#### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1961, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of opinion that a Controlled Access Road should be provided and should be entered and departed from at specified places only, he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that, if of opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may, by Proclamation, proclaim the Controlled Access Road and the places only at which the Controlled Access Road may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner is of opinion that a Controlled Access Road should be provided as hereinafter described and has made a recommendation to the Governor accordingly; and whereas I, the Governor of the said State,

am of the opinion that such recommendation should be given effect: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the parcels of land coloured green in L.T.O. Plans 6650 and 6679 and which together is more particularly described in schedule hereunder shall be a Controlled Access Road.

All that portion of land being the whole of lots 94 and 213 of Cockburn Sound Location 551 as shown on Lands Titles Office Plans 6650 and 6679.
