WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*) by section 18 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor may by Proclamation declare any part of the State lying north of the twenty-sixth parallel of south latitude, named or defined in the Proclamation, to be a proclaimed area for the purposes of that section; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, expedient that the part of the State hereinaftermentioned ought to be proclaimed for the purposes of that section: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, do hereby declare all that part of the State lying between the parallels of twenty degrees and twenty-four degrees south latitude and between the meridian of one hundred and twenty-one degrees, thirty minutes east longitude and the Indian Ocean to be a proclaimed area for the purposes of section 18 aforesaid.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth, this 4th day of February, 1965, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

#### Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1962.

##### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 43B of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1910-1962, that the Governor may by order amend (*inter alia*) the Tenth Schedule to the Act by deletion, addition or other alteration: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 43B of the said Act, doth hereby amend the Tenth Schedule to the Act as follows:—

- (a) By adding to that Schedule the items:  
Adrenaline, natural or synthetic, its salts and derivatives, including Isoprenaline and Orciprenaline and their salts.  
Amtriptyline; and
- (b) by adding after paragraph (d) of the item, "Preparations", in that Schedule, the following paragraph:—
- (c) Preparations, other than metered aerosol sprays containing adrenaline, natural or synthetic, its derivatives or their salts, in concentrations of not more than 1.0 per cent. of the base.

#### Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

##### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the

preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply.

Shire of Swan-Guildford.

M.W.S. 825836/64.

The construction of 12-inch, eight-inch, six-inch and four-inch diameter main in Great Northern Highway, complete with valves and all necessary apparatus, as shown in red on plan M.W.S.S. & D.B., W.A. No. 9180.

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

Shires of Gosnells and Kalamunda.

(a) Woodlupine Brook Diversion.

(b) Binley Brook Diversion.

M.W.S. 488341/64.

Deviation, construction and improvement of open channel drains approximately 6,500 feet in length between St. John Road and Elizabeth Street and between the South Western Railway and Ladywell Street, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.B., W.A. No. 9163.

Metropolitan Sewerage.

Town of Mosman Park.

M.W.S. 678917/64.

Construction of six-inch and four-inch diameter pipe sewers with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in green on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.B., W.A. No. 9167.

Metropolitan Water Supply.

City of Perth.

M.W.S. 846847/64.

The construction of an eight-inch diameter water main, approximately 1,270 feet in length, with valves and all necessary apparatus as shown on plan M.W.S.S. & D.B., W.A. No. 9161. Existing six-inch diameter main to be lifted.

Allanooka Water Reserve.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 1461/64.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, the Governor may, from time to time by Order in Council, constitute in portion of the State a water reserve or catchment area and define the boundaries thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute that portion of the State defined in the schedule hereunder a water reserve and assign the name of "Allanooka Water Reserve Area" thereto.

P.W.W.S. 1166/64.

WHEREAS it is enacted under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1960, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Allanooka Country Water Area as defined in the schedule hereunder, and assign the name of "Allanooka Country Water Area" thereto.

northern corner of location 1007; thence generally easterly and southerly to and along boundaries of location 1131 to the north-western corner of location 2231; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that location and easterly, southerly, again easterly and again southerly along boundaries of location 6486 to the north-eastern corner of location 2291; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the northernmost north-western corner of location 2451; thence easterly, southerly, again easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that location to the northern boundary of location 2633; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to its south-eastern corner; thence south-easterly to the northern corner of location 1478; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that location to the north-western boundary of location 6477; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along boundaries of that location and south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of location 2682 to the north-western boundary of location 2707; thence north-easterly along that boundary to a south-western boundary of location 2604; thence north-westerly, easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the northernmost north-western corner of location 2878; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the northern boundary of location 2757; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the westernmost south-western corner of location 3969; thence easterly, southerly, again easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that location to its southernmost south-western corner; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of location 2009 to the south-eastern corner of lot M588 of that location as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 2852; thence generally westerly along southern boundaries of that lot, lot M352 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2946, and the northern severance of lot M343 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2943, to a point on a line situate 20 chains easterly from and parallel to the western boundary of location 2831; thence southerly along that line to the southern boundary of location 2972; thence easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 2499; thence southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the south-eastern side of a one-chain road passing through locations 3413 and 3412; thence generally south-westerly along that side to the eastern boundary of location 2845; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of location 1957; thence southerly to and along that boundary to the northern boundary of location 442; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the north-eastern corner of location 266; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost south-eastern corner of location 1520; thence westerly and north-westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 795; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that location and location 933 to the easternmost eastern boundary of location 1793; thence northerly, westerly, southerly, again westerly and again southerly along boundaries of that location to the northern boundary of location 1261; thence westerly and southerly along boundaries of that location and southerly along the western boundary of location 1999 to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of location 10023; thence westerly to the north-eastern corner of that location; thence generally south-south-easterly and west-south-westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; thence generally north-north-westerly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the north-western boundary of Denison Town Lot 285; thence generally north-easterly to and along that boundary and north-western boundaries of lots 29 to 12 inclusive, 168 and 11 to 1 inclusive to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned lot; thence west to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; thence

generally northerly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 1798; thence easterly to and along that boundary to the south-western corner of location 1952; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and easterly along the northern boundary of location 283 to the western boundary of location 683; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to a western boundary of the eastern severance of location 316; thence generally southerly along western boundaries of that severance and location 123 to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence easterly along southern boundaries of that location and location 316 aforesaid to the westernmost south-western corner of location 457; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 681; thence easterly, northerly and westerly to and along boundaries of location 457 aforesaid to the westernmost south-western corner of location 1243; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost south-western corner of location 1247; thence northerly, westerly and again northerly along boundaries of that location to the south-western corner of location 1410; thence northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of location 2763; thence northerly to and along that boundary and western boundaries of locations 2764, 2100, 2772, and 2773 to the north-eastern corner of location 2683; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location to the easternmost south-eastern corner of the western severance of location 2673; thence northerly along the easternmost eastern boundary of that severance and onwards to the southern boundary of location 3095; thence easterly along that boundary to a point on a line situate 20 chains westerly from and parallel to the eastern boundary of that location; thence northerly along that line to the southern boundary of the northern severance of lot M343 of location 2009 aforesaid as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2943 aforesaid; thence westerly, northerly, again westerly and again northerly along boundaries of that lot to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southernmost southern boundary of lot M339; thence westerly, northerly, again westerly, southerly again westerly, again northerly, again westerly, again northerly, again westerly, again northerly and easterly to and along boundaries of that lot to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 1892; thence northerly and westerly to and along boundaries of that location to the easternmost south-eastern corner of location 2912; thence northerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost south-western corner of location 2757; thence northerly, easterly, southerly, again easterly, again northerly, westerly, again northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 2609; thence westerly, northerly, again westerly, again northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the southern corner of location 1084; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location to the southern corner of location 438; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location to the southern corner of location 1025; thence north-westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the southern corner of location 958; thence generally north-westerly along south-western boundaries of that location and locations 117 and 982 to the south-eastern corner of location 980; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the easternmost south-eastern corner of location 202; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that location, location 422 and again location 202 to its south-western corner; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 897; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 1010; thence southerly, westerly and north-easterly along boundaries of that location

to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern boundary of location 425; thence westerly to and along southern boundaries of that location and location 423 and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 1114; thence southerly along eastern boundaries of that location and location 7450 to the southern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence generally west-north-westerly along southern boundaries of that location and locations 1114 aforesaid and 749 to the western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence north-north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that location to the south-western corner of location 1112; thence north-easterly and north-westerly along boundaries of that location to its north-western corner; thence north-westerly to the south-western corner of location 441; thence north-westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the south-western boundary of location 1889; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of location 1688, the north-eastern severance of Reserve 6 and locations 199, 419, 418, 415, 762 and 747 to the western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the south-western boundary of location 1176; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the eastern corner of location 2719; thence south-westerly and north-westerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the southern boundary of location 1161; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 201; thence westerly along the southern boundary of that location and onwards to the eastern side of road number 3357; thence generally north-westerly along that side to the southern boundary of Narngulu Townsite; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that townsite to the north-western side of road number 2244; thence generally south-westerly along that side to the southernmost south-eastern corner of location 2182; thence westerly along the southernmost southern boundary of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 2286; thence northerly, westerly, northerly and again westerly along boundaries of that location to the easternmost north-eastern corner of location 2829; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southern boundary of location 731; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost south-eastern corner of location 6817; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 8051; thence westerly along southern boundaries of that location and locations 8073, 9993 again 8073, 2127 and 1298 and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid and thence generally north-westerly, generally north-easterly and generally northerly along that low water mark to the starting point.

#### Schedule B.

- (1) unite the municipalities of the Town and Shire of York and their districts to form one municipality, named the Shire of York;

- (2) declare that the area, which was at the date of this order the district of the municipality of the Town of York, shall form one ward of the united district under the name of Town Ward;
- (3) direct that the district, which at the time of the making of this order was the district of the Shire of York, shall be divided into two wards to be known as the West Ward and East Ward respectively and comprising as the West Ward all the portion of the district of the Shire of York, as existing at the date of this order, which is situated on the westward side of the Avon River and comprising as the East Ward all that portion of the district of the Shire of York on the eastward side of the Avon River;
- (4) declare that the number of members for the time being of the Council shall be nine and declare that these shall be allocated to the various wards as follows:—  
Town Ward—Ward 4;  
West Ward—Ward 2;  
East Ward—Ward 3;
- (5) direct that all members of the Councils of the municipalities of the Town of York and Shire of York, as existing at the date of this order, shall retire from office on the 22nd day of May, 1965, on which day an election shall be held to return nine members to the Council;
- (6) direct that until the 22nd day of May, 1965, the existing members of the two Councils shall continue in office as members of the united Council as if no change had been made.
- (7) direct that this order shall take effect as and from the 15th day of March, 1965.

number of offices of member for each ward is such as is from time to time declared by order; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that where the Governor exercises a power conferred by section 12 of the said Act he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power shall go out of office, and when, and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election of such members so affected and may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the Council of a municipality so affected, as he thinks fit: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (1) unite the municipalities of the Town of Carnarvon and the Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya and their districts to form one municipality named the Shire of Carnarvon;
- (2) declare that the area, which was, at the date of this order, the district of the municipality of the Town of Carnarvon, shall form four wards of the united district under the names of the Commercial Ward, West Ward, South Ward, and Babbage and East Ward, respectively, having boundaries as set out in the schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that the district, which at the time of the making of this order, was the district of the Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya, shall remain divided into six wards;
- (4) declare that the number of members for the time being of the Council shall be ten and that these shall be allocated one member to each of the ten wards;

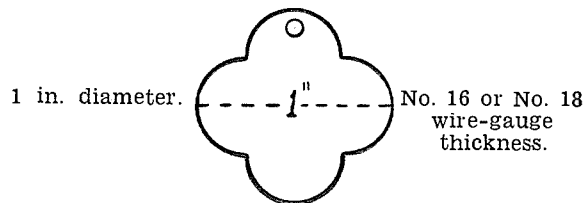

Salaries of Teaching Staff.

Part I.—General.

1. The salary scales set out in this schedule are fixed in relation to the annual equivalent of the weekly basic wage declared by the Industrial Commission of Western Australia, and the classification contained in the schedule is based on the annual equivalent of £812 as on the 1st January, 1965.

2. The salary scales for adult male teachers and officers set out in Part II of this schedule shall be subject to adjustment after that date either up or down to the nearest £1 of the annual equivalent of the weekly basic rate declared from time to time by the Commission.

3. The salaries of male junior officers who rates are less than the basic wage shall be adjusted *pro rata* with the adult male minimum rate calculated to the nearest £1.

4. No male teacher of the age of 21 years shall receive less than the basic wage rate.

5. The salaries of female teachers shall be subject to adjustment either up or down at the rate of 75 per cent. to the nearest £1 of any adjustment applicable to the salaries of male teachers.

Part III.—Placement on the Basic Scale.

Division 1.—Primary, Secondary, Teacher Training and Special Services Divisions.

1. (a) Students who obtain the Teachers' Certificate at the completion of training at a Teachers' College are eligible in accordance with subregulation (3) of regulation 201 of the Education Regulations, 1960, upon their appointment, to salary grades as follows:—

Two-year trained	Grade 4
Three-year trained	Grade 6
Four-year trained	Grade 8
Five-year trained	Grade 9

(b) Students who obtain the Teachers' Certificate (Conditional) shall be placed on grades lower than those specified above at the discretion of the Director-General.

2. (a) Except as provided in any other subparagraph of this paragraph, progression along the salary scale shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

(b) A teacher may not advance further than three annual increments from date of leaving a Teachers' College unless he has obtained an efficiency mark of not less than 77 in the final year.

(c) A teacher shall not proceed beyond Grade 9 unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate.

(d) A teacher may not proceed beyond seven grades from his grade of appointment ex Teachers' College unless over the previous two years he has obtained an average efficiency mark of not less than 80 and a mark of not less than 80 in the final year.

(e) A teacher who has not obtained the Teachers' Higher Certificate or its equivalent may not proceed beyond Grade 15, provided, however, that a teacher who has fulfilled the service and teaching mark requirements for a Teachers' Higher Certificate and who has—

(i) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and a University Degree or its equivalent may proceed to Grade 17; or

(ii) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and one of the following qualifications: The Art Teachers' Diploma (Perth Technical College); a Diploma of the Perth Technical College, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the qualifications for corporate membership of the Australian Institute of Cost Accountants or The Chartered Institute of Secretaries, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the L.Mus.A., the L.A.S.A., or such other qualifications as the Director-General approves for this purpose may proceed to Grade 16.

(f) A teacher who obtains a promotion to a position carrying additional responsibility allowance shall continue his normal progression on the basic scale and shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance of his new position that will give him an increase in salary as a result of his promotion.

3. (a) Teachers who have added to their qualifications after leaving a Teachers' College may be given accelerated progression along the basic salary scale. Progression under this paragraph is governed by the restrictions imposed in subparagraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) of paragraph 2 of this Part and can only be made once in respect to any particular qualification.

Special progression under this paragraph is made in addition to any annual increments to which a teacher is entitled.

(b) Progression through qualifications is awarded as follows:—

(i) On obtaining a University Bachelor's Degree or its equivalent—

If progression has already been awarded under clause (iii)—no increments.

If progression has not been awarded under clause (iii)—

Two-year trained teachers—two increments.

Three-year trained teachers—one increment.

- (ii) On obtaining a University Master's Degree, Doctoral Degree or a second Bachelor's Degree—one increment (except that only one increment can be obtained under this subparagraph).
- (iii) On obtaining a Teachers' Higher Certificate, or its equivalent—
  - If progression has already been awarded under clause (i)—
    - Two-year trained teachers and three-year trained teachers—one increment.
  - If progression has not been awarded under clause (i)—
    - Two-year trained teachers—three increments.
    - Three-year trained teachers—two increments.
    - Four and five-year trained teachers—one increment.

(iv) Teachers with the Teachers' Certificate (Conditional)—

Teachers who in their first year ex College obtain the necessary teaching mark to complete the requirements for the Teachers' Certificate—one increment.

Teachers other than the above who obtain the Teachers' Certificate—one increment, except that teachers who obtain the Teachers' Certificate within a period of three years after leaving a Teachers' College shall receive two increments if they commenced two grades below the normal commencing grade and three increments if they commence three grades below the normal commencing grade.

#### Division 2.—Technical Division.

4. (a) The basic scale of salaries for teachers in the Technical Division shall be that prescribed in Part II of this schedule.

(b) Except as provided in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 of this Part, progression along the salary scale shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

5. (a) On first appointment to the Technical Division teachers, other than trade instructors, will be placed on the basic scale as determined by the Director-General taking into consideration their qualifications and experience.

(b) (i) Trade instructors with five years' post apprenticeship experience will be placed on Grade 9.

(ii) Trade instructors with special additional experience, or with higher technical qualifications, may be placed on grades higher than Grade 9 at the discretion of the Director-General.

(iii) Trade instructors with less than five years' post apprenticeship experience will be placed on grades lower than Grade 9. Such placement will be determined by the number of years by which the experience is less than five years.

6. (a) A teacher other than a trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 9 or two increments from the grade on appointment to the Department, whichever is the greater, unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) or its equivalent, and a satisfactory report on teaching skill.

(b) A teacher other than a trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 or four increments from the grade on appointment to the Department, whichever is the greater, unless he has obtained a satisfactory report on teaching skill, and—

- (i) has completed the examination requirements of the Teachers' Higher Certificate; or
- (ii) is a lecturer who holds an honours, or higher, degree and has completed the Education examination for the Teachers' Higher Certificate or an Education thesis or an approved alternative,

provided, however, that a teacher who has fulfilled the service and teaching mark requirements for a Teachers' Higher Certificate and who has—

(iii) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and a University Degree or its equivalent may proceed to Grade 17; or

(iv) obtained the Teachers' Certificate, and one of the following qualifications: The Art Teachers' Diploma (Perth Technical College); a Diploma of the Perth Technical College, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the qualifications for corporate membership of the Australian Institute of Cost Accountants or the Chartered Institute of Secretaries, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the L.Mus.A., the L.A.S.A., or such other qualifications as the Director-General approves for this purpose, may proceed to Grade 16.

(c) A trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) or its equivalent and a satisfactory report on teaching skill; and as from 1st July, 1968, shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 without a Technical Education Diploma of the Education Department of Western Australia or other equivalent qualification.

(d) A teacher who obtains a promotion to a position carrying additional responsibility allowance shall continue his normal progression on the basic scale and shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance of his new position that will give an increase in salary as a result of his promotion; but a trade instructor appointed to any other classification in the service shall be subject to re-assessment of grades according to qualification, experience and service.
