PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1963, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board, from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described in the schedule hereunder be declared totalisator agency regions for those purposes: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that as from and including the 15th day of May, 1964, the land described in the schedule hereunder shall be totalisator agency regions for the purposes of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1963.

- (a) The whole of the land contained in the municipal district of the Shire of Williams.
- The whole of the land contained in the municipal district of the Shire of Marradong.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, inter alia, made lawful for the Governor to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Act shall be leased for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid, by instrument of lease, to any person (as defined in the said section); and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 27161 (Swan Location 7747) shall be leased for a term of one year and thereafter from year to year to the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of a Rifle Range: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the abovementioned reserve shall be leased for a term of one year and thereafter from year to year to the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of a Rifle Range at an annual rental of one pound.

Land Act, 1933-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 27165 (Forrestdale Lots 382, 400 and 405) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott in trust for the purpose of Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott in trust for Recreation with power to the said Shire of Armadale-Kelmscott, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Forests Act, 1918-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 293/23, L. and S. 3570/53.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that the Governor may, by an Order in Council, declare any Crown lands as Timber Reserves within the meaning and for the purpose of that Act, or may revoke in whole or part any such reservation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the reservation of Crown lands as Timber Reserve No. 60/25 by excising that portion of such Timber Reserve as is described in the schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 489541/64.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1962, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinaftermentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Construction of open channel and pipe drains, compensating basin, pumping station, and rising main, approximately 5,600 feet in length, between Fisher Street and Knutsford Avenue.

The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking and shown on plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 9020.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 10th day of April, 1964.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960. Goldfields and Agricultural Water Supply. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Local Government Act, 1960-1962. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1624/63.

Local Government Act, 1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may make and publish in the Gazette uniform general by-laws for all or any portion of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a council under Part XV of the Act and may, by order, declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the order shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas, by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd June, 1961, on the 13th June, 1962, on the 4th October, 1962, on the 3rd July, 1963, and on the 30th December, 1963, the Governor did thereby make certain uniform general by-laws; and whereas it is desired that the said by-laws should apply to the portion of the district set out hereunder: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in the exercise of the power conferred by the Local Government Act, 1960, doth hereby declare that the whole of uniform general by-laws made pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, and published in the Government

Gazette on the 23rd day of June, 1961, on the 13th day of June, 1962, on the 4th day of October, 1962, on the 3rd July, 1963, and on the 30th December, 1963, shall apply to the townsites of Gingin, Guilderton, Ledge Point and Lancelin within the district of the Shire of Gingin.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas Whittakers Building Supply Company of Hay Street, Subiaco, being an employer within the meaning of the section, has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for ten thousand pounds (£10,000) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Whittakers Building Supply Company from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963, for a period expiring on the 11th day of March, 1966.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited of 171 St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section, has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Government Securities to the value of five thousand pounds (£5,000) charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited from the operation of section 3 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1963, for a period expiring on the 28th day of February, 1966.
