the Commonwealth for the time being in force for the regulation of Parliamentary elections as the places at which such election shall be held.

Land Act, 1933-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3894/14, Vol. 2.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act, shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27307 (Corrigin Lot 422) should, subject as afore-said, be granted in fee simple to the Corrigin Golf Club Inc., to be held in trust for the purpose of a Site for Golf Club Premises: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Land Act, 1933-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3894/14, Vol. 2.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 15804 at Corrigin should vest in and Reserve No. 19804 at Corrigin should vest in and be held by the Shire of Corrigin in trust for the purpose of Racecourse, Recreation and Show-ground: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Corrigin in trust for Racecourse, Recreation and Showground with power to the said Shire of Corrigin, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first ob-tained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1. Subiaco Extension.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 60803/61.

WHEREAS by section 7 (a) of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, or of any District, or Metropolitan Main Drainage District; and whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as at present defined should be extended: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Gov-ernor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby order and declare as follows:—

That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 be and are hereby extended by including therein the land described in the Schedule hereto.
