AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 28th day of October, 1964, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1964, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Minister, by Order in Council, divide any dairy area into districts, define the boundaries of a district, alter the boundaries of a district, and subdivide any district into two or more districts; and whereas by an Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, and published in the Government Gazette on the 24th April, 1947, the Governor did, inter alia, divide the Metropolitan Dairy Area, constituted and declared by that Order in Council, into the districts specified and defined in the Second Schedule thereto; and whereas the Leederville, Inglewood and Osborne Park Districts are districts so specified and Osborne Park Districts are districts so specified and defined and it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of those districts and to subdivide into several districts the Osborne Park District as amended by such alteration of boundaries: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 9 of the said Act—

(a) alter the boundaries of the Osborne Park District by substituting for the area of land being portions of the Perth Road District specified in the Second Schedule to the abovementioned Order in Council as defining that district, the area of land defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;

- (b) alter the boundaries of each of the Leederville and Inglewood Districts by excising from the areas of land comprising those respective districts as defined in the Second Schedule to the abovementioned Order in Council, so much of the land of each respective district as is included in the area of land comprising the Osborne Park District as defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council; and
- (c) subdivide the Osborne Park District as defined and described in Schedule "A" to this Order in Council into the districts specified and defined in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council.

Schedule "A."

Amendment and Redescription of Osborne Park District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Beach Road and extending generally easterly to and along that side to the western side of Wanneroo Road; thence easterly to and along the northern side of a one-chain road nessing along the northern boundaries of road passing along the northern boundaries of lots 385, 399 and 400 of Swan Location 1315 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4617 and lots 8, 43, 50, 78 and 85 of location I as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4948 and onwards to the eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of lots 85 aforesaid, 84, 83 and 82 of locations I aforesaid and K; thence generally southerly along that side and the eastern side of Uganda Street to the southern side of Truganina Road; thence easterly along that side to the western side of Malaga Road; thence southerly along that side to the northern side of Widgee Road;

thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western side of Bunya Street; thence southerly to and along that side and onwards to the centre-line of Wonga Road; thence westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Light Street; thence north-westerly and westerly along that centre-north-westerly and westerly along that centrenorth-westerly and westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-east-erly of the centre-line of Edgeware Road; thence south-westerly to and along that centre-line to south-westerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre-line of The Strand; thence north-westerly along that prolongation to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence northerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Ravenswood Drive; thence westerly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Street; thence westerly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Flinders Street; thence generally southerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Wiluna Street; thence generally south-westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the western alignment of Charles Street; thence south-easterly along that alignment to the southern alignment of Green Street; thence south-westerly and westerly along that alignment to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road; thence south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western side of Birrell Street; thence southerly to and along that side to the northern alignment of Milton Street; thence westerly along that alignment to the eastern alignment of Brady Street; thence southerly along that alignment to the southern side of Purslowe Street; thence generally easterly along that side to the western side of Lynton Street; thence southerly along that side and onwards to the south-western side of Anzac Road; thence north-westerly along that side to the western side of Lake Monger Drive; thence generally north westerly and the south westerly along that side and onally north-westerly, generally south-westerly and generally southerly along western, southern and eastern sides of that drive to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Dodd Street; thence westerly to and along that side and onwards to the centre-line of Selby Street; thence southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Cromarty Road; thence westerly to and along that side and onwards to the western side of Empire Avenue, thence western side of Empire Avenue; thence northerly, generally north-westerly and westerly along that side and a southern side of that avenue to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern alignment of Brompton Road; thence northerly along that alignment to the northern side of Peasholm Street; thence generally north-westerly, and westerly along that side and onwards to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along that mark to the starting point.

The Districts of Leederville and Inglewood are hereby amended.

Schedule "B."

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Widgee Road with the prolongation northerly of the western side of Bunya Street and extending southerly along the lastmentioned side and onwards to the centre-line of Wonga Road; thence westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Light Street; thence north-westerly and westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the centre-line of Edgeware Road; thence south-westerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre-line of The Strand; thence north-westerly along that prolongation to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence northerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Widgee Road; thence easterly to and along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 2 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the southern side of Truganina Road with the western side of Malaga Road and extending southerly along the lastmentioned side to the northern side of Widgee Road; thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western side of Bunya Street; thence southerly along that prolongation to the centre-line of Widgee Road aforesaid; thence westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence northerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Victoria Road; thence easterly along that centre-line to the eastern side of Uganda Street; thence southerly along that side to the southern side of Truganina Road aforesaid, and thence easterly along that side to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 3 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Victoria Road with the prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue and extending northerly along that prolongation to the centre-line of Camberwell Road; thence easterly along that centre-line to the eastern side of Uganda Street; thence generally southerly along that side to the centre-line of Victoria Road aforesaid, and thence westerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 4 District.

Ail that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Camberwell Road with the centre-line of a one-chain road passing along the western boundaries of lots 31 to 78 inclusive of Swan Locations I and K as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4948 and extending northerly along the lastmentioned centre-line to the northern side of a one-chain road passing along the northern boundaries of lots 78 aforesaid and 85; thence easterly along that side and onwards to the eastern side of a one-chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of lots 85 aforesaid to 82; thence generally southerly along that side to the centre-line of Camberwell Road aforesaid, and thence westerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 5 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Camberwell Road with the centre-line of Wanneroo Road and extending generally north-westerly and generally north-easterly along the lastmentioned centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of a one-chain road passing along the northern boundaries of lots 385, 399 and 400 of Swan Location 1315 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4617 and the northern boundaries of lots 8, 43 and 50 of location I as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 4948; thence easterly to and along that side to the centre-line of a one-chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of lots 50 aforesaid to 47 of Locations I aforesaid and K; thence southerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Camberwell Road aforesaid and thence westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 6 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Victoria Road with the centre-line of Wanneroo Road and extending generally north-westerly along the lastmentioned centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Camberwell Road; thence easterly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence southerly along that prolongation to the centre-line of Victoria Road aforesaid and thence westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 7 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Victoria Road and extending easterly to and along the lastmentioned centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Mirrabooka Avenue; thence southerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Ravenswood Drive; thence westerly and generally south-westerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 8 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation south-westerly of the centre-line of Ravenswood Drive and extending generally north-easterly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Flinders Street; thence generally southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Milner Street; thence generally westerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 9 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Milner Street and extending generally easterly to and along the lastmentioned centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Flinders Street; thence southerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Wiluna Street; thence generally south-westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Charles Street; thence north-westerly along that centre-line and generally north-westerly along that centre-line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 10 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the western alignment of Charles Street with the southern alignment of Green Street and extending south-westerly and westerly along that alignment of Green Street to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road; thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Main Street; thence northerly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Hector Street; thence easterly along that centre-line passing through Swan Location 7127 (Reserve 22595) to the centre-line of Wanneroo Road; thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the centre-line of Wiluna Street; thence south-westerly along that prolongation to the western alignment of Charles Street aforesaid and thence south-easterly along that alignment to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 11 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Wanneroo Road with the centre-line of Hector Street and extending Westerly along the centre-line of Hector Street aforesaid passing through Swan Location 7127 (Reserve 22595) to the centre-line of Main Street; thence northerly along that centre-line to the centre-line of North Beach Road; thence easterly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 12 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Wanneroo Road with the prolongation easterly of the centre-line of North Beach Road and extending

westerly to and along the lastmentioned centreline to the centre-line of Main Street; thence northerly and north-easterly along that centreline and onwards to the centre-line of Wanneroo Road aforesaid and thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 13 Discrict.

All that portion of land bounded Ly lines starting from the intersection of the centraline of Main Street with the centraline of Amelia Street and extending westerly along the lastmentioned centraline and onwards to the centraline of Odin Road; thence generally north-easterly along that centraline and onwards to the centraline of Balcatta Road; thence generally easterly along that centraline and onwards to the centraline of Wanneroo Road; thence generally south-easterly along that centraline to a point situate in prolongation northeasterly of the centraline of Main Street aforesaid, and thence south-westerly and southerly to and along that centraline to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 14 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Main Street with the centre-line of North Beach Road and extending westerly along the lastmentioned centre-line and westerly along the lastmentioned the centre-line of George Street and onwards to the south-western side of Hertha Street; thence generally north-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Hugo Street; thence northerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of North Beach Road aforesaid; thence westerly and north-westerly along that centre-line to the centre-line of Odin Road; thence northeasterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Amelia Street; thence easterly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Main Street aforesaid, and thence southerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 15 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of North Beach Road with the centre-line of Main Street and extending southerly along the lastmentioned centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road; thence generally southeasterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western side of Birrell Street; thence southerly to and along that side to the northern alignment of Milton Street; thence westerly along that alignment to the eastern alignment of Brady Street; thence southerly along that alignment to the southern side of Purslowe Street; thence generally easterly along that side to the western side of Lynton Street; thence southerly along that side and onwards to the south-western side of Anzac Road; thence northwesterly along that side to the western side of Lake Monger Drive; thence generally north-westerly, generally south-westerly and generally southerly along western, southern and eastern sides of that drive to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Dodd Street; thence westerly to and along that side to the western alignment of Harbourne Street; thence generally northerly along that alignment to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road; thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the northwestern side of King Edward Road; thence northeasterly to and along that side to the western side of Hertha Street; thence generally northwesterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the centre-line of George Street and thence north-easterly and easterly to and along that centre-line and the centre-line of North Beach Road aforesaid to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 16 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the eastern alignment of Brompton Road with the centre-line of Hale Road and extending easterly, generally south-easterly and again easterly along that centre-line and onwards to the eastern side of Pearson Street; thence generally southerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Cromarty Road; thence westerly to and along that side and onwards to the western side of Empire Avenue; thence northerly, generally north-westerly and westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern alignment of Brompton Road aforesaid and thence northerly along that alignment to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 17 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the high water mark of the Indian Ocean with the prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road and extending generally easterly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Hancock Street; thence southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of The Arcade; thence generally south-easterly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of St. Brigids Terrace; thence westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Lynton Street; thence southerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Ewen Street; thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Queenscliffe Road; thence southerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Hale Road; thence generally north-westerly and westerly along that centre-line to the eastern alignment of Brompton Road; thence northerly along that alignment to the northern side of Peasholm Street; thence north-westerly, generally northerly and westerly along that side and onwards to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along that mark to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 18 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the western alignment of Harbourne Street with the northern side of Dodd Street and extending westerly along that side and onwards to the centre-line of Selby Street; thence southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern side of Cromarty Road; thence westerly along that prolongation to the eastern side of Pearson Street; thence generally northerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centreline of Hale Road; thence westerly and generally north-westerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Queenscliffe Road; thence northerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Ewen Street; thence generally northwesterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of Lynton Street; thence northerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of St. Brigids Terrace; thence easterly along that centreline to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the centre-line of The Australian southerly. of the centre-line of The Arcade; thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Hancock Street; thence northerly along that centre-line to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road; thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to the western alignment of Harbourne Street, and thence generally southerly along that alignment to the starting point.

Osborne Part No. 19 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road with the centre-line of Huntriss Road and extending northerly along the lastmentioned centre-line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Killarney Road; thence generally easterly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of North Beach Road; thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the centre-line of Hugo Street; thence

southerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the south-western side of Hertha Street; thence generally south-easterly along that side to the north-western side of King Edward Road; thence south-westerly along that side and onwards to the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road aforesaid and thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 20 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Huntriss Road with the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road and extending generally north-westerly and westerly along the lastmentioned centreline to the centre-line of Deanmore Road; thence northerly along that centre-line to the centre-line of Newborough Street; thence generally easterly along that centre-line and onwards to the centreline of Huntriss Road aforesaid, and thence southerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 21 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the centre-line of Deanmore Road with the centre-line of Scarborough Beach Road and extending generally westerly along the lastmentioned centre-line and onwards to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean; thence generally northerly along that high water mark to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the centre-line of Bournemouth Parade; thence generally easterly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of West Coast Highway; thence generally north-westerly and generally north-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre-line of Jeanes Road; thence generally easterly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Karrinyup Road; thence generally north-westerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the centre-line of Burroughs Road; thence north-easterly and northerly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Kathleen Street as shown to the centre-line of Kathleen Street as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 8230; thence northeasterly and easterly along that centre-line and onwards to and along the centre-lines of North Beach Road and Bryan Road and again onwards to the centre-line of Odin Road; thence southwesterly along that centre-line to a point situate in the centre line of Villes. in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Killarney Road; thence generally westerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Huntriss Road; thence southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Newborough Street; thence westerly to and along that centre-line to the centre-line of Deanmore Road and thence southerly along that centre-line to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 22 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the prolongation easterly of the northern side of Beach Road with the centre-line of Wanneroo Road and extending generally southerly along the lastmentioned centre-line to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the centre-line of Balcatta Road; thence generally westerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the centre-line of Odin Road; thence south-easterly and generally south-westerly to and along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Bryan Road; thence westerly to and along that centre-line and the centre-line of North Beach Road to the eastern boundary of lot 8 of Swan Location At as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 20677; thence westerly to and along the centre-line of Kathleer Street and onwards to the centre-line of a one-chain road passing along the western boundary of location 92; thence northerly along that centre-line and northerly and easterly along the centre-line of road number 4769 and onwards to the centre-line of Okely Road; thence northerly along that centre-line of Okely Road; thence northerly along that centre-line of okely Road; thence northerly along that side to the starting point.

Osborne Park No. 23 District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Beach Road and extending generally easterly to and along that side to the centre-line of Okely Road; thence southerly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of road number 4769; thence westerly and southerly to and along that centre-line and southerly along the centre-line of a one-chain road passing along the western boundary of Swan Location 92 to a line situate 50 links south of and parallel to the southern boundary of that location; thence easterly along that line to the centre-line of Kathleen Street; thence south-westerly along that centre-line as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 8230 to the centre-line of Burroughs Road; thence generally south-westerly along that centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of Karrinyup Road; thence generally south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the centre-line of Jeanes Road; thence south-westerly and generally westerly to and along that

centre-line and onwards to the centre-line of West Coast Highway; thence generally south-westerly and generally south-easterly along that centre-line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the centre-line of Bournemouth Parade; thence generally westerly to and along that centre-line and onwards to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid, and thence generally northerly along that mark to the starting point.




