Amendment of By-laws.

I hereby certify that at a meeting of the Commit-tee of the Western Australian Trotting Association held on Thursday, the 4th day of June, 1964, the following resolution was passed by an absolute majority in number of the Committee:—

1. That By-law 99 in the First Schedule of the Western Australian Trotting Association Act of 1946 and Rule W.92 of the Western Australian Trotting Association Rules of Trotting 1962 be re-pealed and the following substituted:—

99. The following by-laws shall apply exclusively to place totalisators, and subject thereto the foregoing by-laws also apply:---

- (a) When eight or more horses remain in any race when the totalisator is opened on that race the distributable amount will be divided into three equal parts, and investors on the placed horses shall be entitled to a dividend arrived at by dividing each such part by the number of investors on each such horse respectively.
- (b) The investors on three or more horses running a dead-heat for first place shall divide the whole of the distributable amount; on two horses running a dead-heat for first place, shall divide two-thirds of the distributable amount. The investors on horses running a dead-heat for second place shall divide two-thirds, and on horses running a dead-heat for third place, shall divide one-third of the distributable amount. amount.
- When either seven, six or five horses remain in a race when the totalisator is opened on that race, the place totalisator shall pay on the first and second horses only. The distributable amount will be divided into two equal parts and paid to the investors on the first and second horses respectively. The investors on horses running a dead-heat for first place will divide the whole of the distributable amount and on horses running a dead-heat for second place will divide one-half of the distributable amount. (c) When either seven, six or five horses
- (d) If only one horse be placed by the Judge, investors on such horse will divide the whole of the distributable amount.

- (e) If only two horses be placed, investors on each of such horses shall divide one-half of the distributable amount.
- (f) If less than five horses remain in a race when the win totalisator is opened, the place totalisator will not be opened.
- (g) In this rule "distributable amount" means the total amount invested less commission and less any moneys returned to investors under the provision of Rule 97.
