# Licensing Act, 1911-1964.

### PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas TO WIT, DOUGLAS ANTHONY KENDREW, Governor. LL.S.] Mothory Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependancies in the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1964, that no licensee shall in the Goldfields dis-trict have or keep his licensed premises open for the cole of license of a cole of license of license and the cole of license of l for the sale of liquor or sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises at any time before nine o'clock in the morning or after any time before hine o clock in the morning of after eleven o'clock at night upon any day in the week, except under the authority of an occasional license or of an airport license or of a restaurant license; and whereas it is enacted by the proviso to that subsection that the Governor may, on the recom-mendation of the Licensing Court, by Proclama-tion, from time to time extend, reduce or vary the bours in any licensing district or part of a licenseing hours in any licensing district or part of a licensing district within the Goldfields district, and that the hours so extended, reduced or varied shall in that licensing district or part of a district thereupon have effect; and whereas the Licensing Court has recommended to me, the Governor, that the hours hereinbefore mentioned should be reduced in the part of the licensing district hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby reduce the hours referred to in subsection (2) of section 121 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1964, in part of the Licensing district of Roe, namely the site of the Hotel Hyden, Hyden, to the hours between 10 a.m. and 11 p.m.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, DOUGLAS ANTHONY KENDREW, Governor, ILLS.] By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-able Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependancies in the Com-monwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 6 of the Juries Act, 1957-1961, inter alia, that when it appears to Act, 1957-1961, *inter alla*, that when it appears to the Governor that the duties of any office, or class of offices, in the paid and active service of the Crown in right of the State, are such that inter-ruption of the discharge of those duties would re-sult in serious inconvenience to the public or any section of the public, the Governor may, by Pro-clamation, exempt any person while occupying that office, or while occupying any class of those offices office, or while occupying any class of those offices, from liability to serve as jurors; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, that the interruption

of the discharge of the duties of the class of office specified hereunder would result in serious inconspecified hereunder would result in serious incon-venience to the public or some section of the public: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers in me vested, do hereby exempt the persons for the time being occupying the following class of office in the paid and active service of the Crown in right of the State, namely the office of dogger in the employ of the Agriculture Protection Board, from liability to serve as jurors.

All that portion of Bremer Bay bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of that bay situate at the north-eastern corner of Bremer Bay Town Lot 131 and extending generally westerly, generally northerly, generally north-easterly and generally southerly along that high water mark to a line between the south-western corner of the north-western severance of Kent Location 1325 and the north-eastern corner of Bremer Bay Town lot 131 aforesaid and thence south-westerly along that line to the starting point south-westerly along that line to the starting point. #### Schedule.

All that portion of Foul Bay bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of that bay situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of Hay Location 1423 and extending generally north-easterly along that mark to a point situate east of the south-eastern corner of location 392; thence south-west to a line corner of location 392; thence south-west to a line 40 chains south-easterly from and parallel to the high water mark of Foul Bay aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly along that line to a point situate 100 degrees from the starting point and thence westerly to that point. Corres. B.F.B. 32/55.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 26 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954-1964, that where, in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable that any plant should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to eradicate the plant, the Governor

may, on the recommendation of the Minister, by Proclamation authorise the burning of the plant during prohibited burning times or during any period of prohibited burning times and declare that such proclamation shall take effect either generally or in the particular district specified in the Proclamation; and whereas the Minister is of the opinion that it is desirable that the plant specified hereunder should be burnt during prohibited burning times in order to eradicate the plant in the particular districts specified hereunder: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby authorise the burning, subject to the regulations, of the undermentioned plants during the periods and in the particular districts set out in the schedule hereto.
