WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section 6 of the Interstate Maintenance Recovery Act, 1959-1962, that where in any State other than this State an Act is in force containing provisions substantially similar to or corresponding

with those contained in, or for carrying out objects substantially similar to or corresponding with the objects of Part III, Part IV or Part V of that Act, the Governor may, by Proclamation published in the Gazette, declare that that Part shall extend to and be in force as regards that State; and whereas Acts containing provisions substantially similar to or corresponding with those contained in, or for carrying out objects substantially similar to or corresponding with the objects of Part III, Part IV and Part V of the said Act are respectively in force in the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that Part III, Part IV and Part V of the said Act shall extend to and he in force or worder the Australian Capital. to and be in force as regards the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 13th day of February, 1964, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 120/61.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 35A of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, declare-

- (a) any policy of insurance to be a policy of insurance for the purposes of that Act;
- (b) which of the policies of insurance so declared are to apply within fire districts, only, and which are to apply within the whole of the State, generally; and

(c) the percentage of the gross premium paid or payable in respect of any policy of insurance so declared that is to be taken in computing a contribution numerator, for the purposes of sections 39 and 40 of that Act.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, doth, by this order, declare that—

- (d) the policies of insurance of the classes mentioned in the schedule hereto shall be policies of insurance for the purposes of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963;
- (e) the policies of insurance of the classes mentioned in Part I of the schedule hereto are to apply within Fire Districts, only, and those of the classes mentioned in Part II of the schedule are to apply within the whole of the State, generally; and
- (f) the percentage set out against each class of policy mentioned in the schedule hereto is that to be taken as the percentage of the gross premium, paid or payable in respect of every policy of that class, in computing the contribution numerator, for the purposes of sections 39 and 40 of the Act.


