Eastern Goldfields; Kalgoorlie; the fourth Tuesday in February, the third Tuesday in May, the second Tuesday in August, and the third Tuesday in November.

Geraldton; Geraldton; the third Tuesday in February, the first Tuesday in May, August and November.

Southern; Albany; the third Tuesday in March and June, the second Tuesday in September, and the first Tuesday in December.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth this 28th day of October, 1964, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Port Hedland more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name of "Port Hedland Fire District" to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Port Hedland Fire District" and in column two opposite that name the name of the local authority, "Municipal District of the Shire of Port Hedland."

Schedule.

Port Hedland Fire District.

All that portion of land situate within the Municipal District of the Shire of Port Hedland bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation north-westerly of the north-eastern boundary of Forrest Location 27 and extending south-easterly and south-westerly to and along boundaries of that location to its southern corner; thence south-westerly to the south-eastern corner of location 1; thence south-westerly to the south-eastern corner of location 25; thence generally north-westerly along south-western boundaries of that location and leases 332/1192 and 332/1211 to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned lease; thence north-westerly to the south-eastern corner of Port Hedland Town Lot 453; thence generally westerly along southern boundaries of that lot and lots 342 and 363 to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence south-westerly to the north-eastern corner of lot 234; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that lot and onwards to the high water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally westerly, generally northerly and generally easterly along that high water mark to the starting point. (Public plans Port Hedland 4 Mile, and Port Hedland 4 Chain, Sheets 1 and 2.)

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1963, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Donnybrook more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name of "Donnybrook Fire District" to that district; and

- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Donnybrook Fire District" and in column two opposite that name the name of the local authority. "Municipal District of the Shire of Donnybrook".

Schedule.

Donnybrook Fire District.

All that portion of land situate within the Municipal District of the Shire of Donnybrook bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the western side of Brazier Street with the northern side of Hamilton Street and extending easterly along the lastmentioned side to the eastern side of Fowler Street; thence southerly along that side and onwards to the left bank of the Preston River; thence generally south-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of lot 1 of Wellington Location 190 and 242, as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2170; thence easterly to and along that boundary and northern boundaries of lots 9, 10, 19, 20, 29, 30, 39, 40, 49 and 50 and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 242 aforesaid; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 231; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of portion of location 455 as shown on Certificate of Title Volume 1083, folio 475; thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the left bank of the Preston River aforesaid; thence generally south-easterly and generally north-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the western boundary of Preston Agricultural Area Lot 32; thence southerly to and along that boundary and western boundaries of lots 297 and 31 to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence westerly along northern boundaries of lots 251 and 28, the northern side of Campbell Road, northern boundaries of locations 2718 and Reserve 7457, the southern boundary of location 658 and the northern boundary of location 671 and onwards to the prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 2912; thence northerly along that prolongation to the south-eastern boundary of location 3205; thence north-easterly, north-westerly and south-westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 2912 aforesaid; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the southern boundary of Donnybrook Town lot 460; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that lot to its north-western corner; thence easterly along the prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of lot 425 to the western side of Chapman Street; thence northerly along that side and the western boundaries of lots 446 and 151 and onwards to the left bank of the Preston River aforesaid; thence generally north-westerly downwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of lot 426 and thence northerly to and along that boundary and the western side of Brazier Street to the starting point. (Public Plan Donnybrook Townsite.)

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 5807/13.—That Reserve No. 15207 (Geraldton Lot 982) should vest in and be held by the Town of Geraldton in trust for the purpose of Conservation of Flora and Fauna.

Corres. 491/47.—That Reserve No. 23559 (Kulin Lots 174 and 225) should vest in and be held by the Kulin Shire Council in trust for the purpose of Municipal Purposes (Plant Depot).

(The Order in Council issued under Executive Council Minute 1243 dated 25th July, 1952, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 2952/64.—That Reserve No. 27312 (Geraldton Lots 1185 and 1186) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Mines in trust for the purpose of Explosives.

Corres. 3255/62.—That Reserve No. 27313 (Halls Creek Lots 158 and 159) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of Native Housing.

Corres. 1331/61.—That Reserve No. 27314 (Bodal-lin Lot 40) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Yilgarn in trust for the purpose of Hallsite, Recreation and Parking.

Corres. 1295/60.—That Reserve No. 27318 at Esperance should vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance in trust for the purpose of Camping and Recreation.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27317 at Geraldton should vest in and be held by the Town of Geraldton in trust for the purpose of Caravan Park and Parking; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Town of Geraldton in trust for Caravan Park and Parking with power to the said Town of Geraldton, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Gnowangerup Sewerage Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 989/64.

WHEREAS by section 4 (a) of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1956, the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute any part or parts of the State outside the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area as constituted and defined by the Act No. 43 of 1909 as a Sewerage Area; and whereas, by section 4 (b) of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1956, the Governor may, by Order in Council constitute sewerage districts under such names as may be directed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute that part of the State defined in Schedule "A" hereunder a sewerage area and assign the name of "Gnowangerup Sewerage Area" thereto and also doth hereby divide the Exmouth Sewerage Area into two sewerage districts, namely:—

(a) No. 1 Gnowangerup District;

(b) No. 2 Gnowangerup District;
defined in Schedule "B" hereunder.

Schedule "A."

Gnowangerup Sewerage Area.

All that portion of land contained within a circle having a radius of five miles with its centre situate within the Gnowangerup Townsite at the northern corner of Town Lot 33, being Government Reserve No. 5246, as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 41359.

Schedule "B."

Gnowangerup Sewerage Districts.

Gnowangerup No. 1 Sewerage District.

SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1960.

RULE OF COURT.

(Sittings and Winter Vacation for 1965.)

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Asher Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Sir Lawrence Walter Jackson, Kt., Senior Puisne Judge, and the Honourable John Evenden Virtue, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, the Honourable John Hale, and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges, being a majority of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1960, and the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—
