IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950-1954, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

- (1) That the period from six o'clock in the afternoon of the 19th December, 1964, to the 30th April, 1965, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks

defined in the Third Schedule hereto in that part of the State which lies within the boundaries of the shires specified in the First Schedule hereto, with the exception of those areas defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (2) That from five o'clock in the forenoon of the 20th December, 1964, to the 30th April, 1965, shall be an open season in respect of those species of wild ducks defined in the Third Schedule hereto in those parts of the State which lie within the boundaries of the South-West and Eucla Divisions as defined in section 28 of the Land Act, 1933, with the exceptions of those areas defined in the First and Second Schedules hereto.
- (3) That a person shall not take any wild duck or the egg of any wild duck for the purpose of keeping it in captivity, or for the purpose of aviculture, or for the purpose of sale.
- (4) That a person shall not sell any wild duck.
- (5) That a person shall not take any wild duck by any means other than a shotgun, provided that this restriction shall not prohibit a person who is a native, within the meaning of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, from using any native artifact in the taking of wild ducks.

- (i) The whole of the area within a radius of one and one-half miles from the Post Office at Balingup.

## Busselton Shire.

- (j) The whole of the waters of Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (k) The whole of the waters of the Vasse River and all land within 20 chains of its banks.
- (l) The whole of reserves 3872 and 3876 (Public Utilities) in the Broadwater.

## Capel Shire.

- (m) All that portion of the Capel River between the Capel and Stirling bridges and all land within 20 chains of the river's bank.

## Dandaragan Shire.

- (n) The whole of Caro Swamp and all land within 80 chains of its shores.

## Dumbleyung Shire.

- (o) The whole of the waters of Dumbleyung Lake and all land and waters within three miles of its shores.

## Gingin Shire.

- (p) The whole of the waters of Lakes Nambung, Bambun and Mungala and all land within 20 chains of their shores.
- (q) The whole of Swan Location 2340 including Wallering Swamp.

## Gnowangerup Shire.

- (r) The whole of the land and waters contained within reserves 21646, 21647, 22353 and 22355 and all the waters of the Beaufort and Wellstead Estuaries adjoining those reserves.

## Harvey Shire.

- (s) All those waters of the Leschenault Inlet extending southwards from a line drawn south-east from Waterloo Head (Belvedere), on the west foreshore to a point on the opposite foreshore and all land within 20 chains of the included foreshores.
- (t) The whole of the Harvey Catchment area.

## Mandurah Shire.

- (u) The whole of the area within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.

## Mundaring Shire.

- (v) The whole of the waters of Lake Leschenaultia and all the land within 20 chains of its shores.

## Murray Shire.

- (w) All that portion of the Serpentine River from road 8629 at the southern end of Goegrup (Willies) Lake to Peel Inlet near the Old Mill and all the land within 20 chains of the river banks.

## Rockingham Shire.

- (x) The whole of the Shire of Rockingham.

## Toodyay Shire.

- (y) All that portion of the Avon River in the Toodyay District, between the northern boundary of Avon Location 3 and a point opposite road number 2069, and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.
- (z) All that portion of the Avon River from Dumbarton Bridge to the Railway Bridge, north of Toodyay and all land within 20 chains of the river banks.

## Upper Blackwood.

- (aa) The whole of the area within a radius of 2½ miles of the Post Office at Boyup Brook.

## Watheroo Shire.

- (ab) The whole of the Yanchep Caves Reserve.

## Wickepin Shire.

- (ac) The whole of the waters of Lake Yealering and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

## Woodanilling Shire.

- (ad) The whole of the waters of Wardering Lake and all land within 20 chains of its shores.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, that a native institution means (*inter alia*) an institution for the benefit or care of the native inhabitants of the State declared by proclamation to be a native institution for the purposes of that Act; and whereas the institution incorporated under the provisions of the Associations

Incorporation Act, 1895-1962, by the name "Allawah Grove Administration Incorporated" is an institution for the benefit or care of such native inhabitants; and whereas it is deemed expedient that such institution be so declared to be a native institution for the purposes of the said Native Welfare Act, 1963: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby declare that the institution so incorporated by the name "Allawah Grove Administration Incorporated" shall be a native institution for the purposes of that Act.

Land Act, 1933-1963.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2589/64.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27346 (Melbourne Location 3918) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Moora in trust for the purpose of Stock Sale Yards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Moora in trust for Stock Sale Yards with power to the said Shire of Moora, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

**BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954-1964.**

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board,  
West Perth, 10th December, 1964.

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Minister administering the Bush Fires Act has suspended from the 11th January, 1965, to the 31st January, 1965, both dates inclusive, the operation of all declarations prohibiting the burning of bush in the Shire of Esperance so far as the declarations relate to the burning of pasture, grass or stubble. Any burning carried out under the terms of this suspension is to be subject to the following conditions:—

- (9) The owner or occupier of the land on which an area is to be burnt shall himself arrange for and provide at least four men to be constantly in attendance at the fire from the time it is lit until it is completely extinguished to assist in keeping the fire under control and to prevent it from spreading beyond the area proposed to be burnt.
