an inspector appointed by the Council pursuant to these by-laws, wear a badge bearing the words "Beach Inspector";
- (m) unless he is a member of a life saving patrol on duty, wear a red and yellow quartered swimming cap in or upon any bathing area;
- (n) throw any missile to the injury, danger or annoyance of any other person;

295. No person shall without the consent of the Council—

- (a) bet or offer to bet publicly or conduct or take part in any gambling game or contest;
- (b) engage in any public speaking or conduct any meeting or entertainment;
- (c) operate any broadcasting or public address system or apparatus other than those employed or used by a Life Saving Club in the performance of its functions as such;
- (d) advertise by any means anything whatsoever or display or distribute any notice, pamphlet or document;
- (e) solicit, purchase or offer to purchase bottles;
- (f) operate any radio, record player or radiogram at such volume as to cause annoyance to other users of the defined area;
- (g) cut, collect or remove any timber, firewood, stone, sand or other material except seaweed.

#### Beach Inspectors.

296. (1) The Council may appoint any servant of the Council a Beach Inspector.

(2) The Council may appoint any active member of a volunteer life saving club a Beach Inspector under these by-laws; provided that a member so appointed shall not prosecute any person for a breach of any provision of these by-laws, but shall report all breaches to the Council.

(3) Every Constable or Officer of Police shall have the powers of Beach Inspector under these by-laws.

(4) A Beach Inspector may demand the name and address of a person suspected of being guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these by-laws, and such person shall comply with such demand.

(5) A person shall not obstruct or hinder any Beach Inspector or life saving attendant in the performance of his duties, or in the exercise of his powers.

(6) The Council shall supply each Beach Inspector with a written appointment under the seal of the Council, and with a badge in the shape of a shield bearing the words "Beach Inspector." Every Beach Inspector when on duty shall wear such badge on the front of his dress or bathing costume, or, if not wearing the badge, shall produce his written appointment, if demanded of him when exercising authority under these by-laws.

abuts.

3. The Mundaring Shire Council is the authority responsible for  
carrying this by-law into effect in accordance with the provision of  
the Local Government Act, 1960, and enforcing the observance thereof.

Penalty for breach of the by-law:—

- (1) A maximum penalty of £50.
- (2) A maximum daily penalty of £5 per day.
- (3) A minimum penalty not exceeding one tenth of the maximum  
penalty and maximum daily penalty.
- (4) The minimum penalty and minimum daily penalty increasing in  
severity by one-tenth of the maximum for each successive breach  
of the same by-law by the same offender.

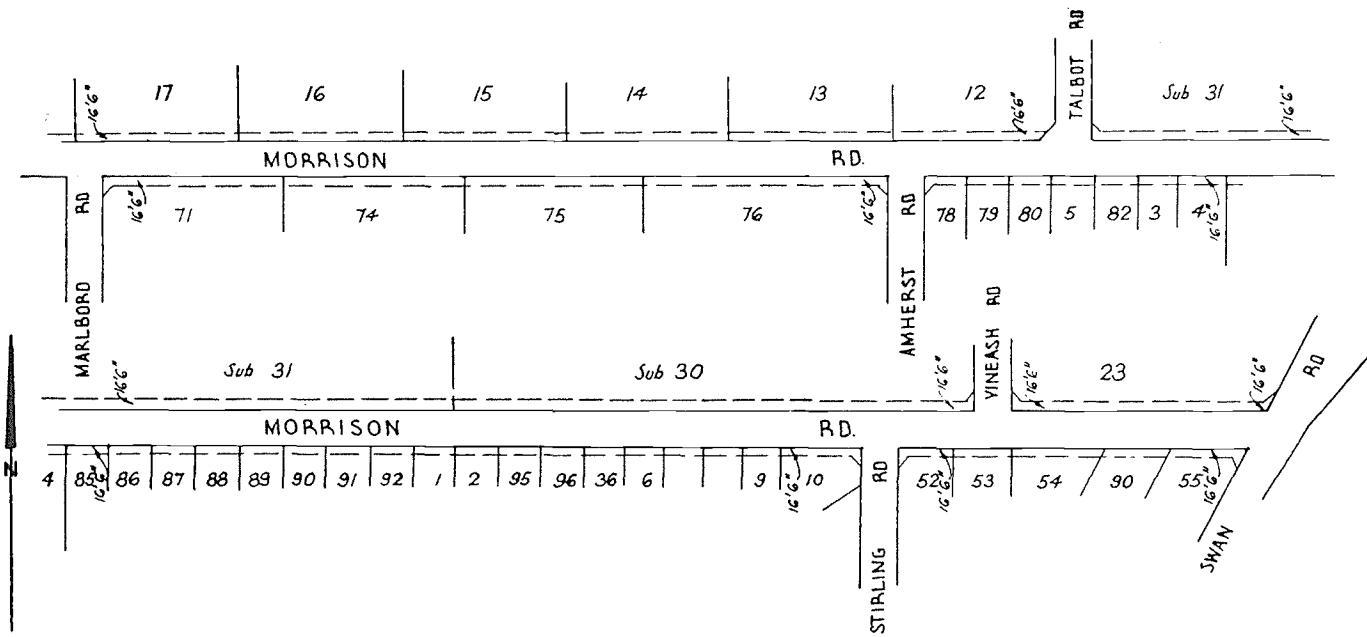

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1960.

Municipality of the City of Nedlands.  
By-law No. 18—Standing Orders.

L.G. 617/59.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved, on the 8th day of August, 1963, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following by-law:—

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to this by-law, the clauses of which shall be referred to as "the Standing Orders." By-law No. 8 (City of Nedlands), *Government Gazette* (No. 5) of 28th January, 1960, is hereby revoked.

Interpretation.

2. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires—  
"Act" means the Local Government Act, 1960;  
"clause" means a clause of this by-law.

Mayor to Preside.

3. The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and, if in his absence, after being present, he retires, the Deputy Mayor shall preside, but if he is not present, or if being present, retires, then one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors then present shall preside.

Quorum.

4. (1) At any meeting of the Council, a quorum shall consist of such number as conforms to the provisions of section 173 of the Act.

(2) Subject to clause 5, every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within half an hour after the time appointed for that meeting, the Mayor, or in his absence the majority of the Councillors present, or any one Councillor, if only one be present, or the Clerk if no Councillor be present, may adjourn the meeting to any date not later than seven days from the date of adjournment.

6. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of that period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future date.

7. At any meeting at which there is not a quorum of members present, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the members then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

Open Doors—Except as Provided.

8. (1) The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council may, by resolution, otherwise decide.

(2) Upon the carrying of such resolution as is mentioned in (1) of this clause, the Mayor shall direct all persons other than Councillors and staff of the Council to leave the Council Chambers, and every person shall forthwith comply with such resolution, provided that, by decision of the Council, persons other than Councillors may be requested to remain.

(3) Any person failing to comply with a direction made pursuant to subclause (2) of this clause may, by order of the Mayor, be removed from the Council Chambers.

(4) After the carrying of a resolution made under subclause (1) of this clause, the business at that meeting of the Council shall proceed behind closed doors, until the Council, by resolution, decides to proceed with open doors.

(5) While a resolution made under subclause (1) of this clause is in force, the operation of clause 31 shall be suspended unless the Council, by resolution, otherwise decides.

(6) Any resolution mentioned in this clause may be moved without notice.

Distinguished Visitors.

9. If a distinguished visitor is present at a meeting of the Council, the Mayor may invite him to sit beside the Mayor, or at the Council table.

Reporters.

10. Accredited newspaper reporters shall be permitted to attend meetings, in such part of the Council Chambers as may be appropriated for their accommodation, but they shall withdraw during any period when the Council is sitting behind closed doors.

Prevention of Disturbance.

11. (1) A person, not being a Councillor, shall not, at any meeting of the Council, interrupt the proceedings of the Council.

(2) Any person interrupting the proceedings of the Council shall, when so directed by the Mayor, forthwith leave the Council Chambers.

(3) Any person who, being ordered to leave the Council Chambers, fails to do so may, by order of the Mayor, be removed from the Council Chambers.



Kinds of Meetings.

12. Meetings of the Council shall be of two kinds, "Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are those called at such place and at such times as Council, from time to time, appoints for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Council. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper concerning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

Calling of Meetings.

13. (1) The Mayor may convene a meeting of the Council as often as he thinks fit, by notice in writing sent by him by the Clerk and sent to each Councillor before the meeting.

(2) If the Mayor refuses or neglects to call a meeting of the Council after receiving a request for that purpose signed by at least three Councillors, those Councillors may call a meeting of the Council by serving a notice in writing, signed by them, stating the business to be transacted to each of the other members of the Council at least twenty-four hours before the time of the commencement of the meeting.

*Business at Council Meetings.*

Order of Business at Ordinary Meeting.

14. The order of business at any ordinary meeting of the Council shall, unless for the greater convenience of the Council altered by resolution to that effect, be as nearly as practicable as follows, that is to say:—

- (i) Apologies and leave of absence.
- (ii) Confirmation of minutes.
- (iii) Announcements by the Mayor and Councillors—without discussion.
- (iv) Questions of which due notice has been given—without discussion.
- (v) Correspondence—not involving business.
- (vi) Petitions and memorials.
- (vii) Reports of committees.
- (viii) Orders of the day, being any business the Mayor may think desirable to bring under the notice of the Council and may have directed to be entered as an order of the day.
- (ix) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x) Notice of motions for consideration at the following meeting, if given during the meeting.

Order of Business at Special Meeting.

15. The order of business at any special meeting of the Council shall be the order in which that business stands in the notice of the meeting.

Confirmation of Minutes.

16. (1) The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether of an ordinary or special meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at a meeting of the Council in order to proceed to their confirmation, and discussion, other than discussion to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, shall not be permitted, and when confirmed, the minutes shall thereupon be signed by the Mayor and he shall sign and date each page.

(2) Pasting or otherwise permanently affixing the minutes leaves of a book, shall be a sufficient recording of the minutes in the book, and the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting may be dispensed with when members have been supplied with copies of them at least three days before the holding of that next ordinary meeting.

Questions.

17. Any Councillor desiring to ask a question at any meeting of the Council shall give notice thereof in writing to the Clerk at least eight hours before the hour fixed for the commencement of the meeting. Every question and answer shall be submitted as briefly and concisely as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

Reception of Correspondence.

18. Discussion shall not be permitted on any motion that any correspondence be received or not received, or that any correspondence or any part thereof be deferred to any Occasional Committee of the Council.

Notices of Motion.

19. (1) A Councillor may bring forward at a meeting such business as he considers advisable, in the form of a motion, of which notice has been given in writing to the Clerk, either at the last previous meeting or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days, inclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays, before the meeting at which it is brought forward.

(2) Every notice of motion shall relate to some question affecting the constitution, administration, or condition of the municipality or the Council.

(3) The Mayor shall rule out of order any motion which does not comply with subclause (2) of this clause.

20. Every such motion as is mentioned in clause 19 shall lapse, unless—

(a) the Councillor who gave notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, is present to move the motion when called on; or

(b) the Council on a motion agrees to defer consideration of the motion to a later stage or date.

Deputations.

21. (1) Any person or persons wishing to be received as a deputation by the Council shall, in the first instance, send to the Clerk a petition or memorial, setting out in concise terms the subject matter to be raised by the deputation.

(2) Where the Clerk receives a petition or memorial in terms of this clause, he shall lay it—

(a) before the Committee concerned; or

(b) where there is no Committee concerned, before the Mayor.

(3) A Committee or the Mayor receiving a petition or memorial in terms of this clause may either receive the deputation or lay the petition or memorial before the Council.

(4) Where a petition or memorial is laid before the Council under subclause (3) of this clause, the Council may, if it so resolves, receive the deputation.

22. A deputation shall not exceed five in number and only two members thereof shall be at liberty to address the Council or a Committee of the Council, except in reply to questions from members of the Council or Committee and the matter shall not be further considered by the Council or the Committee until the deputation has withdrawn.

*Conduct of Debate.*

Councillors to Address Mayor.

23. Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor.

Point of Order.

24. (1) A Councillor who is addressing the Mayor shall not be interrupted, except upon a point of order, in which event he shall discontinue and resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, whereupon the Councillor so interrupted may, if permitted, proceed.

(2) A Councillor raising a point of order must rise to do so.

(3) A Councillor rising to express a difference of opinion with, or to contradict a speaker shall not be recognised as raising a point of order.

(4) A violation of any provision of these Standing Orders is a breach of order.

Substance of Motion to be Stated.

25. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state its substance before he addresses the Council thereon and, if so required by the Mayor, shall put the motion or amendment in writing.

#### Unopposed Business.

26. (1) Upon motion being moved, the Mayor may ask the meeting if any member opposed it. If no one signifies his opposition to the motion or his opposition to the motion being treated as unopposed business, the Mayor may declare the motion carried without debate and without taking a vote thereon. Any motion declared under this by-law shall for all purposes be deemed a resolution of the Council.

(2) If any member signifies his opposition to a motion or to a motion being treated as unopposed business, the motion shall be dealt with according to the following by-laws.

#### Motions and Amendments to be Seconded.

27. (1) Except as provided by By-law 26, no motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

(2) A nomination to the position of Mayor or Deputy Mayor is not required to be seconded.

#### Titles to be Used.

28. A speaker, in referring to any other present, shall designate him by the title of Mayor or Councillor or particular officer, as the case may be.

#### Priority of Speaking.

29. Where two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor shall decide whom of them is entitled to priority.

#### Mayor to be Heard.

30. Whenever the Mayor rises during a debate, any Councillor then speaking or offering to speak shall sit down and the Council shall be silent so that the Mayor may be heard without interruption.

#### Speaking Twice.

31. Except where this clause is suspended under Clause 32, a Member shall not speak twice on the same question except—

- (a) in reply, upon an original motion of which he was the mover;
- (b) in reply, upon an amendment last debated of which he was the mover; or
- (c) by way of personal explanation.

32. The Council may, by resolution moved without notice, suspend the operation of Clause 31 hereof and thereupon such clause shall be suspended until such time as the Council shall, by similar resolution, otherwise decide.

#### Personal Explanation.

33. A Councillor making a personal explanation shall confine it to a succinct explanation of a material part of his former speech which may have been misunderstood, and to the explanation itself, and shall not advert to matters not strictly necessary for that purpose nor seek to strengthen his former argument by new matter or by replying to other Councillors.

34. The Mayor shall forthwith call to order any Councillor committing a breach of Clause 31.

#### No Speaking After Motion Put.

35. No Councillor shall speak on any motion or amendment—

- (a) after the mover has replied; or
- (b) after the question has been put.

#### Mover and Seconder Have Spoken.

36. A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment is deemed to have spoken thereon.

#### Time Limit of Speeches.

37. A Councillor shall not speak upon any motion or amendment or in reply for a longer period than ten minutes without the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate. An extension shall not be permitted under this clause beyond a total of twenty minutes.

Speaking in Reply.

38. A Councillor speaking in reply shall not introduce any new matter but shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers.

Division of Motions.

39. The Mayor may order a motion to be divided and put in the form of two or more motions.

Withdrawal of Motions.

40. A motion or amendment may be withdrawn by the mover, with the consent of the Council, which shall be signified without debate. It shall not be competent for any speaker to speak upon the motion or amendment after consent to withdrawal.

Production of Documents.

41. (1) Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Council relating to the question or matter under discussion.

(2) On giving to the Clerk not less than eight hours' notice, a member of the Council shall be entitled to have laid on the Council table, for the duration of a meeting, any document or record of the Council, and the Clerk, on receiving that notice, shall lay the document on the Council table at the commencement of the meeting.

No Digression.

42. A Councillor shall not speak otherwise than upon, or digress from, the question then before the Council, except to make a personal explanation.

No Adverse Reflection on Council.

43. A Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon a resolution of the Council, except on a motion that the resolution be rescinded.

No Adverse Reflection on Councillor.

44. A Councillor shall not reflect adversely upon the character or actions of another member nor impute any motive to a member, unless the Council resolves, without debate, that the question then before the Council cannot otherwise be adequately considered.

Record of Words Used.

45. Any member may require the Clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon their being used.

Withdrawal of Offensive Expression.

46. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which, in the opinion of the Mayor, reflects offensively on any member or officer of the Council shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw any expression and make a satisfactory apology to the chair. If he decline or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such Councillor upon the matter then under discussion and may call upon the next speaker.

Disturbance by Councillors.

47. A Councillor shall not make any noise or disturbance or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud while any other person is addressing the Council.

Continued Irrelevance, Etc.

48. The Mayor may call the attention of the Council to continued irrelevance, tedious repetition, unbecoming language, or any breach of order or decorum on the part of a Councillor and may direct that Councillor, if speaking, to discontinue his speech, and thereupon the Councillor shall cease speaking and shall resume his seat.

Crossing Council Chamber.

49. When the Mayor is putting any question, a Councillor shall not walk out of or across the Chamber, and shall not, while any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the chair.

Mayor May Call to Order.

50. The Mayor shall preserve order and may call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there is cause for so doing.

Infraction of Standing Orders.

51. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor, or to draw the attention of the Mayor to any matter of which the latter may take notice under Clause 48.

Rulings by Mayor.

52. The Mayor, when deciding a point or order or practice, shall give his decision, and argument or comment shall not be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final, in that particular case, unless a majority of the Councillors then present shall, upon motion made forthwith, without discussion, dissent therefrom.

53. Whenever the Mayor has decided that any motion, amendment or other matter before the Council is out of order, it shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in the Council by any Councillor is similarly decided to be out of order, that Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction or apology, as the case may require.

Continued Breach of Order.

54. Where a Councillor persists in any conduct which the Mayor decides is out of order, or refuses to make any explanation, retraction or apology required by the Mayor under Clause 53, the Mayor may direct that Councillor to refrain from taking any further part in the then meeting of the Council, other than by recording his vote; and the Councillor shall comply with such directions.

Serious Disorder.

55. (1) If, at a meeting of the Council, the Mayor is of opinion that by reason of disorder or otherwise the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, whereafter the Council shall re-assemble and decide whether business is to be proceeded with, and that question shall be decided forthwith and without debate.

(2) Where, after any proceeding under subclause (1) of this clause, the Mayor is again of opinion that the business of the Council cannot effectually be continued, he may close or adjourn the meeting.

All Councillors to Vote.

56. (1) At every meeting of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, every Councillor present shall vote, and if any Councillor who is entitled to vote fails to vote, the Mayor shall call upon him to vote.

(2) Where there is any equal division of votes upon any question, the Mayor has and may exercise a casting vote.

Order of Debate.

Permissible Motions During Debate.

57. (1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause, when a motion is under debate, no further motion shall be moved except a motion—

- (a) that the motion be amended;
- (b) that the Council do adjourn;
- (c) that the debate be adjourned;
- (d) that the question be now put;
- (e) that the Council do proceed with the next business;
- (f) that the Council do sit behind closed doors; or
- (g) that the meeting be now closed.

(2) Where the question before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee of the Council, a Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move without notice that the question be referred back to the Committee; and on any such motion, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak, other than formally

to second, and the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or in his absence a member thereof, may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

A—"That Motion be Amended."

Amendment to Relate to Motion.

58. Every amendment shall be relevant to the motion on which it is moved. Every amendment shall be read before being moved.

One Amendment at a Time.

59. (1) Only one amendment shall be discussed at a time, but as often as an amendment is lost, another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, except that where an amendment is carried, one further amendment to the original motion, as amended, and no more, may be moved.

(2) In speaking to an amendment, A Councillor may give notice of his intention to move a further amendment.

60. Where an amendment is carried, the original motion as amended shall, for all purposes of subsequent debate and subject only to clause 59, be treated as an original motion.

B—"That Council Adjourn."

61. (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move without notice that the Council do now adjourn and that motion shall state the time and date to which the adjournment is to be made.

(2) On a motion to adjourn, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and the mover of the motion (if any) which was then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes, but no other debate shall be allowed.

62. Where a motion for the adjournment of the Council is negatived, no similar motion shall be moved until after the question then under discussion or the next on the notice paper or any other which may be allowed precedence shall have been disposed of.

63. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council shall not move the adjournment of the Council.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the Council.

64. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall be continued immediately upon the Council resuming after the adjournment.

65. On a motion for the adjournment of the Council being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration at the time of adjournment and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject; but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

66. The Mayor may at any time adjourn the Council to such time and date as the motion specifies, or, where no time and date is specified, to such time and date as he shall then declare.

C—"That Debate be Adjourned."

67. (1) A Councillor may at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move, without notice, that the debate be adjourned to a later hour of the same meeting or to a subsequent meeting of the Council.

(2) On a motion that the debate be adjourned, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second, and no other debate shall be allowed; but if the question then before the Council is a recommendation from a Committee, the Chairman of the Committee concerned, or, in his absence, a member thereof may speak for not more than five minutes.

68. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then under debate shall not move the adjournment of the debate.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same sitting of the Council, move or second more than one motion for the adjournment of the same debate.

69. On resuming an adjourned debate, the Councillor who moved its adjournment shall be entitled to speak first.

70. On a motion for the adjournment of a debate being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under debate and they shall not be permitted to speak on any resumption of the debate on that subject, but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

71. Where the debate on any motion, moved and seconded, is interrupted by the Council being counted out, that debate may, on motion with notice, be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted.

D—"That Question be Put."

72. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor move, without notice and without comment, that the question under consideration be now put, and upon that motion being formally seconded, the same shall immediately be put without debate.

73. A motion that the question under consideration be put shall not be moved by a Councillor who has already spoken on the question, and that motion shall not be carried without the consent of a two-thirds majority of the Councillors then present.

74. Where it is decided by the Council that the question under consideration be put, the mover of the question under consideration shall, if debate has ensued and if otherwise entitled to do so, be permitted to speak in reply for not more than five minutes before the question is put, but subject thereto, the question shall at once be put.

75. Whenever it is decided by the Council that the question be put, the question to be so put includes the main question as well as any amendment thereto.

E—"That Council Proceed with Next Business."

76. A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor, move, without notice and without comment, that the Council do proceed with the next business and, upon that motion being formally seconded, it shall be immediately put without debate.

77. Where the Council decides to proceed with the next business, the question which was then under discussion shall be considered as dropped.

78. During the same debate on any question, a motion that the Council do proceed with the next business shall not be moved within one hour after a similar motion has been negatived.

F—"That Meeting be Closed."

79. (1) A Councillor may, at the conclusion of the speech of any other Councillor or on the conclusion of any business, move, without notice, that the meeting of the Council be now closed.

(2) On a motion that the Council be closed, the mover may speak for not more than five minutes, the seconder shall not speak other than formally to second and the mover of the motion (if any) then under debate may speak for not more than five minutes; but no other debate shall be allowed.

80. If a motion that the meeting of the Council be closed is negatived, a similar motion shall not be moved until after the question then under discussion or the next on the motion paper or any other which may be allowed precedence has been disposed of.

81. (1) A Councillor who has spoken on the question then before the Council, shall not move that the meeting be closed.

(2) A Councillor shall not, at the same meeting of the Council, move or second more than one motion that the meeting be closed.

82. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, the debate on the question (if any) under debate when that motion was moved shall stand adjourned to its place on the notice paper for the next meeting of the Council.

83. On a motion that the meeting be closed being carried, a record shall be taken of all those who have spoken on the subject under consideration up to the closing of the meeting and they shall not be permitted to speak on any subsequent consideration of the same subject; but this clause does not deprive a mover of the right of reply.

#### Confidential Business.

84. Every matter dealt with by, or brought before the Council sitting otherwise than with open doors, or any Committee of the Council, shall be treated as strictly confidential, and shall not, without the authority of the Council or of the Committee (as the case may be) be disclosed to any person other than the Mayor, Councillors or Employees of the Council (and in the case of employees, only so far as may be necessary for the performance of their duties) prior to the discussion of that matter at a meeting of the Council held with open doors.

#### Motions Affecting Expenditure.

85. Where a motion or amendment would have the effect of incurring expenditure not provided for in the Budget, that motion or amendment shall not be implemented without submission to the Finance Committee for approval of the necessary finance.

#### Rescission of Resolution.

86. (1) A Council may, at the same meeting at which it is passed, rescind or alter a resolution if all the members of the Council who are present in their seats at the time the resolution was passed are also present in their seats at the time the rescission or alteration is proposed.

(2) A Council may, at a meeting after that at which it was passed, rescind or alter a resolution—

(a) where notice of the motion to rescind or alter is not given, if a motion to that effect is carried by an absolute majority of the members of the Council; or

(b) where the member intending to propose the rescission or alteration has, through the Clerk, given written notice of his intention to each of the other members of the Council at least seven days before the meeting, if a motion to that effect is carried by a majority of the members voting on the proposal at the meeting;

but not otherwise.

#### Negated Motions.

87. A motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negated by the Council shall not again be entertained within a period of three months, except with the consent of an absolute majority of the Council.

#### Suspension of Standing Orders.

88. In cases of urgent necessity, any Standing Order of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded, but that motion shall not be declared carried, unless an absolute majority of the Council, or a two-thirds majority of those present and voting on the question, whichever is the lesser number, have voted in favour of the motion. Any Councillor moving the suspension of a Standing Order shall state the object of the motion, but discussion shall not otherwise take place thereon.

#### Method of Taking Votes.

89. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question, first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion as to whether the affirmative or the negative has the majority on the voices or by a show of hands.



The result of voting openly is determined on the voices, unless a member of the Council calls for a show of hands, in which case, the result is determined on the count of raised hands, and, upon a vote on the voices or on a show of hands being taken, a Councillor may call for a division.

The division shall thereupon be taken by those voting in the affirmative passing to the right of the chair and those voting the negative to the left of the chair.

Upon the division being called for, the Mayor may, if he thinks fit, order that the division bell be rung, and after the lapse of one-half of a minute from the bell ceasing to ring, a Councillor shall not be permitted to enter or leave the Chamber, until after the division has been taken. The names of the Councillors who voted on the question on which there is the division, shall be recorded by the Clerk in respect of every division, together with details of whether they voted in the affirmative or negative, together with the names of those Councillors who abstained from voting.

#### *Committees.*

##### *Standing Committees.*

90. (1) In addition to such Occasional Committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be Standing Committees of the Council, namely: (i) Finance, (ii) Works, Health and Buildings, (iii) General Purposes, (iv) Town Planning.

(2) Each Standing Committee shall comprise the Mayor and four Councillors, being one Councillor from each ward.

(3) Subject to subclause (4) of this clause, the members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed for each year, at the first meeting of the Council held after the annual election, and shall hold office until the commencement of the first meeting after the annual election then next ensuing.

(4) The members of the Standing Committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and, in the event of an equality of votes for two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

(5) The Council may, by resolution carried pursuant of a motion of order by a simple majority, or on a motion moved without notice by an absolute majority, change the membership of any Committee or appoint substitutes for Councillors absent pursuant to leave granted by the Council.

##### *Powers and Duties of Committees.*

91. Subject to any resolution of the Council passed after the coming into operation of the Standing Orders, the duties of Standing Committees shall be consideration of and recommendations concerning the following:—

- (i) Finance Committee.—(a) The finances of the Council; (b) items of expenditure recommended by any Committee; (c) the Budget; (d) the Council's staff.
- (ii) Works, Health and Buildings Committee.—(a) Construction and maintenance of streets, ways, drains, bridges and other public places; (b) sweeping and watering of streets; (c) fencing vacant land; (d) construction of street shelters and street signs; (e) construction of crossings over footpaths and any constructional matters in connection with streets; (f) siting of Council depot buildings and structures or buildings on building sites; (g) matters affecting or relating to the health of the citizens; (h) immunisation, location and construction of clinics; (i) house inspections; (j) licensing of eating houses, sale of food and drugs, and food sampling; (k) nightsoil and rubbish services; (l) noxious trades, morgues, etc.; (m) hawkers, dogs and goats impounding, etc.; (n) inspection of places of public amusement; (o) provision of electricity services, equipment and fittings for the lighting of streets, ways, reserves and public places, and matters relating thereto; (p) purchase, sale, replacement, control and maintenance of all Council vehicles, plant and machinery; (q) purchase of all necessary supplies for the foregoing; (r) siting of building and control of building operations; (s) verandahs, signs, hoardings and similar matters; (t) fire control; (u) kerbside parking; (v) storage of inflammable materials.

- (iii) General Purposes Committee.—(a) Parks, reserves and playgrounds; (b) enclosed recreational areas, including ovals; (c) street trees and road verges; (d) town halls and all buildings the property of the Council; (e) swimming pools, including the management and control thereof; (f) acquisition of land for recreational areas; (g) civic functions; (h) parking facilities other than kerbside; (i) matters relating to the control and management of libraries; (j) all other matters not elsewhere included.
- (iv) Town Planning Committee.—(a) All matters, including resumption of land, relating to zoning and town planning; (b) location of metropolitan regional roads.

#### Occasional Committees.

92. (1) The Council may appoint Occasional Committees to perform any duty which may be lawfully entrusted by it to a committee.
- (2) An Occasional Committee may comprise any number of members not exceeding the largest minority of the total number of members.
- (3) A Standing Committee shall not interfere in any matter which has for the time being been entrusted to an Occasional Committee.
- (4) An Occasional Committee shall not be appointed except on a motion setting out—
- (a) the duties proposed to be entrusted to such Committee; and
  - (b) either—
    - (1) the names of the Councillors of whom, with the Mayor, it is intended to constitute the Committee; or
    - (2) the number of Councillors intended to constitute the Committee and a provision that they be elected by a separate motion.
- (5) Where the members of an Occasional Committee are elected by a motion, then, in the event of an equality of votes, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

#### Calling Committee Meetings.

93. The Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the Mayor or the Chairman or any two members of that committee.

#### Chairman.

94. The Mayor is *ex officio* a member and Chairman of every committee. The Mayor may, but is not obliged to, preside as Chairman of the meetings of a committee, and, if in accordance with the Act, he intimates his intention is not to do so, or does not intimate his intention at all, the members of the committee may elect one of their number to preside in his stead. The Mayor may so intimate his intention by declaring it at the first meeting of the committee held after the declaration of the annual election of members of the Council, or by giving to each of the members of the committee at, or before, that meeting written notice of his intention not to preside, and if at, or before, that meeting he does not so give notice, he is regarded as having intimated that his intention is not to preside. If the Mayor intimates, or is regarded as having intimated that his intention is not to preside, he shall not, unless under the Act, he is authorised to do so, preside until the corresponding first meeting of the committee in the following year.

#### Standing Orders.

95. Except in so far as they limit the number of times a member may speak or require meetings to be conducted with open doors, these Standing Orders shall be observed at meetings of committees; but the Chairman of a committee may have and exercise both a deliberative and, in the case of equality of votes, a casting vote.

#### Quorum of Committees.

96. (1) At any meeting of the committee, a quorum shall consist of not less than two members of that committee.
- (2) Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as a quorum is constituted.

*Minutes of Committees.*

97. Each committee shall cause to be kept a minute book, in which shall be entered minutes of all its proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the next meeting of the committee and shall be signed by the Chairman thereof.

*Committees to Report.*

98. Committees so appointed are answerable to the Council and shall, as and when required by the Council to do so, report fully on their activities to the Council.

*Officers.**Complaints.*

99. All complaints, whether by a member of the Council or by any other person, concerning the ability, character or integrity of any officer or employee of the Council or of any act or omission of such officer or employee, shall be made in writing to the Mayor, signed by the person or persons complaining. The Mayor shall direct the complaint to the appropriate Standing Committee for investigation and report to the Council. The officer or employee concerned shall be permitted to reply to the complaint either personally or in writing to the Committee, and, with the consent of the Council, to the Council itself.

*General.**Representation on Public Bodies.*

100. Whenever it becomes necessary to appoint a Councillor to represent the Council on a public body or a State instrumentality, notice of the necessity to make that appointment shall be given at the meeting of the Council immediately preceding the meeting at which it is intended to make the appointment.

*Meetings of Electors.*

101. (1) The Standing Orders apply, as far as is practicable, to any meeting of electors, but where there is any inconsistency between the provisions of this by-law and the provisions of section 171 of the Act, the latter prevails.

(2) A person who is not an elector is not entitled to vote at a meeting of electors, and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting, unless the meeting, by a motion, requests him to do so.

*Meetings of Ratepayers.*

102. (1) The Standing Orders apply, so far as is practicable to any meeting of ratepayers, but where there is inconsistency between the provision of this by-law and the provisions of section 171 of the Act, the latter prevails.

(2) A person who is not a ratepayer is not entitled to vote at a meeting of ratepayers and he may not take any part in any discussion at that meeting unless the meeting, by a motion, requests him to do so.

*Penalty.*

103. Any person committing a breach of these Standing Orders is liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

*Enforcement.*

104. The Mayor is authorised and required to enforce the Standing Orders and to prosecute for any breach thereof.
