AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 11th day of November, 1964, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

## Child Welfare Act, 1947-1962. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, by section 19 of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1962, it is provided (inter alia) that the Governor may, by Order in Council—

(a) establish special courts to be called Children's Courts and determine the area in and for which each court shall exercise jurisdiction, by reference to magisterial districts:

(b) appoint, as special magistrates, magis-trates or persons who may from time to time, temporarily or otherwise, be assigned to or occupying the office or per-forming the duties of a magistrate forming the duties of a magistrate assigned to one or more magisterial districts; and

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(c) appoint such persons, male or female, as he thinks fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the abovementioned provisions of the said Act and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth-

- (a) establish a special court to be called a Children's Court at Exmouth, to exercise jurisdiction in and for the area known as the Gascoyne Magisterial District; and
- (b) appoint-
  - (i) Charles Alexander Fisher, Stipendiary Magistrate, Carnarvon, to be a special magistrate for; and
  - (ii) Murray Campbell Broad of Yardie Creek Station via Carnarvon, Robert Murdock Gedling and Kenneth Harding Murdock, both of Exmouth:

to be members of the Children's Court at Exmouth.

# Forests Act, 1918-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 958/60, Lands 4063/58.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:-

(a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation. (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 12th day of October, 1960, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 21 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.
