IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of set nets in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of five years from the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

All that portion of the Indian Ocean bounded by lines starting at a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation easterly of the easternmost northern boundary of Sussex Location 580 and extending generally south-easterly and generally north-easterly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the south-western boundary of the northern severance of Wellington Location 531; thence north-westerly 20 chains at right angles to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly and generally north-westerly along a line 20 chains from and parallel to that low water mark to a point situate north-east from the starting point and thence south-west to that point. (Public Plans 413A/40 and 413B/40.)

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 4th day of February, 1965, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Local Government Act, 1960.

Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya.

Alteration of Wards and Directions for Allocation.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 109/54.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (G) and paragraph (H) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor upon the effective presentation to him of a petition may alter the boundaries of or abolish wholly or in part wards existing in the district, or create new wards in a district; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (C) of subsection (3) of section 10 of the said Act, that the number of offices of member for each ward such as is from time to time declared by order; and whereas the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Gascoyne-Minilya has submitted a petition in view of pending amalgamation with the adjoining town of Carnarvon, praying that the Governor may—

- (a) abolish the Town Ward, and to create in lieu thereof two wards, to be designated the North Plantation Ward and the South Plantation Ward respectively, each to be represented by one Councillor, and comprising—
 - (i) North Plantation Ward—that portion of the Town Ward, existing at the date of this petition, which is situated on the northerly side of the Gascoyne River;
 - (ii) South Plantation Ward—that portion of the Town Ward, existing at the date of this petition, which is situated on the southerly side of the Gascoyne River;
- (b) abolish the Gascoyne and Wooramel Wards, and to create in lieu thereof a new ward, to be designated the Gascoyne-Wooramel Ward, to be represented by one Councillor, and comprising the area of the Gascoyne and Wooramel Wards as existing at the date of this petition;

and whereas it is further provided by paragraph (A) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that, where the Governor exercises the power conferred by section 12, he may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power, shall go out of office and when, and may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election of members so affected and may order, settle, adjust and finally determine such rights, liabilities, questions and matters relating to the representation of electors on the Council of a municipality so affected; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) abolish the Town Ward, and create in lieu thereof two wards, to be designated the "North Plantation Ward" and the "South Plantation Ward" respectively, each to be represented by one Councillor, and comprising—
 - (i) North Plantation Ward—that portion of the Town Ward, as existing at the date of this order, which is situated on the northerly side of the Gascoyne River;
 - (ii) South Plantation Ward—that portion of the Town Ward, as existing at the date of this order, which is situated on the southerly side of the Gascoyne River;
- (b) abolish the Gascoyne and Wooramel Wards, and create in lieu thereof a new ward, to be designated the "Gascoyne-Wooramel Ward," to be represented by

one Councillor, and comprising the area of the Gascoyne and Wooramel Wards as existing at the date of this order;

- (c) direct that the existing members for the present Gascoyne, Wooramel and Town Wards shall retire from office on the 22nd day of May, 1965, on which date an election shall be held to return one member for the Gascoyne-Wooramel Ward and one member each for the North Plantation Ward and South Plantation Ward;
- (d) direct that until the 22nd day of May, 1965, the existing members of the Council shall continue in office as if no change in the wards had been made.

Land Act, 1939-1963.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 4576/15.—That Reserve No. 16334 at Buntine should vest in and be held by the Shire of Dalwallinu in trust for the purposes of Recreation.

Corres. 1025/16.—That Reserve No. 19624 at Grass Patch should vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Racecourse.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall vest in and be held by abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes

Land Act, 1933-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 2921/61.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purposes for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27435 (Swan Location 7718) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Trustees of the University Endowment to be held in trust for the purpose of Endowment of the University of Western Australia: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 2866/33. That Reserve No. 21922 at Shark Lake should vest in and be held for a term expiring 31st December, 1965, by the Shire of Esperance in trust for the purpose of Gravel.

Corres. 3731/60.—That that portion of Class "A" Reserve No. 24547 (near Torbay) situated northward of the prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Torbay Agricultural Area Lot 41 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Albany in trust for the purpose of Camping and Recreation.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such Order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27312 at Geraldton should vest in and be held by the Minister for Mines in trust for the purpose of Explosives: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Mines in trust for explosives with power to the said Minister for Mines to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Alteration to Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1774/52.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, the Governor, upon effective presentation of a petition may, within the limits prescribed by the Act, determine and alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas by paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section 10, where a district is divided into wards, the number of offices of member for each ward is such as is from time to time declared by order; and whereas by paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 20, the Governor may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected by the exercise of the power conferred by section 12, shall go out of office, and when; and whereas by subsection (8) of section 41 when in any district the order of retirement of any member will not be in accordance with the provisions of that section, the Governor may, by order, declare the day on which the member shall retire; and whereas the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Irwin, acting on behalf of the municipality, has presented a petition praying that the membership of the Irwin Shire Council be seven members allocated between the wards in accordance with the attached schedule; and whereas the order of retirement of members will then not be in accordance with the provisions of section 41: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) determine that the membership of the Irwin Shire Council shall be seven, allocated between the wards in accordance with the attached schedule;
- (b) declare that the term of office of the member for the Denison Ward shall expire on the 22nd day of May, 1965, and that James Bailey shall retire on that day;
- (c) direct that the existing members of the North Ward shall go out of office on the 22nd day of May, 1965, and that an election shall be held on that day to elect two members for the North Ward, one of whom shall retire on the 4th Saturday in May, 1966, and one on the 4th Saturday in May, 1967;
- (d) direct that an election shall be held on the 22nd day of May, 1965, to elect two members for the South-East Ward, one of whom shall retire on the 4th Saturday in May, 1966, and one on the 4th Saturday in May, 1968.

Alteration of Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 264/59.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 10 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that where the mode of election to the office of President is by the Council, the number of offices of member of a Shire Council including the President and Councillors, is such number being not less than five nor more than 13 as is from time to time declared by order; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of the said subsection that where the district of the Shire is divided into wards, the number of offices

of member for each ward is such as is from time to time declared by order; and whereas, it is further provided in paragraph (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the said Act that the Governor may on the effective presentation of a petition under the common seal of the municipality, determine and alter the number of offices of Councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas, it is further provided that on the exercise by the Governor of a power conferred by section 12 he may direct the holding, on a day appointed by the order, of an election of such members affected as the case requires; and whereas the Kojonup Shire Council is at present composed of nine members and has submitted a petition praying that the number of offices of member may be altered to 10, the additional member being allocated to the Kojonup Townsite Ward; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, doth hereby—

- (a) declare that the number of offices of member of the Kojonup Shire Council shall henceforth be 10 instead of nine and these shall be allocated between the respective wards as follows: Kojonup Townsite Ward, Muradup Ward, Balgarup, Namarillup and Ongerup Wards, two Councillors each;
- (b) direct that an election shall be held on the 22nd day of May, 1965, to return an additional member for the Kojonup Townsite Ward.
