WHEREAS by subsection (8) of section 21 of the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943-1961, it is provided (*inter alia*) that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation increase or decrease the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker or by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner, as provided

under the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to increase the rate of contribution payable by each mine worker and each owner aforesaid: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that—

on and after the 20th day of June, 1964, but subject to subsection (5) of section 21 of the said Act, the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker shall be eleven shillings per week and by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner two pounds one shilling and threepence per week.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*), by section 59 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963, that the occupier of a factory shall allow to any person employed in the factory a half holiday on any day proclaimed to be a half holiday in the district or

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 22nd day of July, 1964, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 179/64.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- constitute that portion of the Municipal District of the town of Carnarvon more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- assign the name of Carnarvon Fire District to that district; and
- include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Carnarvon Fire District" and in column two opposite that name the name of the local authority, "Municipal District of the town of Carnarvon."

All that portion of land situate within the Municipal District of the town of Carnarvon bounded by lines starting from a point on Point Whitmore situate at the intersection of the low water mark of the Indian Ocean with the right bank of the Gascoyne River and extending generally easterly and generally north-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Carnarvon Suburban Lot 20; thence westerly to the eastern corner of that lot; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern boundaries of Gascoyne Locations 222 (Reserve 24045) and 188 to the south-western corner of location 187; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of that location and location 186 and northerly along the eastern boundary of the lastmentioned location to the south-western corner of location 204; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of that location and locations 205 to 211 inclusive and 185 and 184 and onwards to the southern boundary of location 183; thence south-easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of location 182 to the south-western corner of location 50;

thence south to a northern boundary of location 99; thence generally west-south-westerly and generally south-easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the western boundary of location 8; thence southerly to and along that boundary and the western boundaries of North Location 74, Gascoyne Locations 9, 27 and 32 and onwards to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of Carnarvon Town Lot 566 (Reserve 22753); thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; thence west 71 chains; thence north-westerly to the western extremity of the Carnarvon Jetty and thence north-north-easterly to the starting point. ((Public Plans Carnarvon Townsite (Sheets 1 and 2) and Locations near Carnarvon.)

Land Act, 1933-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 5532/08.

WHEREAS, by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27257 (Fremantle Lot 1538) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Western Australian Fire Brigades Board to be held in trust for the purpose of a Fire Station Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2877/53.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 23839 (Wellington Location 4656) should vest in and be held by the Town of Bunbury in trust for Parking Purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Town of Bunbury in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act, and to the condition that the said reserve shall be made available to the Bunbury Race Club (Incorporated) free of charge and for its exclusive use as a Parking Area, on all days on which the Club conducts race meetings or public racing trials.

(The Order in Council issued under Executive Council Minute No. 2151 dated the 25th November, 1959, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 4169/53.—That Reserve No. 23835 (Ninghan Location 3995) should vest in and be held by The Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia in trust for the purpose of Conservation of Flora and Fauna.

Corres. 1854/59.—That Reserve No. 26415 (Point Samson Lot 97) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Roebourne in trust for the purpose of Caravan Park and Camping.

Corres. 624/64.—That Reserve No. 27256 Wyndham Lots 1076, 1077, 1080, 1081, 1096 and 1100 should vest in and be held by the Minister for Health in trust for the purpose of Housing (Medical Department).

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Forests Act, 1918-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 574/61, L. and S. 2873/61.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 1st day of November, 1961, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown land as State Forest No. 30 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and
Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 605174/64.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:

Metropolitan Water Supply.
Shire of Cockburn.

The construction of a concrete-lined excavated reservoir of approximately twenty-five million gallons capacity, complete with valves and all necessary apparatus, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 9070.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 31st day of July, 1964.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 8 of The Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Gingin Country Water Area as defined in the schedule hereunder, and assign the name of "Gingin Country Water Area" thereto.

Gingin Country Water Area.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of a Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, or acquired for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control and management of a Council, or land comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of a Council, as a public street, and if the council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriage way and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereunder have requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule, which have been acquired or reserved for use as streets within the said Councils be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such lands shall, from the date of this order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 405/64.

WHEREAS the Council of the Town of Albany is desirous, under the by-law making power conferred by section 193 of the Local Government Act, 1960, of making by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in the sea adjoining though outside its district for a distance of two hundred (200) yards from low water mark at ordinary spring tides; and whereas it is enacted by subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of that section that such by-laws may be made only pursuant to an order made under subsection (8) of section 190 of the Act; and whereas it is enacted by the subsection last mentioned that where, in the opinion of the Governor, a by-law making power conferred by the Act on a Council should be extended to an area which is outside the district, the Governor may by order declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the power the area is to be regarded as being within the district and that the Council may exercise the power in respect of the area as if in fact it were within the district; and whereas the Lieutenant-Governor is of the opinion that the said by-law making power should be extended to the said area outside the district of the said Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, pursuant to the powers conferred by subsection (8) of section 190 of the Local Government Act, 1960, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that for the purpose of the exercise of the said by-law making power an area which is outside the district of the Town of Albany, namely, the area which adjoins that district and extends for a distance of two hundred (200) yards seaward from low water mark at ordinary spring tides is to be regarded as being within the district of the Town of Albany, and that the Council of the Town of Albany may make by-laws for regulating public bathing and the costumes of bathers and the conduct of bathers and others in respect of that area as if in fact it were within the municipal district of the Town of Albany.

Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 14 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, classify explosives and declare any specified explosive to be an authorised explosive for the purposes of that Act and that the Governor shall not so classify or declare any explosive until he has defined the composition, quality and character of that explosive; but such definition in respect of the explosive is not required to be published in the Order in Council classifying that explosive; and whereas the Governor having, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder, defined the composition, quality and character of the explosives specified in the Schedule hereunder, it is deemed expedient that those explosives be declared to be authorised explosives for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, do hereby declare the explosives specified in the schedule hereunder to be authorised explosives for the purposes of the said Act, with effect from and including the day of the publication of notice of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*.

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954-1958.

NOTICE is hereby given that all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Perenjori are required to prepare firebreaks and remove inflammable materials, as set out below, on or before 15th October, 1964.
