PROCLAMATION.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, DOUGLAS ANTHONY KENDREW, Governor.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section (2) of the Offenders Probation and Parole Act, 1963, that the Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation, and that it shall not be fixed by Proclamation, and that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole Act shall come into operation on one day, but the several Parts and sections of the Act may be proclaimed to come into operation on such days as are respectively fixed by proclamation; and whereas it now appears to me desirable and expedient that Part II of the said Act shall come into operation: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 1st day of January, 1965, as the day on which Part II of the Offenders Probation and Parole Act, 1963 shall come into operation.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of three years as from 3rd December, 1964.

Schedule.

All that area of water bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the northern side of the Denison Townsite Jetty and the shore of the Indian Ocean and extending generally north-easterly and north along the foreshore to the mouth of the Irwin River; thence west for a distance of 20 chains; thence generally south and south-westerly parallel to the shoreline to a point 20 chains west of the intersection of the northern side of the Denison Townsite Jetty and the shore of the Indian Ocean; thence east to the starting point. (Public Plans Denison Townsite and 124B/40.)

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1962, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto from 1st January, 1965, to 31st December. 1969, both dates inclusive.

Schedule.

- The whole of the waters of the King River (Albany), including its tributaries, north of a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a point on the western foreshore of Oyster Harbour 25 chains south from the southern extremity of the Lower King River Bridge to a point on the northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains east of the northern extremity of the said bridge.
- All that portion of Oyster Harbour and the Kalgan River and its tributaries lying north of a line starting at a post situate at the junction of the northern shore of the said Oyster Harbour and the right bank of the said Kalgan River and extending south-westerly for a distance of about 23 chains to a spit post marking the edge of the channel and thence southerly to the westernmost extremity of Swan Point. (Public Plan 451C/40.)
- The waters of the Channel Entrance between King George's Sound and Oyster Harbour (Albany), downwards from a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains north of Emu Point to a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains south of Emu Point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 570/60.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960; that the Governor may by Order in Council, alter or extend the boundaries of a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Greenbushes Country Water Area to include the area as defined in the schedules hereunder, and assign the name of "Greenbushes Country Water Area" thereto.

Shire of Kulin.

Alteration of Wards and Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 246/63.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraphs (g), (h) and (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor, upon the effective presentation of a petition, may alter the boundaries of wards existing in a district, create new wards in a district, and within the limits prescribed by the Act, determine and alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to a a municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 12 of the said Act, that the Governor may give such directions as he thinks necessary in order to give effect to an alteration in the number of wards; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act, that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12, he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power, shall go out of office and when, and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election of such members so affected, as the case requires, and may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the Council of a municipality so affected; and whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Kulin, acting on behalf of the Municipality, has presented a petition praying that the boundaries of the East, Kulin Rock, Jitarning and Dudinin Wards be altered, and that a new ward be created by dividing the East Ward into two separate Wards to be known as the Central and East Wards respectively, and further praying that the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the Municipality shall be increased from seven to eight; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby—

(a) alter the boundaries of the East, Kulin Rock, Jitarning and Dudinin Wards and create a new ward to be known as the Central Ward, by the division of the existing East Ward, to the intent and purpose

- that the wards of the district shall thereafter be as set forth in the schedule hereto;
- (b) alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the Municipality of the Shire of Kulin from seven Councillors to eight, and direct that the Councillors shall be assigned to the respective wards as follows:—

Central Ward: Two Councillors.
Dudinin Ward: One Councillor.
East Ward: Two Councillors.
Jitarning Ward: One Councillor.
Kulin Rock Ward: One Councillor.
Town Ward: One Councillor;

- (c) direct that the existing members for the East Ward shall retire from office on the 22nd day of May, 1965, and to further direct that an election shall be held on that day to return two members for the East Ward and two members for the Central Ward;
- (d) direct that, until the 22nd day of May, 1965, the existing members of the East Ward shall continue to represent both the new East Ward and the Central Ward.
