# Local Government Act, 1960. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1893/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may make and publish in the Gazette uniform general by-laws for all or any the Gazette uniform general by-laws for all or any portion of the purposes for which by-laws may be made by a Council under Part XV of the Act and may, by order, declare that all or any such uniform general by-laws as are specified in the order shall apply to the whole or any portion of a district so specified; and whereas, by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd June, 1961, on the 13th June, 1962, on the 4th October, 1962, on the 3rd July, 1963, on the 30th December, 1963, and on the 16th April, 1964, the Governor did thereby make certain uniform general by-laws; and whereas it is desired that the said by-laws should apply to the portion of the said by-laws should apply to the portion of the district set out hereunder: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the Local Government Act, 1960, doth hereby declare that the whole of uniform general by-laws made pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 433A of the Local Government Act, 1960, and published in the Government Gazette on the 23rd day of June, 1961, on the 13th day of June, 1962, on the 4th day of October, 1962, on the 3rd July, 1963, on the 30th December, 1963, and on the 16th April, 1964, shall apply to all townsites within the district of the Shire of Mt. Magnet.

Redescription of District Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1091/52.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (i) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that upon presentation of a petition under the Common Seal of the municipality, the Governor may describe the boundaries of a district as existing; and whereas the municipality of the Town of Bunbury has submitted a petition under its Common Seal praying that the existing boundaries be redescribed; and whereas it is considered desirable that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby describe the boundaries of the district of the municipality of the Town of Bunbury, as set forth in the attached schedule.

#### Schedule.

Redescription of the Municipal Boundaries of the Town of Bunbury.

(a) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the left bank of the Collie River with the eastern boundary of Leschenault Location 26, and extending southerly along that boundary to the north-eastern corner of Collie Agricultural Area Lot 46; thence southerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot to its south-eastern corner; thence southeasterly to the northern corner of part of Wellington Location 53 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 13627; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that part of location 53 and conwards to the southern side of the South Western Highway (road number 50); thence generally southeasterly along that side to the eastern boundary of location 53 aforesaid; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the northernmost north-eastern corner of Leschenault Location 12; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern side of Centenary Road; thence westerly to and along that side and onwards to the north-eastern corner of Wellington Location 2420; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location 497; thence north-north-easterly and west-northwesterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean; thence generally north-easterly and generally south-easterly along that low water mark and generally south-easterly along that low water mark and generally south-easterly and generally north-easterly along the southern shore of Leschenault Inlet to the left bank of the Colle River aforesaid, and thence generally south-easterly upwards along that bank to the starting point; and

(b) all that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the low water mark of Koombana Bay situate at the south-western corner of Wellington Location 24, and extending easterly along the southern boundary of that location to the shore of Leschenault Inlet; thence generally south-westerly and generally north-westerly along that shore to Point MacCleod, and thence generally north-north-easterly and generally north-easterly along the low water mark of Koombana Bay aforesaid to the starting point.

Town Planning Scheme No. 9.
Vahland Avenue Scheme.

RESOLVED that the Canning Shire Council, in pursuance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961, prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to areas situated wholly within the Canning Shire and enclosed within the inner edge of blue borders on the plans now produced to the Canning Shire Council and marked and certified by the President and the Shire Clerk of the Council under their hands dated the 27th day of May, 1963, as Plan No. 1 and Plan No. 2.

Details of Vahland Avenue Scheme.

- 1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Canning (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").
- 2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within blue borders on Plan No. 1 and on Plan No. 2. The said lands are hereinafter referred to as "the Area".
- 3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—
  - (a) to improve and develop the Area to the best possible advantage;
  - (b) to plan within the Area suitable roads;
  - (c) to ensure proper drainage of roads and of those parts of the Area which require drainage;
  - (d) to make provision for public open space.
- 4. Land Reserved for Public or Local Authority Purposes: It is intended that the tract or tracts of land coloured green on Plan No. 2 shall be reserved for public recreational purposes and those hatched green on Plan No. 2 shall be reserved for roads.
- 5. The Council may acquire the said lands hatched or coloured green or any parts thereof either by purchase or resumption or partly by one method and partly by the other.
- 6. The Council shall do all things necessary in order to raise a loan for the purpose of providing the finance necessary for the acquisition of the said lands hatched or coloured green on Plan No. 2, and for the purpose of making payments under clause 9 hereof. If the Council shall be unable to raise the said loan it shall be under no liability to the owners of land within the Area or to any other person by reason of its failure to provide the said lands for public or local authority purposes and roads.
- 7. If the Council shall raise the said loan or make finance available from other sources, it shall acquire the said lands hatched or coloured green on Plan No. 2, or so much thereof as the said loan or finances permit.
- 8. Subject to clauses 9 and 10 each owner of land within the Area shall, when subdividing his land, pay to the Council an amount equal to one-tenth of the value of his land at the date on which the subdivision of his land is approved by the Town Planning Board of Western Australia.
- 9. Vahland Avenue has been designed as a road of one and one-half chains in width instead of the usual width of one chain. Those owners who make land available for Vahland Avenue shall not be required to make any payment under Clause 8 hereof or make any further land available for public open space. If the area of land made available for Vahland Avenue by an owner exceeds in

value the amount which would have but for this clause been paid under clause 8 such owner shall be compensated by the Council in respect of the value of such excess.

- 10. All that piece of land being lot 1011 on Plan 4386 and being formerly the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1118 folio 125 has been subdivided prior to the coming into operation of this Scheme. Upon such subdivision, the land shown as lot 54 on Plan No. 2 (being formerly lot 54 on Diagram 27820 and the land comprised in Certificate of Title Volume 1262, folio 562) was transferred to the Crown for use as public open space, and the land shown as Kareela Road on Plan No. 2 was transferred to the Crown and constructed at the expense of the owner. The owner of the said land, namely Ida Amelia Salter of Brentwood Road, Wattle Grove, Married Woman, has agreed to pay to the Council the sum of three hundred and thirty pounds (£330) representing the 10 per cent. of the value of the said lot 1011 on Plan 4386 at the date of its subdivision. Upon payment of the said sum and subject to the consent of the Crown lot 54 shall be transferred to the said Ida Amelia Salter free from encumbrances and free from any obligations as to its use as public open space and the said Ida Amelia Salter shall not be liable for any further payment under clause 8 hereof nor to make any further payment for the costs of road construction.
- 11. For the purpose of clause 8 of this Scheme the value of the owners' land shall be determined by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or some person recommended by him. If an owner objects to the value so determined he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight days after having been informed of the said value and in that event the value shall be determined by arbitration in accordance with Clause 21 hereof.
- 12. The Council shall apply all moneys paid to it in pursuance of clause 8 hereof in reduction of the said loan and interest thereon or if the Council has made finance available from other sources then in reimbursement of such moneys. In the event of the moneys received by the Council in pursuance with clause 8 being insufficient to repay the said loan and interest or other moneys the Council shall repay the balance thereof from its general fund.
- 13. In the event of the moneys received by the Council, in pursuance of clause 8 hereof, being greater than the amount necessary to repay the said loan and interest thereon or other money the balance thereof shall be applied by the Council in further improvements and facilities within the open spaces in the Area.
- 14. Subdivisional Planning: It is intended that as and when owners of land within the Area desire to develop and subdivide their land such development and subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development of the Area.
- 15. The road design shown on Plan No. 2 forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Area but the Council may permit alterations or variations to the Plan where circumstances justify such action, provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it shall impede the subdivision and development of the Area as a whole.
- 16. New Roads: Subject to clauses 17, 18 and 19 all new roads within the Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein and each owner shall pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the land owned by him.
- 17. In cases where the situation of a new road within the Area is such that it would be fair and equitable that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them then the amount (if any) payable by each such owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.
- 18. The Council shall pay one-half of the cost of the construction of the roads which are adjacent to any land acquired by the Council pursuant to clause 5.

- 19. Although Vahland Avenue has been designed as a road with a dual carriageway the owners who under the preceding clauses would have been liable to pay for the construction of Vahland Avenue shall be required only to pay so much of the cost of the construction of Vahland Avenue as would have been payable if Vahland Avenue had been a road with a single carriageway.
- 20. Powers of Council: In the conduct and management of this Scheme the Council shall in addition to the powers hereinbefore contained have the following powers:—
  - (a) To enter and inspect any land within the Area.
  - (b) To make agreements with owners of land within the Area.
- 21. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under this Scheme or as to the valuation of land under clause 9 hereof may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, and if the parties fail to agree upon any one single arbitrator he may be nominated by the Council
- 22. The Limit for Claims of Compensation: Claims for compensation by a reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six months of this Scheme coming into operation or in the case of resumption of land, within six months from the issue of the notice of resumption.
