Closure to River Traffic of Navigational Arches—
Old Fremantle Railway Bridge.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Southern Navigational Arch of the old Fremantle Railway Bridge will be closed from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on 1st October, 1964.

The northern navigational arch will be similarly closed from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 2nd October, 1964

On the above dates the Fremantle Harbour Trust floating crane "Pelican" will be removing the steel spans and the archways, and all craft are to be navigated with caution in this area.

The times and dates may be amended due to inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances. Therefore, all craft navigating in this area on or about the abovementioned dates are to proceed with caution.
