### **BY-LAWS**

Published in the Government Gazette on the 15th September, 1933, and incorporating the amendments thereof published in the Government Gazette on the 28th September, 1934, the 16th July, 1943, the 24th April, 1952, the 25th July, 1952, the 23rd October, 1956, the 29th April, 1958, and the 29th May, 1963; and reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954.

#### ZOOLOGICAL AND ACCLIMATISATION GARDENS. SOUTH PERTH.

#### By-laws.

#### Definitions.

1. "Animal," unless context otherwise requires, shall include Amended by 29/4/58, animal, bird, reptile and/or fish. GG p. 775;

G.G., 29 p. 1430. 29/5/63, "Authority" means permission to do any act, matter or thing given verbally or in writing by the Committee or any person authorised to act on its behalf.

> "Cage" shall mean and include any and every building, cage, enclosure, pound, yard or other means whatever by which animals, birds, reptiles or fish are enclosed or housed or intended to be enclosed or housed.

> "Committee" means the Acclimatisation Committee constituted under section three of the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898-1955.

"Employee" means any officer, caretaker, guide, gardener, keeper, labourer, workman or other person employed by the Committee.

"Gardens" mean the Zoological and Acclimatisation Gardens situated at South Perth, and such other land as is from time to time vested in or acquired by the Trustees under the Zoological Gardens Act, 1898-1955.

"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Committee or person authorised to act on its behalf first obtained and expressed in writing.

#### Entry.

1. #### Vehicles.

#### Domestic Animals.

Amended by 3. No person shall bring into, nor permit to enter the Gardens, G.G., 29/5/63, any dog, cat, or other animal. Any such animal found within the p. 1430. Gardens may be destroyed or detained in the Gardens by any servant of the Committee, without compensation to the owner.

#### Cages and Enclosures.

Amended by 4. No person shall enter without authority any space set G.G., 29/5/63 apart for the use of keepers or workmen, or railed off around or p. 1430.

apart for the use of keepers or workmen, or railed off around or about any cage, nor interfere with any lock attached to any part of any cage; nor open, move or otherwise interfere with any gate, slide, or grating attached to or associated with any cage. No person, except workmen employed in the Gardens, shall enter any place enclosed for trees, shrubs, plants, or flowers, nor step or walk upon, or jump across any plot or bed which may be set apart for trees, shrubs, plants, or flowers.

#### Disturbing Animals.

5. No person shall tease or disturb any **an**imal, nor throw, or attempt to throw stones, sticks, or other injurious substances into any cage, nor give to animals food of an unsuitable kind.

#### Damaging Growth.

6. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull, pick, renove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, flower, or grass, or remoe or damage stakes or labels therein, nor hang, nor attach clothig or any articles thereto.

#### Soil, Fences, and Grass.

7. No person shall cut up, damage, disfigure, or interfee with the soil, turf, or surface of any part of the Gardens, or th roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or any par of the fences, cages, buildings, electrical equipment, rockwork, waercocks, or seats around or upon the same, nor pollute or intergre with any ornamental water therein, nor climb on or over any external or internal fence.

#### Rubbish.

8. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, reuse, paper, broken glass, china or litter of any kind whatsoever within the Gardens, except in the receptacles provided, nor break bttles, china, or other similar substances therein.

#### Behaviour.

Amended by 9. (1) No person shall misconduct himself, or idulge in any  $G.G._{29/4/58}$ , disorderly, riotous, or indecent conduct, or use all indecent or  $G.G._{29/5/63}$ , improper language, or offend against decency as reards dress in p. 1430. the Gardens.

(2) While in the gardens a person shall, a all times, be decently clothed and shall not expose or allow toremain exposed any part of his torso below six inches from the base of the neck.

#### Intoxicating Liquor.

Amended by 10. No person shall, without permission, bringinto, or consume,  $G.G., 24/4/5^2$ , within the Gardens, any intoxicating liquor, nor etter thereon when p. 1063; G.G., 29/5/63, visibly under the influence of liquor and such remission may be p. 1431. revoked verbally or in writing at any time by the Committee or person who granted it.

#### Expectoration.

11. No person shall spit or expectorate won any path, grass, structure, or erection.

#### Bill Sticking.

Amended by 12. No person shall without authoritr post, stick, stamp, G.G., 29/5/63, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, distribute or give out any placard, p. 1431. handbill notice, advertisement or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, fiagging, rad, path, or any place whatever in or about the Gardens, and n person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

#### Fires and Shooting.

Amended by 13. No person or persons shall without authority carry or  $G.G._{29/5/63}$ , discharge any firearms, or show or discharge any stone or other p. 1431. missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any portion of the Gardens.

#### Trading.

Amended by 14. No person shall, without authority, sell or expose for sale G.G., 29/5/63, in the Gardens any goods, wares, refeshments, fruits, nuts, conp. 1431. fectionery, fish or other merchandise or things whether of the same kind as, or a different kind frm those here specified.

#### Professional Photography.

Added by 14A. A person shall not, without authority, engage in or carry G.G., 29/5/63 on the business of or practice photography for gain or reward p. 1431. within the Gardens.

#### Sports and Performances.

Amended by 15. No person shall, without authority, play, practise, or in-G.G., 29/5/63, dulge in any game, sport or gynnastic exercise, or take part in p. 1431. any instrumental or vocal performance, or engage in public speaking of any kind in the Gardens.

#### Offensive Noises.

Adda by 15A. A person shall not, by the use of any mechanical, wireless  $g.g._{9/5/63}$ , or other instrument or thing of whatsoever kind, commit any offensive noise in the Gardens.

#### Children.

By-lawn 16. A parent or guardian of a child under the age of ten subs. G.G. 29./63 years shall not knowingly allow that child to remain in the p. 1431. Gardens unless that child is in the charge of an adult person at the time he enters the Gardens and while he remains therein.

#### Smoking.

Amended : 17. Smoking may be prohibited within the Gardens, or any g.G., 29/5/3 portion thereof, at such times as it may seem to the Committee 1431. At such times a notice to this effect will be displayed at the ntrances of the Gardens or in that portion.

#### Obstructing Visitors or Employees.

18. No person shall in any part of the Gardens wilfully obtruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use or enjoyment of the Gardens, nor wilfully obstruct in the extution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful diretions of, or refuse or neglect to give his correct name and addess to any member of the Committee or any of its employees.

(2) Where the Committee has set apart any building or place under its contol and management for hire on special occasions, or as a tennis court, or for any other purpose, a person, other than an employe, or a hirer of the building or place, or a person lawfully authorisd to do so, shall not enter or use that building or place.

#### Train and Animal Rides.

Amended by 20. No person shall attempt to ride on an animal not then G.G., 29/4/58, under the care of an employee of the Committee for the purpose p. 776. of public riding, no: take a seat or attempt to ride on an animal, conveyance, merry-go-round, or miniature railway without having first purchased and being in possession of a proper ticket and yielding up that ticket to the employee when demanded.

#### Lost Property.

21. All property of every description apparently lost or abandoned must be handed by the finder to the Superintendent or gatekeeper or person in charge of the Gardens for the time being, to be returned by him to the owner on satisfactory proof of ownership, or disposed of as directed by the Committee, if unclaimed.

Offence of Failing to Obey Notice or Direction.

Added by 22 A person shall not disobey or fail to comply with any G.G., 29/5/63, notice or direction given by the Committee or person authorised p. 1432. to act on its behalf, regulating or prohibiting the use of any portion of the Gardens or any thing in the Gardens.

#### Parking.

Added by 23. (1) The Committee or any person authorised by the Com-G.G., 29/5/63, mittee in that behalf may direct and control the parking of any p. 1432. vehicle upon any part of the Gardens and may set aside for the purpose of parking vehicles, any part of the Gardens.

(2) Any such part so set aside may be closed at any time and from time to time to any person for the purpose of parking a vehicle thereon or for any other purpose as the Committee or person authorised by the Committee so to do, may determine.

#### Penalties.

Any person offending against the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ , in addition to being immediately removed from the Gardens.
