WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 4 of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1963, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Board from time to time, and at any time, by Proclamation, declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that the land described

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 25th day of February, 1964, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959 is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Northam more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name of Wundowie Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Wundowie Fire District" and in column two opposite that name the name of the Local Authority, "Municipal District of the Shire of Northam".

Schedule.

All that portion of land situate within the Municipal District of the Shire of Northam bounded by lines starting from the easternmost south-eastern corner of Avon Location 24012 and extending northerly along the eastern boundaries of that location and locations 24011 and 24010 and onwards to the south-western corner of Wundowie Townsite; thence easterly along a southern boundary of that townsite to a point situate in prolongation south-south-westerly of the western boundary of Wundowie Town Lot 290; thence north-north-easterly to and along that boundary and to and along the western boundary of lot 289, and onwards to a point situate in prolongation west-north-westerly of the northern boundary of lot 293; thence east-south-easterly to and along that boundary and the northern boundaries of lots 294, 288, 295 to 300 inclusive, 286, 301 to 305 inclusive and onwards to the eastern boundary of Wundowie Townsite aforesaid; thence generally southerly and south-easterly along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation east-north-easterly of the north-western boundary of Reserve 10953; thence west-south-westerly to the northernmost north-western corner of that reserve; thence west-south-westerly and south-westerly along boundaries of that reserve to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 24012 aforesaid, and thence northerly along that prolongation to the starting point. in the matter of the Fremantle Buffalo Club.

Definition.

IN this notice unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) "Association" means the Association proposed to be registered under the Associations Incorporations Act, 1895-1962, and to be known as the "Fremantle Buffalo Club Incorporated;"
- (b) "Club" means "Fremantle Buffalo Club" a company duly registered under the Companies Act, 1893;

- (c) "member" means a financial member of the Club as defined by the Articles of Association;
- (d) "Registrar" means the Registrar of Companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1962.

Notice is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for leave to bring in a Bill for effecting all or some of the purposes following namely:—

- (1) To have the Registrar issue a Certificate of Incorporation to incorporate an association under the Associations Incorporation Act, 1895-1962 (hereinafter called "the Association") for the purposes of:—

- (a) Vesting all property belonging to or held by any person in trust for or on behalf of the Club and the right of the Club to recover and receive all debts and other choses in action without any conveyance, transfer or assignment in the Association.

- (b) To have all the liabilities and engagements of the Club at the time of the aforesaid vesting to become liabilities and engagements of the Association.

- (c) To have all uncompleted contracts or engagements heretofore entered into and entered into between the date of this notice and the actual granting of the aforesaid petition by any person or persons with the Club to the extent that the same shall be uncompleted deemed to have been entered into with the Association.

- (d) To have every member of the Club deemed a member of the Association without payment of any entrance fee.

- (e) Upon the vesting of the property of the Club in the association to—

- (i) have the Club released from any liability to pay any fine, fee or other monetary payment whatsoever resulting from the Club's past failure to comply with any Act or regulation applicable to companies;

- (ii) have the Club deemed to be dissolved and wound up and have the Registrar strike the Club off the Registrar of Companies kept by him.

- (f) To exempt any act, manner or thing done or agreement entered into in order to vest the property of the Club in the Association from stamp duty chargeable under the Stamp Act and amendments thereto.

- (g) To have any license or licenses previously issued to the Club, pursuant to the provisions of the Licensing Act, 1911, and amendments thereto, or any other Act whatsoever, deemed to be licenses issued to the Association and subject only to the provisions of the relevant Act or Acts and regulations applicable to such license or licenses to have the same continue in force and be applicable to the Association as though the Association and the Club were and had always been one and the same.

- (h) To allow the Club to continue to exercise all the rights and privileges and be subject to the liabilities of a registered club within the meaning of the Licensing Act, 1911, and amendments thereto, between the period of the passing of the Act the

subject of the aforesaid petition and the date of the issue by the registrar of a Certificate of Incorporation for the Association under the Associations Incorporations Act, 1895-1962.

- (i) On the issue of a Certificate of Incorporation for the Association under the Associations Incorporations Act, 1895-1962, to allow the Association thenceforth to be entitled to exercise all the rights and privileges of and become subject to the liabilities of a registered club within the meaning of the Licensing Act, 1911, and amendments thereto.

Resolved that the Shire of Cockburn, in pursuance of section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1961, prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the Shire of Cockburn and enclosed within the inner edge of a blue border on the plans now produced to the Shire of Cockburn, and marked and certified by the Shire Clerk to the Shire of Cockburn, under his hand, a Plan No. 1 originally dated the 13th day of March 1963, and as so remarked and re-certified under his hand and dated the 31st day of October, 1963, and Plan No. 2 dated the 23rd day of June, 1964.

Scheme Ordinance.

1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for the administration and enforcement of this Scheme is the Council of the Shire of Cockburn (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within a blue border on Plan No. 1 and on Plan No. 2. The said land is herein referred to as "the Area".

3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are to improve and develop the Area to the best possible advantage, to plan within the Area suitable roads and make provisions for arterial and main roads, to ensure the proper drainage of roads, to plan the subdivision of the land within the Area, to facilitate and co-ordinate progressive subdivision and development of land within the Area and to make provision for land for public and local authority purposes.

4. Method of Carrying Out Objects: It is intended that as and when owners of land within the Area desire to develop and subdivide their land, such development and subdivision shall be according to a plan which will be capable of forming part of an overall plan of subdivision and development for the Area.

5. The plan of subdivision shown in Plan No. 2 forms a basis for subdivision and development of the Area, but the Council may permit alterations or variations to the Plan where circumstances justify such action, provided that no such alteration or variation shall be permitted if in the opinion of the Council it shall impede the subdivision and development of the Area as a whole.

6. Subdivision: An owner of land within the Area who desires to subdivide and develop his land, either alone or in conjunction with other owners, shall submit a plan of proposed subdivision to the Town Planning Board, as required by the Town Planning and Development Act of Western Australia.

7. New Roads: All new roads within the Area shall be constructed and drained at the expense of the owners of land therein, and each owner shall pay the costs of the construction and drainage of the roads within the Area of the land owned by him.

With respect to Spearwood Avenue, the owners of land adjoining this road shall be entitled to compensation because of the special nature of this road, in respect of that portion of the owners' land taken for such road as is in excess of the amount of land normally required to be given for road purposes. Contribution by such owners to road construction shall only be required to the same extent as if the said road was a normal one-chain internal subdivisional road of similar pattern to other internal roads created by this Scheme.

With respect to Phoenix Road, the owners of land on the north side thereof, from Rockingham Road to the south-western corner of the proposed district centre, shall be required to cede, without compensation, one chain for road widening, and on so doing shall not be liable to contribute towards the costs of constructing the widened section of Phoenix Road.

8. In cases where the situation of a new road within the Area is such that the owners of adjoining land should each contribute to the cost of the construction or drainage of that road, and such owners are unable to agree upon the proportion of the costs payable by each of them, then the amount payable by each owner shall be determined by arbitration in manner hereinafter provided.

9. If the Council shall construct or drain a new road within the Area prior to subdivision of the land adjoining such road, the costs of the construction and drainage of the said road and all compensation and other costs consequent upon the acquisition of the land paid by the Council shall be paid to the Council by the respective owners of land as and when their land is subdivided and the provisions of paragraphs 7, 8 and 11 shall apply in respect of such payments.

10. Closure of Roads: All surveyed roads within the Area which are shown on Plan No. 2 as roads to be closed shall be deemed to have been closed as from the date on which this Scheme shall come into operation.

11. Drainage: Each owner, upon the subdivision of his land, shall pay to the Council an amount which bears the same proportion to the estimated costs as revised from time to time of drainage of the Area as the area of his land bears to the whole of the privately owned land within the Area and the Council shall at the appropriate time, from the moneys so obtained, carry out the drainage scheme of the Area in accordance with the drainage plan approved by the Council with such

modifications as may from time to time be determined by the Council. The cost of drainage of the proposed district centre shall be borne by the Council.

12. Open Space: It is intended that a tract or tracts of land in total approximately one-tenth of the total area of land within the Area shall be provided for public recreational and road drainage purposes within the Area. In order that this may be done each owner shall, when subdividing his land and subject as hereinafter provided, transfer to the Council an area of land equal to one-tenth of the total area of land being subdivided or developed by him or such other area as the Town Planning Board shall, upon the approval of the plan of subdivision, require.

13. If, within a portion of the Area the subject of subdivision and development, no land or less than one-tenth of the land is required by the Council for public recreational and road drainage purposes, the owner shall, if the Town Planning Board make it a condition of approval of subdivision, pay to the Council the value of one-tenth of the said land or the value of so much of the said one-tenth as is not required by the Council, as the case may be.

14. If, within a portion of the Area the subject of subdivision and development, more than one-tenth of the land is required by the Council for public recreational and road drainage purposes, the owner shall transfer to the Council the land required by it for that purpose and the Council shall pay to the owner by way of compensation the value of the land exceeding the said one-tenth as shall be required by the Council. If the Council and the owner so agree, the Council may transfer to the said owner other land in or near the Area either owned by the Council or acquired by it for that purpose, to compensate him for the land in excess of the said one-tenth required by the Council, in which case the amount payable by the Council to the owner shall be reduced accordingly.

15. The Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any land transferred to or acquired by it for the purposes of public recreation and road drainage purposes other than the areas marked on Plan No. 2 as areas for such purposes, provided that all moneys received by the Council in respect of such sales and all moneys received by the Council under Clause 13 hereof, shall, after making all necessary payments to owners and paying the costs of land (if any) acquired for transfer to owners under Clause 14 hereof, be expended by the Council in the acquisition and improvement of land for public recreational and road drainage purposes in the Area, provided that no moneys received under the Scheme shall be expended on any improvements of such land except where required for road drainage purposes, until the whole of the public recreational and road drainage areas shown on Plan No. 2 have been acquired.

16. Land owned or Acquired by the Council: All or any of the land now owned by or subsequently acquired by the Council within or near the Area may be used by the Council for any purposes appropriate to this Scheme, and if such purpose is one for which an owner is required to make land available or for which land may be acquired by the Council hereunder, the Council shall be compensated for the value of the land so used by the Council.

17. If the Council shall have resumed land for public recreational and road drainage purposes it shall be reimbursed all compensation and costs paid by it from the moneys received by it under Clause 13 hereof, and upon the owner from whom the land was resumed subdividing his land, the value of the one-tenth of his land to be made available for public recreational and road drainage purposes hereunder shall be assessed on the basis that such land had not been resumed.

18. If the Council shall resume land so that it may be used for a specific purpose other than that of public recreational and road drainage purposes,

it may sell or otherwise dispose of such land upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit to any person who shall agree to use the land for that purpose.

19. Zoning: The Council may, upon the completion of the Scheme or progressively as the land within the Area is subdivided and developed, amend its by-laws to provide for the land to be zoned as required for implementation of the Scheme. Until the said by-laws have been amended no person shall use any land within the Area for any purpose other than those permitted by the by-laws of the Council for the type of zone in which land is situated.

20. Change of Zoning: Nothing herein shall prevent the change of the zoning of any of the land within the Area if the usual procedure for change of such zoning be followed.

21. Powers and Authorities of the Council: In carrying out the provisions of this Scheme the Council shall have the following powers and authorities:—

- (a) To enter into agreements with the owners or occupiers of any land within the Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements with purchasers or prospective purchasers or prospective occupiers of land within the Area.
- (c) If any owner of land within the Area does not proceed with the subdivision and development of his land in accordance with the terms of this Scheme and his failure to do so, in the opinion of the Council, will unduly delay the completion of the Scheme, the Council may resume the land of such owner and proceed with the subdivision and development of the said land in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (d) In the event of the Council exercising its powers under Clause (c) it shall have all the powers of an owner in the subdivision development and disposal of the said land, but before selling the land so subdivided and developed it shall offer the new lots to the original owner upon his paying to the Council all costs and expenses consequent upon the resumption, subdivision and development of the said land and upon his releasing the Council from all claims for compensation in respect of such resumption. The said offer shall be made in writing and if not accepted within one calendar month of the service thereof the Council may proceed with the sale of the subdivided lots. All moneys received by it from such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of all costs and expenses consequent upon such subdivision, and secondly in payment of all compensation in respect of the resumption of the said land. The balance, if any, of such moneys may be retained by the Council and the Council shall make good any deficit.
- (e) If the offer mentioned in Clause (d) hereof be not accepted, the Council may retain all or any part of the said land, but if it does so it shall be responsible to pay such costs of subdivision of the said land and compensation for its resumption as are then unpaid.
- (f) The Council may resume any land within the Area for public or local authority purposes, or in order to make it available for a particular use shown in the said plan, in cases where the owner thereof will not agree to make the land available for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of this Scheme.
- (g) The Council may at any time, after giving 28 days' written notice, act in accordance with the provisions of section 10 of the Town Planning and Development Act. Without in any way affecting the remaining provisions of the said section 10 the

Council may recover from the person in default any expenses incurred by it as a simple contract debt in such Court of civil jurisdiction as is competent to deal with the amount of claim involved.

22. Valuations: Where it is necessary to ascertain the value of any land or portion thereof for purposes of this Scheme other than the assessment of compensation, such value shall be assessed by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or such other disinterested and competent valuer as shall be appointed by the Council.

23. Arbitration: Any dispute or difference between the owners as to their respective rights under this Scheme may be referred to the arbitration of a single arbitrator in manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895, or any statutory modification thereof for the time being in force, unless the parties agree upon some other method of determination.

24. Moneys Received by the Council: All moneys received by the Council under the provisions of this Scheme shall be held by the Council and used for the purposes of this Scheme and shall not form part of the general revenue of the Council.

25. Notwithstanding the requirements of the above Scheme that all land acquired be within the area designated on Plan No. 2, where the topography of the land necessitates the provision of drainage sumps for the drainage of roads within the Scheme to be outside the area designated on the said plan, this shall be permissible.
