IN PURSUANCE of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsover by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto for a period of five years from the date of publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette.

Schedule.

- The whole of the waters of the Arthur River and the Balgarup River extending downwards from their sources to their junctions with the Blackwood River.
- Also, all the waters of the Blackwood River extending downwards from the junction of the Arthur River and the Balgarup River to the prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Sussex Location 133.

WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows: and declare as follows:-

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of long lines or set lines for a period of five years as from date of publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette.

Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters extending along the foreshore between the North Mole at Fremantle and Wreck Point and to a width of one mile to sea.

1198/65.—That Reserve No. (Kyarra Location 48) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Meekatharra in trust for the purpose of Arboretum.

Corres. 3674/64.—That Reserve No. 27533-Kwinana Lot C414 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kwinana in trust for the purpose of

Corres. 3065/64.—That Reserve No. 27532—King Location 272 should vest in and be held by Commissioner of Main Roads in trust for the purpose of Preservation of Flora.

Land Act, 1933-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3887/62.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing: and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27499 at Harvey should vest in and be held by the Shire of Harvey in trust for the purpose of Recreation (T.Q. and Go-Kart Club): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Harvey in trust for Recreation (T.Q. and Go-Kart Club) with power to the said Shire of Harvey, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease, and subject to the condition that the Main Roads Department shall have unrestricted access to the metal dumps on Reserves No. 22770 and 27499.

Land Act, 1933-1963. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3914/64.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27524 (Avon Location 27976) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Country Women's Association of Western Australia to be held in trust for the purpose of a Rest Room Site (Country Women's Association): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Members of Parliament Reimbursement of Expenses Act, 1953-1962.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2A of the Members of Parliament Reimbursement of Expenses Act, 1953-1962, that whereas the result of effect being given to any recommendation made by the Commissioners under the Electoral Districts Act, 1947, alteration of the column under the heading, "Province or District for which the Member of Parliament is elected." of the First Schedule to the Act first abovementioned is necessary, the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the Gazette, make the alteration; and whereas alteration of the column referred to in the preceding recital is necessary by reason of effect having been given to the written report made by the Commissioners referred to, together with a map signed by them, pursuant to section 11A of the Electoral Districts Act, 1947-1963, by the publication of a copy of that report and map in the Government Gazette on the 29th May, 1964, and proclaiming by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 24th December, 1964, that the electoral provinces referred to in that report become electoral provinces in the State on the 31st December, 1964, in accordance with the provisions of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the provisions of the firstmentioned Act, and by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the column under the heading, "Province or District for which the Member of Parliament is elected.", of the First Schedule to the Members of Parliament, Reimbursement of Expenses Act, 1953-1962, be altered-

- (a) by substituting for the passage, "Suburban, West" under the sub-heading, "Province" in Item 1, the passage, "North Metropolitan, North-East Metropolitan, South Metropolitan, South-East Metropolitan";
- (b) by adding after the word, "North" under the sub-heading, "Province" in Item 2, the passage, ", Lower North"; and
- (c) by deleting the passage, "North-East," under the sub-heading, "Province" in Item

Forests Act, 1918-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1231/62, L. & S. 333/57.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Land as State Forest No. 22 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 487042/65.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

Cloverdale.

Lowes Street Sub-Branch.

South Belmont Drainage Area.

The construction of compensating basin, pump station, rising main and pipe drains approximately 1,000 feet in length between Daly

Kennerly, Belgravia and Wright Streets, Cloverdale, with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking, and as shown on plan M.W.S.S. & D.B., W.A. No. 9211.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 14th day of May, 1965.

WHEREAS under section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, it is provided, *inter alia*, that all water works, sewerage, drainage, and irrigation works constructed by the Government and declared by the Governor to be subject to any of the Acts mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, shall vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage on behalf of Her Majesty unless and until those works are vested in a board; and whereas by the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1964, the Governor, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 20th November, 1964, authorised the Minister for Works to undertake, construct or provide the Newdegate Water Supply Catchment provide the Newdegate Water Supply Catchinent Improvements on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 40710; and whereas, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of 11th September, 1964, constituted the Newdegate Country Water Area, as shown coloured blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 41145, under the Country Areas Water Supply Act. 1047, 1047, 1047, and whereas it is Water Supply Act, 1947-1964; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the water works constructed as hereinbefore mentioned be declared to be sub-ject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1964: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the Newdegate Water Supply Catchment Improvements on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 40710, be subject to the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1964 (being an Act mentioned in the schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912.)

Severance and Annexation of Land.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 761/60.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (3) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, after effective presentation of a petition bearing the Common Seal of one only of the municipalities which will be directly affected, sever from a district a portion of a district and annex the portion to a district which the portion adjoins, but provision is also made in paragraph (i) of subsection (6) of the said section 12 that the Minister may refer any question concerning the constitution or alteration of the constitution of municipalities to the Local Government Boundaries Commission for consideration and report; and whereas the Canning Shire Council presented a petition praying for the severance of portion of the districts of the Shires of Belmont and Kalamunda and the annexation thereof to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Canning; and whereas the request of the Canning Shire Council was referred by the Minister to the Local Government Boundaries Commission appointed under the Local Government Act, 1960, and the Commission has reported that it is desirable that certain lands should be severed from the districts of the municipalities of the Shires of Belmont and Kalamunda and annexed to the districts of the municipalities of the Shires of Canning and Belmont: Now, therefore, His Excelleny the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby-

- (1) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Belmont and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Canning to form portion of the North Ward thereof, the land described in Schedule "A" hereto;
- (2) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Canning to form portion of the North Ward thereof, the land described in Schedules "B" and "C" hereto;
- (3) sever from the district of the municipality of the Shire of Kalamunda and annex to the district of the municipality of the Shire of Belmont to form portion of the South Ward thereof, the land described in Schedule "D" hereto;

and doth hereby direct that this order shall take effect as and from the 1st day of July, 1965.
