mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the parts of the seashore up to high water mark and the portions of Western Australian waters contiguous to those parts of the seashore, as specified and described in the schedule hereunder, shall be proclaimed fishing zones for the purposes of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, during the period ending on the 30th day of April, 1965, and during the period commencing on the 15th day of February and ending on the 30th day of April in each and every year thereafter.

Schedule.

- (a) All that portion of the Southern Ocean bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of that ocean situate 190 degrees from the southern corner of Plantagenet Location 456 and extending 190 degrees 40 chains; thence 80 degrees to the high water mark of the Southern Ocean aforesaid and thence generally north-westerly along that mark to the starting point.
- (b) all that portion of the Southern Ocean bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of that ocean lying southeast from a point on the south-eastern boundary of Torbay A.A. Lot 28 situate 43 chains north-easterly from the southern corner of that lot and extending south-east to a line parallel to and 40 chains south-easterly from the high water mark of the Southern Ocean aforesaid; thence generally south-westerly along that line to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of lot 41; thence westerly along that prolongation to the high water mark aforesaid and thence generally north-easterly along that mark to the starting point.
- (c) All that portion of the Southern Ocean bounded by lines starting from a point on the high water mark of that ocean situate at the easternmost extremity of Forsyth Bluff and extending south-east to a line parallel to and 40 chains easterly from the high water mark of the Southern Ocean aforesaid; thence generally southerly along that line to a point situate east of the southernmost extremity of Torbay Head; thence west to the high water mark aforesaid and thence generally northerly along that mark to the starting point.

WHEREAS by section 318 of the Companies Act, 1961-1964, it is enacted, inter alia, that where it appears to the Governor that an enactment in force in any State or Territory of the Commonwealth other than the State of Western Australia contains provisions similar to the provisions of that section, he may by order published in the Government Gazette, declare that State or Territory to be a proclaimed State for the purposes of the said section 318; and whereas it so appears to the Governor in Council with respect to an enactment in force in the Northern Territory of Australia: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 318 of the Companies Act, 1961-1964, doth hereby declare the Northern Territory of Australia to be a proclaimed State for the purposes of the said section 318.

Companies Act, 1961-1964. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Companies Act, 1961-1964, it is enacted, inter alia, that section 348 of the Act does not apply to or in relation to a foreign company that is included in a class of companies incorporated under the law of another State, Territory or country, being a class of companies which the Governor has declared by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under that Act, or to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as proprietary companies under that Act where no beneficial interest in any share in the company is held, directly or indirectly, otherwise than by a natural person: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Companies Act, 1961-1964, doth hereby declare exempt proprietary companies and proprietary companies where no beneficial interest in any share in the company is held, directly or indirectly, otherwise than by a natural person, incorporated under the Companies Ordinance, 1963, of the Northern Territory of Australia, respectively to be a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the companies of a kind the same of substantially the same as exempt proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1964, and a class of companies of a kind the same or substantially the same as proprietary companies under the Companies Act, 1961-1964, where no beneficial interest in any share in the company is held, directly or indirectly, otherwise than by a natural person.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purposes for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia.

Notice.

PURSUANT to section 33B of Part IVA (Approval of Electrical Appliances) of the Electricity Act, 1945-1953, The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia hereby prescribes the following classes of electrical appliances intended, suggested, or designed for use in or for the purpose of or for connection to any electrical installation.

An electrical appliance of any class prescribed hereunder shall not after the 7th May, 1965, unless otherwise stated below, be sold, hired, exposed for sale or hire, or advertised for sale or hire, unless an electrical appliance of that class and type has been approved by The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia, and is stamped or labelled if and as prescribed in the regulations.

Notice is also given that the specifications quoted in respect of each class of electrical appliance, and a general specification (Standards Association of Australia Approval and Test Specification for Definitions and General Requirements for Electrical Materials and Equipment), shall be the published specifications in respect to each class of electrical appliance, as from 7th May, 1965, unless otherwise stated below.

The prescribing notice and published specifications published in the Government Gazette of 12th August, 1960, and all amendments and additions thereto, up to and including the Government Gazette of 8th November, 1963, are hereby withdrawn.

DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.

Published Specification

Standards Association of Australia Approval and Test AS C100-1964 Ap Specification for Definitions and General Requirements for Electrical Materials and Equipment.

(The above specification is that approved and published by The State Electricity Commission of Western Australia, and shall, until notice is published to the contrary, apply to all classes and types of electrical appliances now or hereafter prescribed by that Commission pursuant to the provisions of the Electricity Act, 1945-1953, and amendments.)

Prescribed Class of Electrical Appliance.

Electric Bread Toasters.

Electric bread toaster means any appliance which is AS C101-1955 Ap intended primarily for toasting bread or similar foods.

Electric Room Heaters.

- (i) forced air circulators, air conditioners, panel heating units and the like which are intended solely for mounting in a fixed position; or
- (ii) heating units intended for embedding in walls floors or ceilings; or
- (iii) floor-heating units which are intended solely for use in carpet underlays and carpet underlays which incorporate such heating units; or 10, Clause 12 only
- (iv) appliances which are solely or principally suited for cooking; or
- (v) special appliances which are solely used for the application of heat to specific materials or substances.

Earth leakage circuit breaker means a switch intended to AS C110-1956 Ap open a low or medium pressure circuit automatically when a predetermined difference of potential is applied between a terminal of the switch which is intended for connection to the metal casings, frames and/or conduits of an electrical installation and a second terminal of the switch which is intended for connection to the general mass of the earth, but does not include earth leakage relays.

Electric Kettles or Electric Saucepans.

Electric kettle or electric saucepan means a portable vessel AS C172-1963 Ap in which is incorporated an electric heating element intended for heating liquids, and includes coffee percolators, teapots and gluepots, but does not include electric urns or urn type percolators of a capacity of one gallon or more, or equipment designed and/or manufactured specifically for sterilising purposes.

Portable Electric Ranges.

Portable electric range means an electric cooking appliance AS C172—1963 Ap the nominal rating of which does not exceed 10 amperes comprising a cooking compartment fitted with at least one element provided solely for heating the compartment, and with or without one or more heating units which are intended or may be used to heat a cooking vessel or vessels standing thereon.
