IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereunder:—

- (a) During the months of March and December in the year 1965, and the months of January, February, March and December in each and every year thereafter; and
- (b) between the hours of 7 o'clock in the morning and 7 o'clock in the evening of each day of the months of April to November (both inclusive) in the year 1965 and each and every year thereafter.

Schedule.

All that portion of Esperance Bay bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark at Dempster Head situate east of the easternmost south-eastern corner of Esperance Town Lot 6 and extending generally north-westerly and generally north-easterly along that mark to the left bank of Bandy Creek and thence south-westerly to the starting point. (Public Plans 423CD/20, and E141-4.)

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 12A of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, that the Governor, on the recommendation of the Minister, may at any time and from time to time declare a specific portion of the State south of the thirty-second parallel being any part of the seashore up to high water mark, and any portion of Western Australian waters contiguous to that part of the seashore, to be a proclaimed fishing zone for the purposes of that Act during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of every year; and whereas the Minister has recommended that the part of the seashore up to high water mark and the portion of Western Australian waters contiguous to that part of the seashore, as specified and described in the schedule hereunder, such seashore and contiguous waters being a specific portion of the State south of the thirty-second parallel, be declared a proclaimed fishing zone for the purposes of the Act referred to during the periods hereafter in this proclamation mentioned: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the part of the seashore up to high water mark and the portion of Western Australian waters contiguous to that part of the seashore, as specified and described in the schedule hereunder, shall be a proclaimed fishing zone for the purposes of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, during the period ending on the 30th day of April, 1965, and during the period commencing on the 15th day of February and ending on the 30th day of April in each and every year thereafter.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments which, by Order in Council, are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Premier's Department at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in various officers of that Department: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby amends the schedule appended to the Order in Council gazetted on the 16th day of November, 1962, by the addition of the name of William Scott Lonnie and the removal of the name of Ralph Herbert Doig.

Constitution Act, 1889-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1665/58.

of location 7949; thence easterly, northerly and westerly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 8745; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location to the southern boundary of location 6448; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the southern boundary of location 8770; thence easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to the north-eastern side of road number 44 aforesaid; thence generally north-westerly and generally northerly along that side to the southern side of a one-chain road passing along the southern boundary of location 2317; thence easterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the eastern boundary of location 2317 aforesaid; thence northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of location 10930 aforesaid and thence easterly along that boundary to the starting point.

Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

T.P.B. 26/4/3/1.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the Town of Northam Interim Development Order No. 1 made by the Minister for Town Planning pursuant to the provisions of section 7B of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962, and set out in the schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

The Town of Northam.

Interim Development Order No. 1.

1.—Application.

This order applies to that part of the Town of Northam, constituted the townsite of Northam under the Land Act, 1933-1963.

2.—Administering Authority.

The authority responsible for administering this order is the Northam Town Council.

3.—Approval Under this Order Required for Certain Development.

The carrying out of any development (other than permitted development as set out in paragraph 6 of this order) on land within the scope of this order is prohibited unless approval is first obtained in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 of this order in addition to any other permission or approval which may otherwise be required by law.

4.—Application for, and Grant of, Approval.

(a) No person shall carry out development (other than permitted development as set out in paragraph 6 of this order) on land within the scope of this order until he has applied for approval from the local authority and has received the written approval or conditional approval of the local authority in accordance with the provisions of the Act and this order.

(b) Application shall be made by or on behalf of the owner of the land and shall be accompanied by three copies of a plan or plans drawn to scale illustrating the proposed development and its location and indicating the type and construction of any buildings or works proposed.

(c) The application shall be dealt with by the local authority in accordance with the terms of this order and the approval, conditional approval, or refusal of the local authority shall be issued to the applicant together with one copy of the plan or plans.

5.—Development by Public Authority.

(a) Any public authority intending to carry out development (other than permitted development) within the area covered by this order is required to consult the local authority in writing and to supply such information as may be necessary to explain the proposal.

(b) The development shall not be commenced until the local authority advise the public authority either that the development is in conformity with the proposed town planning scheme or can be co-ordinated with it; but before so advising the local authority may require modification to the development.

(c) In the event of the modification not being acceptable to the public authority, the development shall not be commenced but the matter shall be referred to the Minister for determination by the Governor as provided by subsection (9) of section 7B of the Act.

6.—Permitted Development.

The following classes of development do not require approval under this order and are subject only to local authority by-laws and other provisions of law:—

- (i) Development by public authorities and local authorities for the purpose of their undertaking or functions on land owned by them at the time of coming into operation of this order.
- (ii) Construction, reconstruction, repair and maintenance of roads, railways, pipe lines, service mains, sewerage and drainage lines by public and local authorities on any public roadway or reserve or on any reserve or easement established for the purpose.
- (iii) Extensions of or alterations, renovating or maintenance to existing buildings within the curtilage of the land on which such buildings stand provided that the floor space of any such buildings or group of buildings is not increased without prior consent of the Northam Town Council.

7.—Existing Use.

No provision in this order shall prevent the continued use of any land or building for the purposes for which the land or building was being lawfully used at the time of the coming into operation of this order or shall prevent the carrying out of any development for which immediately prior to the coming into operation of this order, a permit or permits if any, required under this or any other Act authorising the development to be carried out had been obtained and was current.

8.—Appeals.

(a) In the event of a person being aggrieved by the refusal of approval or by the conditions subject to which approval is granted in respect of an application for permission to carry out development under this order, he may appeal to the Minister against the decision. The appeal must be lodged in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (c) of this paragraph within sixty days after the refusal or conditional approval is served on him.

(b) Where the local authority fails to grant approval to an application for permission to carry out development within a period of sixty days after receipt of the application by the local authority, the failure shall be regarded as a refusal of approval and a person aggrieved by such refusal may appeal to the Minister against the refusal. The appeal must be lodged in accordance with the provisions of subparagraph (c) of this paragraph within sixty days from the receipt of the application by the local authority.

(c) Every appeal shall be in writing, shall state the grounds on which the appeal is made, and must be lodged within the prescribed time at the office of the Minister.

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT,
1928-1962.

1. The Town of Northam Interim Development Order No. 1 contains provisions, *inter alia*—

- (c) That the carrying out of certain development on land within the scope of the order without approval as stated therein is prohibited.

- (g) Relating to the continuance of the lawful use of land and buildings.

PUBLIC SERVICE SALARIES AGREEMENT AMENDMENT, 1965.

(P.S.C. No. 1 of 1965.)

THIS agreement to be known as the Public Service Salaries Agreement Amendment, 1965 (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1965), made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1963, this 8th day of March, 1965, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the "Association") of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner") of the other part, witnesseth as follows: Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to an agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963), dated the 26th day of March, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 32), dated the 3rd day of May, 1963, and as amended by P.S.C. - (iii) Female officers in receipt of a margin of £374 per annum and above—

Seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest (£), of the adjustment applicable to male officers on a margin of £480 per annum, provided that female Professional and General officers who are paid the same margins as those prescribed for male Professional or General officers in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (e) and (f) of clause 13, shall be subject to the same adjustments as apply to male officers on a margin of £480 per annum.

- (iv) Female officers in receipt of rates of pay below a margin of £374 per annum—
