ZOOLOGICAL GARDENS ACT, 1898-1955.

BY-LAWS

Published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th September, 1933, and incorporating the amendments thereof published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th September, 1934, the 16th July, 1943, the 24th April, 1952, the 25th July, 1952, the 23rd October, 1956, the 29th April, 1958, and the 29th May, 1963; and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954.

ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATISATION GARDENS. SOUTH PERTH.

By-laws.

Definitions.

Amended by 1. "Animal," unless context otherwise requires, shall include

authorised to act on its behalf.

"Cage" shall mean and include any and every building, cage, enclosure, pound, yard or other means whatever by which animals, birds, reptiles or fish are enclosed or housed or intended to be enclosed or housed.

"Committee" means the Acclimatisation Committee constituted under section three of the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898-1955.

"Employee" means any officer, caretaker, guide, gardener, keeper, labourer, workman or other person employed by the Committee.

"Gardens" mean the Zoological and Acclimatisation Gardens situated at South Perth, and such other land as is from time to time vested in or acquired by the Trustees under the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898-1955.

"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Committee or person authorised to act on its behalf first obtained and expressed in writing.

Entry.

Amended by 1. No person shall enter the Gardens by any manner other

prior permission to do so.

Vehicles.

Amended by 2. No person shall, without authority, bring any vehicle into

Domestic Animals.

Amended by 3. No person shall bring into, nor permit to enter the Gardens,
G.G., 29/5/63, any dog, cat, or other animal. Any such animal found within the
p. 1430. Gardens may be destroyed or detained in the Gardens by any
servant of the Committee, without compensation to the owner.

Cages and Enclosures.

Amended by 4. No person shall enter without authority any space set
G.G., 29/5/63, apart for the use of keepers or workmen, or railed off around or
p. 1430. about any cage, nor interfere with any lock attached to any part
of any cage; nor open, move or otherwise interfere with any gate,
slide, or grating attached to or associated with any cage.

No person, except workmen employed in the Gardens, shall enter any place enclosed for trees, shrubs, plants, or flowers, nor step or walk upon, or jump across any plot or bed which may be set apart for trees, shrubs, plants, or flowers.

Disturbing Animals.

5. No person shall tease or disturb any animal, nor throw, or attempt to throw stones, sticks, or other injurious substances into any cage, nor give to animals food of an unsuitable kind.

Damaging Growth.

6. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, flower, or grass, or remove or damage stakes or labels therein, nor hang, nor attach clothing or any articles thereto.

Soil, Fences, and Grass.

7. No person shall cut up, damage, disfigure, or interfere with the soil, turf, or surface of any part of the Gardens, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or any part of the fences, cages, buildings, electrical equipment, rockwork, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, nor pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, nor climb on or over any external or internal fence.

Rubbish.

8. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever within the Gardens, except in the receptacles provided, nor break bottles, china, or other similar substances therein.

9. (1) No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any disorderly, riotous, or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress in the Gardens.

(2) While in the gardens a person shall, at all times, be decently clothed and shall not expose or allow to remain exposed any part of his torso below six inches from the base of the neck.

10. No person shall, without permission, bring into, or consume, within the Gardens, any intoxicating liquor, nor enter thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor and such permission may be revoked verbally or in writing at any time by the Committee or person who granted it.

Expectoration.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate upon any path, grass, structure, or erection.

12. No person shall without authority post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, distribute or give out any placard, handbill notice, advertisement or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever in or about the Gardens, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

13. No person or persons shall without authority carry or discharge any firearms, or show or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Gardens.

14. No person shall, without authority, sell or expose for sale in the Gardens any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits, nuts, confectionery, fish or other merchandise or things whether of the same kind as, or a different kind from those here specified.

Professional Photography.

14A. A person shall not, without authority, engage in or carry on the business of or practice photography for gain or reward within the Gardens.

Sports and Performances.

15. No person shall, without authority, play, practise, or indulge in any game, sport or gymnastic exercise, or take part in any instrumental or vocal performance, or engage in public speaking of any kind in the Gardens.

Offensive Noises.

p. 1431. 15A. A person shall not, by the use of any mechanical, wireless or other instrument or thing of whatsoever kind, commit any offensive noise in the Gardens.

Children.

p. 1431. 16. A parent or guardian of a child under the age of ten years shall not knowingly allow that child to remain in the Gardens unless that child is in the charge of an adult person at the time he enters the Gardens and while he remains therein.

Smoking.

p. 1431. 17. Smoking may be prohibited within the Gardens, or any portion thereof, at such times as it may seem to the Committee necessary for the safety of the Gardens and the property therein. At such times a notice to this effect will be displayed at the entrances of the Gardens or in that portion.

Obstructing Visitors or Employees.

18. No person shall in any part of the Gardens wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use or enjoyment of the Gardens, nor wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of, or refuse or neglect to give his correct name and address to any member of the Committee or any of its employees.

Provided, that the Committee shall have power to arrange lower rates for large parties, and, on such special occasions as are in their opinion warranted, a charge not exceeding 1s. may be made.

Admission to Buildings, etc., Set Apart for Special Purposes.

(1) Where the Committee has set apart any building or place under its control and management for special exhibits or entertainment, a person other than an employee shall not without authority enter or use that building or place unless he has purchased and obtained from the Committee or an employee a ticket authorising him to do so and, on demand by an employee, yields up that ticket to the employee.

(2) Where the Committee has set apart any building or place under its control and management for hire on special occasions, or as a tennis court, or for any other purpose, a person, other than an employee, or a hirer of the building or place, or a person lawfully authorised to do so, shall not enter or use that building or place.

No person shall attempt to ride on an animal not then under the care of an employee of the Committee for the purpose of public riding, nor take a seat or attempt to ride on an animal, conveyance, merry-go-round, or miniature railway without having first purchased and being in possession of a proper ticket and yielding up that ticket to the employee when demanded.

Lost Property.

21. All property of every description apparently lost or abandoned must be handed by the finder to the Superintendent or gatekeeper or person in charge of the Gardens for the time being, to be returned by him to the owner on satisfactory proof of ownership, or disposed of as directed by the Committee, if unclaimed.

Offence of Failing to Obey Notice or Direction.

p. 1432. 22 A person shall not disobey or fail to comply with any notice or direction given by the Committee or person authorised to act on its behalf, regulating or prohibiting the use of any portion of the Gardens or any thing in the Gardens.

Parking.

p. 1432. 23. (1) The Committee or any person authorised by the Committee in that behalf may direct and control the parking of any vehicle upon any part of the Gardens and may set aside for the purpose of parking vehicles, any part of the Gardens.

(2) Any such part so set aside may be closed at any time and from time to time to any person for the purpose of parking a vehicle thereon or for any other purpose as the Committee or person authorised by the Committee so to do, may determine.

Penalties.

Any person offending against the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to being immediately removed from the Gardens.
