To William John Wallwork, Esquire, of 15 Birdwood Parade, Nedlands, in the State of Western Australia, Stipendiary Magistrate:

I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby appoint you William John Wallwork to be a Royal Commission to enquire into and report upon the following matters, in relation to ships to which the Western Australian Marine Act, 1948-1962, applies and which proceed outside inland waters, that is to say—

(a) the adequacy of the present legislation (including regulations thereunder) concerning seaworthiness of and lifesaving equipment to be carried on the ships and any improvements considered to be desirable;

- (b) the ability of the Harbour and Light Department effectively to administer such legislation and improvements thereto, and to take Court action thereunder, having regard to present staff and legal requirements and what further staff and facilities (if any) should be made available to the Department for such purposes;
- (c) the requirements and standards of qualifications for masters, mates, engineers, marine motor engine drivers and coxswains' certificates, respectively, and any improvements considered to be desirable;
- (d) the adequacy of the present organisation and facilities for the search and rescue of persons missing at sea from such ships and any improvements considered to be desirable;
- (e) the attitude to, and views on, the foregoing matters of those affected by such legislation and its enforcement; and
- (f) generally the safety of such ships and those aboard them while at sea, and recommendations for or in regard to legislation, organisation, control, facilities, education or other matters to provide or improve measures for such safety;

and I hereby declare that by virtue of this Commission you may in the execution hereof do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or the Chairman or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902-1956, or otherwise.

WHEREAS it is provided *(inter alia)*, by section 5 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963, that "public holiday" means (in addition to the days therein specified) any day appointed by the Governor by Proclamation to be a public holiday throughout the State and in relation to a district or locality includes any day so appointed to be a public holiday in the district or locality specified in the Proclamation; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, expedient that the day hereinafter mentioned should be appointed a public holiday and a half-holiday, respectively, in the parts of the State set forth hereunder: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the 28th day of March, 1964, to be a public holiday in every part of the State, except the municipality of the Shire of Mandurah and to be a half-holiday in the municipality of the Shire of Mandurah; and all shops (except small shops and exempted shops) and warehouses, shall, according to the area in which they are situated, be kept shut on that day or after the hour of twelve noon on that day.

The offer shall be made on the condition that, if accepted, the owner or registered proprietor as the case may be will, subject to the payment as aforesaid, accept the new lot within the subdivisional area specified in the offer chosen in the manner hereinbefore provided in full settlement of all claims for compensation or otherwise in respect of the resumption of the lots coloured red on Plan No. 1 or the groups of three lots in respect of which the offer was made as aforesaid and will indemnify the Council against any claims which may be made by any other person who has or claims to have any estate or interest in the lots in the resumed area in respect of which the offer was made.

14. Transfer of Lots in Subdivisional Area: In accordance with an arrangement already entered into between the Crown and the Council, the Crown shall re-survey the subdivisional area in accordance with Plan No. 2 and such other land as may be made available by the Crown for the purpose of this Scheme and transfer lots in the subdivisional area except lot 215 to the Council.

15. The Council shall, subject to clause 29, transfer lots in the subdivisional area to the various persons who have accepted the said offers made the payments (if any) payable by them and otherwise complied with the terms of the offers.

16. Compensation: Claims may be made to the Council for compensation for the resumption of the land in the resumed area in respect of which an offer of replacement land has not been made and in respect of which an offer if made has been rejected or not been accepted or rescinded under clause 29.

17. Settlement of Compensation: The Council may enter into agreements with claimants as to the amount of compensation payable and may settle claims for compensation.

18. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled when the Council is ready to complete this Scheme, the Council, with the agreement of the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority, may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing, the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

19. Time Limit of Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of this Scheme coming into operation or of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of recission under clause 29 whichever is the later.

20. Costs of Scheme: The Scheme shall be debited with—

- (a) all compensation payable and all costs and expenses incurred by the Council in determining and settling compensation;
- (b) the estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 18 hereof;
- (c) the cost of acquisition of any land within the resumed area in the event of such land being acquired by the Council other than by resumption;
- (d) the cost of the transfer of replacement lots in the subdivisional area in accordance with the Scheme;
- (e) the cost of any road construction carried out in the subdivisional area;
- (f) interest and any other charges in respect of any moneys borrowed for the purposes of the Scheme;

- (g) payments made under clause 27 hereof, subject to any arrangement for the subsequent reimbursement thereof;
- (h) all administrative and any other costs incurred by the Council in carrying out the Scheme.

21. All moneys payable by and to the Council by way of equality under clause 9 shall be debited and credited to the Scheme.

22. Sale of Surplus Lots: The Council may sell any surplus lots at such prices and upon such terms and conditions as the Council shall think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract, the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender, that price has not been obtained. The net proceeds from the sale of surplus lots shall be credited to the Scheme.

23. Costs of Scheme: Subject to any agreement which may be made with the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority, the Council shall pay the costs of the Scheme. If the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority shall have paid any moneys on account of the costs of the Scheme, the Council shall, so far as the profits of the Scheme permit, repay such moneys to the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority. Subject as aforesaid the Council shall retain the net profits if any of the Scheme.

24. Transfer of Resumed Area: The Council shall transfer the resumed area to the Crown.

25. Powers of Council: The Council shall have the following powers:---

- (a) To enter into agreements and arrangements with the Crown and the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority for the carrying out of this Scheme.
- (b) Sell any surplus lots in the subdivisional area and credit the proceeds of sale to the costs of the Scheme.
- (c) Postpone the operation of the Scheme until satisfactory arrangements have been made with the Crown, the Metropolitan Region Planning Authority, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department or other authority on any matters pertaining to the Scheme.
- (d) Extend the time within which any offer or replacement land may be accepted.
- (e) Determine the method of the conduct of the ballot for replacement lots and settle any disputes relating thereto.
- (f) Acquire by purchase or otherwise any land in the Scheme area.
- (g) Enter into agreements with owners of land within the resumed area.

26. The Council may, subject to the written consent of the Minister and to the approval of the Governor, obtain advances from a bank on overdraft in pursuance of section 600 of the Local Government Act, 1961-1962, for the purpose of carrying out the Scheme and the payment of any moneys or expenses payable by the Council in accordance with this Scheme.

27. The Council may enter into arrangements with the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department for the extension of water mains and pipes to the subdivisional area and make such payments to the Department for that purpose as it considers reasonable.

28. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the resumed area being subject to a registered mortgage, charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of any third party, the Council shall not authorise a transfer of a replacement lot in the subdivisional area to the owner unless subject to a similar encumbrance or unless with the written consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrances.

29. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers of lots in the subdivisional area in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1957, and return it to the Council for registration or fail to make the payment (if any) to be made by him within twenty-eight days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by certified post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer) the Council may rescind any provision or agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made.
