WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1964, that the Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Local Government Act Amendment Act, 1964, shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1965.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth this 6th day of January, 1965, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1932-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 6924/19.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality or other person or persons as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof,

and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 18779 for the purpose of Public Utility near Albany should be placed under the control of the Shire of Albany as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Shire of Albany as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Land Act, 1933-1963.

Corres. 828/59.—That Reserve No. 25511 (Canning Locations 1733 and 1734) should vest in and be held by the Town of Melville in trust for the purpose of Recreation (excluding use of the land for Public Camping and Caravan Park).

Corres. 3401/61.—That Reserve No. 26555 (Sussex Location 4348) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Busselton in trust for the purpose of Recreation (excluding use of the land for Public Camping and Caravan Park).

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and
Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 687588/64.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend water works, sewerage works and metropolitan main drainage works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.

City of South Perth.

The construction of nine-inch and six-inch diameter pipe sewers with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 9150.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 15th day of January, 1965.

Act, 1912-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, it is provided, *inter alia*, that all water works, sewerage, drainage and irrigation works constructed by the Government and declared by the Governor to be subject to any of the Acts mentioned in the schedule to that Act shall vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage on behalf of Her Majesty unless and until those works

are vested in a board; and whereas the Government by the Honourable Minister for Works has constructed a pump station, service tank, and reticulation works, being Jerramungup Water Supply in the Jerramungup Country Water Area on the land delineated on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 41305 and thereon shown in green; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 4th July, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th July, 1962, the Jerramungup Country Water Area was constituted a Country Water Area under the name or designation "Jerramungup Country Water Area"; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the water works constructed as hereinbefore mentioned be declared to be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and acting in pursuance of section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the water works being Jerramungup Town Water Supply constructed by the Government in the Jerramungup Country Water Area on the land delineated on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 41305 and thereon shown in green to be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, being an Act mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950.
