WHEREAS it is provided (inter alia) by section 16 of the Stamp Act, 1921-1963, that the stamp duties to be charged upon the several instruments specified in the Second Schedule to that Act shall be the several duties in the said schedule specified and shall be subject to the exemptions contained in the Act; and whereas by the said schedule certain exemptions are provided in the case of a receipt, including a receipt of any other kind (than those thereinbefore mentioned) which the Governor may by Proclamation exempt; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, expedient that a receipt given for a payment to, or for the use of, the educational establishments hereinafter specified ought to be exempted from duty: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby exempt from duty under the said Act a receipt given for any payment to, or for the use of, any establish-ment being an efficient school or a kindergarten within the meaning of the Education Act, 1928-1962
