IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, by means of fishing nets, in all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the schedule hereto, for a period of five years from the 1st March, 1964.

Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters at City Beach extending along the foreshore one-half mile in each direction from the Groyne and to a width of one-half mile from mean low water mark.

Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Cowaramup Bay.

Constitution Act, 1889.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1224/60.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments, which by Act of Legislature or by Order in Council may be vested in the heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in Phillip Neil Shedley or any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Phillip Neil Shedley and any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2150/59.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Act shall be leased for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid, by instrument of lease, to any person (as defined in the said section); and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27156 (Murray Location 1552) shall be leased for a term of one year and thereafter from year to year to the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of a "Rifle Range": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased for a term of one year and thereafter from year to year to the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of a Rifle Range at an annual rental of two pounds.

Land Act, 1933-1963.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 14903/10.—That Reserve No. 27152 (Toodyay Lot 228) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Toodyay in trust for the purpose of Picnic Site and Preservation of Historical Buildings.

Corres. 8692/98, Vol. 4.—That Reserve No. 27154 at Kalamunda should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalamunda in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Corres. 1778/30.—That Reserve No. 27157 (Plantagenet Location 6930) should vest in and be held by the Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia in trust for the purpose of Conservation of Flora and Fauna.

Corres. 2644/53.—That "A" Class Reserve No. 24392 should vest in and be held by The Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia in trust for the purpose of National Park and Conservation of Indigenous Flora and Fauna.

Corres. 3985/53.—That Reserve No. 24041 at Wyndham should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for Harbour Purposes.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1963.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary

to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 775/42.—That Reserve No. 22361 (Denmark Lot 101) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the St. John Ambulance Association in Western Australia Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of a Site for St. John Ambulance Association Quarters.

Corres. 2837/62.—That Reserve No. 27153 (Mount Barker Lot 576) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board to be held in trust for the purpose of a Fire Station Site.

Corres. 2529/63.—That Reserve No. 27155 (Darkan Lot 31) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the St. John Ambulance Association in Western Australia, Incorporated, to be held in trust for the purpose of an Ambulance Centre.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Forests Act, 1918-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests 615/63; Lands Corres. 4796/14, Vol. 2.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, reserve from sale any Crown land as a Timber Reserve within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the Crown land described in the schedule hereto as Timber Reserve No. 161/25 within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act.

Schedule.

All those portions of land being:—

- (a) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-eastern corner of Nelson Location 2313 and extending westerly along the northern boundary of that location to the eastern side of road number 1768; thence northerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the easternmost northern boundary of location 1412; thence westerly and northerly to and along boundaries of that location to its northernmost north-eastern corner; thence northerly along the eastern boundaries of locations 1898 (Reserve 15748) and 6362 to the southern side of road number 1654; thence generally easterly along that side to the northern corner of location 11306 (Reserve 22157); thence south-westerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that location to the north-western corner of Bridgetown Town Lot 767 (part Reserve 15475), a point on the western boundary of Bridgetown Townsite; thence generally easterly and generally southerly along that boundary to the south-western corner of lot 588; thence generally westerly along the northern side of a one-chain road passing along the northern boundaries of Nelson Location 8318 to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the north-western boundary of that location; thence south-westerly, southerly and easterly to and along boundaries of that location to the westernmost north-western corner of location 11279; thence southerly, easterly,

northerly and north-westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern boundary of location 8318 aforesaid; thence north-easterly along that boundary to the north-western corner of that location, a point on the southern boundary of Bridgetown Townsite aforesaid; thence generally easterly along that boundary to the south-western corner of location 11827; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that location to the western boundary of location 9832; thence generally southerly along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of location 11852; thence westerly, southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the westernmost north-western corner of location 6654 (Reserve 5350); thence south-westerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that location to the northern boundary of location 2915; thence westerly along that boundary and the northern boundary of location 8710 to the eastern boundary of location 2313 aforesaid and thence northerly along that boundary to the starting point; and

- (b) all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Nelson Location 1511 and extending northerly and north-easterly along the south-eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the south-eastern boundary of location 6654 (Reserve 5350) to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the southernmost north-eastern boundary of that location; thence north-westerly and north-easterly to and along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 9819; thence easterly to and along that boundary to the western side of a one-chain road passing along the western boundary of location 810; thence southerly along that side to the northern boundary of location 1944 and thence westerly along the northern boundaries of that location and location 1511 aforesaid to the starting point.

Forests Act, 1918-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 574/61, L. and S. 5636/26.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 1st day of November, 1961, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown

land as State Forest No. 21 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

State Forest 21.—All that portion of Wellington Location 4925 situate westerly of a line extending northerly in prolongation of the western boundary of Kirup Town Lot 88. (Plans 414D/40, C3, and Kirup Townsite.)

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 487047/63.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Construction of open channel and pipe drains approximately 6,200 feet in length between View Street, Russell Street, Rudloc Road and Drake Street.

The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 9003.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 26th day of March, 1964.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962.

Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1.

Black Creek Extension.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 60803/61.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 are hereby extended by including therein the land described in the schedule hereto.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the north-western side of William Street (road number 186) with the north-eastern side of Luyer Avenue (road number 5832) and extending north-westerly along the last-mentioned side to the western corner of lot 9 of Canning Location 315 and 246 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 5009; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that lot to the south-western boundary of location 246 aforesaid; thence north-westerly along that boundary to the southern corner of location 581 (Reserve 11431); thence north-westerly along the south-western boundary of that location and onwards to the southern corner of location 1022; thence north-easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to its northernmost north-eastern corner; thence easterly to the southern corner of the western severance of Reserve 984 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 7731; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of that severance to its easternmost eastern corner; thence north-easterly to the southernmost south-eastern corner of the northern severance of that reserve; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of that severance to the south-western boundary of location 301; thence north-westerly along that boundary to the eastern corner of lot 1 of locations 320 and 406 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 1612; thence south-westerly and north-westerly along boundaries of that lot to the south-eastern boundary of lot 324 of location 2 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2430; thence south-westerly, north-westerly, and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the westernmost south-western boundary of lot 3 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 14554; thence north-westerly and north-easterly to and along boundaries of that lot and north-easterly along the north-western boundary of lot 4 to the northern corner of that lot; thence northerly to the western corner of lot 5 of Swan Location 34 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 19464; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that lot to its northern corner; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that lot and lot 4 to the south-eastern boundary of lot 93 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2101; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of that lot to the south-western side of Casino Street (road number 9044); thence north-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern boundary of lot 86 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2101 aforesaid; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the southern boundary of the Welshpool Marshalling Yard as shown coloured green on Land Titles Office Plan 7258; thence westerly along that boundary to a point situate 185 degrees 37 minutes from the eastern

corner of part of lot 3 of location 34 aforesaid as shown coloured green on Land Titles Office Plan 7258 aforesaid; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along the boundary of the Welshpool Marshalling Yard aforesaid to the north-western side of Uranium Street (road number 8220); thence north-easterly along that side to the southern corner of lot 73 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2101 aforesaid; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the western corner of lot 40 of location 33 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2799; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the south-eastern side of Uranium Street aforesaid; thence north-easterly along that side and south-easterly along the south-western side of Carr Road (road number 9046) to the northern corner of lot 31 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 18027; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot and south-easterly along the south-western boundary of lot 32 to the western corner of part of that lot as shown coloured green on Land Titles Office Plan 7258 aforesaid; thence south-easterly to the intersection of the prolongation north-easterly of the north-western side of Newburn Road (road number 168) with the north-eastern side of Abernethy Road (road number 6086); thence south-easterly along the lastmentioned side to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the south-eastern boundary of Canning Location 171; thence south-westerly to and along that side to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the northernmost south-western boundary of part of location 297 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 15199; thence south-easterly, south-westerly and generally south-easterly to and along boundaries of that part and onwards to the south-eastern side of road number 5578; thence generally south-westerly along that side to the northern corner of lot 14 of locations 207 and 297 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 14526; thence south-easterly and south-westerly along boundaries of that lot and onwards to the northern boundary of lot 11; thence south-easterly along that boundary and generally south-easterly and south-westerly along boundaries of lot 12 and onwards to the southern side of Welshpool Road (road number 2977); thence east-south-easterly along that side to the south-western side of a subsidiary road as shown coloured blue on Land Titles Office Plan 6906; thence south-easterly along that side to the north-western boundary of lot 1 of location 203 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 7083; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot to the western side of the Spearwood-Midland Junction Controlled Access Road as shown coloured green on Land Titles Office Plan 6906 aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly along that side to the north-western side of William Street aforesaid and thence south-westerly along that side to the starting point, being the land delineated and shown bordered orange on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8999.

Goldfields and Agricultural Water Supply.

City of Nedlands.

Annexation of Outlying Land.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 3127/52.

WHEREAS it is provided in subsection (1) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, upon presentation to him of a petition from the Council of the municipality and at least 20, or a majority, whichever is the lesser number, of the owners of land within an area of outlying land adjoining the district, annex that area of outlying land to a district; and whereas there is an area of outlying land adjoining the district of the municipality of the City of Nedlands as set forth in the schedule hereto; and whereas there are, in fact, no owners of land other than the Crown within the area concerned; and whereas the Council of the municipality of the City of Nedlands has presented a petition to the Governor in accordance with the provisions of the said section; and whereas it is considered desirable to annex to the district of the City of Nedlands the said area of outlying land; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby annex to the district of the municipality of the City of Nedlands, to form part of the Dalkeith and Melvista Wards respectively to the extent that the outlying land abuts thereon, the land described in the schedule hereto.
