WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the State: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer as from the date of my departure upon the said absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute

for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 3 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation or otherwise from time Governor by Proclamation or otherwise from time to time to prorogue the Legislative Council and to dissolve the Legislative Assembly whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Legislative Council shall stand prorogued as from the 1st day of January, 1965, until further Proclamation, and that the Legislative Assembly shall be dissolved as from that date.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in heads of departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board) should be vested in Kenneth Campbell Webster: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Kenneth Campbell Webster the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

Bunbury Water Board—Proposed Loan of £32,000.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 317/53.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, a Water Board may with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, of the Bunbury Water Board borrowing the sum of thirty two thousand pounds (£32,000) from the Commonwealth Savings Bank, repayable with interest by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments over a period of fifteen (15) years, with interest at the rate of five pounds two shillings six pence (£5 2s. 6d.) per annum for the purpose of financing the works referred to at Bunbury Water Board Plan No. 135, and approved by Order in Council on 19th November, 1964, and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th November, 1964, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the first day of July, 1965.
