IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1964, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets other than hand scoop nets for a period of five years as from date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

1. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from the Perth Causeway upwards to the Railway Bridge at Guildford.
2. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from the Middle Swan Bridge connecting the Middle Swan Road upwards to its source.
3. The waters of the Swan River and of its affluents and tributaries from a line drawn from the south-western extremity of Point Resolution to the south-western extremity of the Point Walter jetty (situated at Point Walter), downwards to a line drawn from the western extremity of the South Mole to the western extremity of the North Mole at Fremantle.
4. The waters of the Canning River and of its affluents and tributaries upwards to its source, from a line drawn from a point on the right bank and situate eight chains north-westerly from Salter Point, and extending 242 deg. 21 min. 22 chains 3 6/10th links across the said river, the extremities of such line being marked on the ground with steel rails.
5. All that area of Western Australian waters from the southerly extremity of Mudurup Rocks and extending in a northerly direction to the south-western extremity of North Street, Cottesloe, with a width of a quarter of a mile from the foreshore.
6. All that area of Western Australian waters from the south-western extremity of North Street, Cottesloe, and extending in a northerly direction to a point one-half mile south of the drain at Swanbourne with a width of a quarter of a mile from the foreshore.

prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of sunk nets, being nets the ground or lead line of which is moved along the bottom and the cork line of which is submerged during the process of hauling, in the whole of the waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers and all their affluents and tributaries, for a period of five years from date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* excepting during the months of May, June, July, August and September in each year in that portion of the waters of the Swan River defined in the Locality Schedule hereto.

Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Swan River known as Melville Water, together with all its affluents and tributaries except the waters of the Canning River and its affluents and tributaries, flowing between straight lines drawn from Point Lewis to Point Belches and from Point Resolution to Point Walter, respectively.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 7th day of July, 1965, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1964, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of that section; and whereas Western Aluminium No Liability, a company incorporated in the State of Victoria having its registered office in the State of Western Australia at Hope Valley Road, Kwinana, being an employer within the meaning of the section has, duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations

made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond for £5,000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt Western Aluminium No Liability from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1964, for a period terminating on the 30th day of April, 1967.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 21st day of July, 1965, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964, that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council, constitute as a fire district any portion of a district of a local authority which after the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, is not a fire district, assign a name to a fire district, and include the name of a fire district in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby—

- (a) constitute that portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Esperance more particularly described in the schedule hereunder a fire district;
- (b) assign the name of Esperance Fire District to that district; and
- (c) include in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act, "Esperance Fire District" and in column two opposite that name the name of the Local Authority, "Municipal District of the Shire of Esperance".

Schedule.

Esperance Fire District.

All that portion of land situate within the Municipal District of the Shire of Esperance bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of East Location 19 and extending southerly along the western boundary of that location and onwards to the high water mark of Esperance Bay; thence generally south-westerly, generally south-easterly and generally westerly along that mark and the high water mark of the Southern Ocean to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of Esperance Location 11; thence northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the northern side of Giles Street; thence westerly along that side to the south-eastern corner of location 15; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location and the eastern boundaries of locations 16, 17 and 1486 to the northern side of Mungan Street; thence westerly along that side and onwards to the western side of Johns Street; thence north-easterly along that side to the southern side of King Street; thence westerly along that side and onwards to the western side of Blake Street; thence northerly along that side and onwards to the southern boundary of location 51; thence westerly along that boundary and the northern side of Ocean Street and onwards to the eastern side of Freeman Street; thence southerly along that side to the northern side of Thompson Street; thence westerly along that side to the south-western corner of location

66; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location to the southern boundary of Reserve 3441; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that reserve to the south-western corner of location 30; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location and onwards to the southern side of Pink Lake Road; thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of location 114; thence northerly to and along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Dean Street; thence easterly to and along that side to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the easternmost eastern boundary of location 122; thence generally northerly to and along eastern boundaries of that location and onwards to the south-western corner of location 126; thence generally easterly along the southern boundaries of that location and locations 125 and 26 to the south-western boundary of Esperance Town Lot 285 (Railway Reserve); thence south-easterly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of lot 287; thence easterly to and along that boundary to the western boundary of lot 286; thence northerly along that boundary to the north-western corner of that lot; thence northerly to the south-western corner of the northern severance of lot 295; thence northerly along the western boundary of that lot to the southern boundary of lot 292; thence westerly and northerly along boundaries of that lot to the southern boundary of lot 319; thence generally north-westerly and generally north-easterly along boundaries of that lot to its north-western corner; thence north-easterly to the north-western corner of the north-eastern severance of East Location 21; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that location to the north-eastern corner of the south-eastern severance of that location; thence north-easterly along the south-eastern side of a one chain road passing through locations 17 and 18 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 19 aforesaid and thence easterly along that prolongation to the starting point.

2. Clause 4 of "City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 1 Regulation" is amended by deleting the definition "City of Fremantle" and substituting:—

"City of Fremantle" includes—

(i) the district of the City of Fremantle as gazetted from time to time; or

(ii) the Municipal Council of the City of Fremantle,

dependent on the context.

3. Clause 4 of "City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 1 Regulation" is amended by deleting the definition "Zoning Plan" and substituting the following:—

"Zoning Plan" means a plan of the City of Fremantle as amended by regulation from time to time, which has—

(i) been divided into zones for various primary uses;

(ii) such zones denoted by different colours for different primary uses;

(iii) been lodged by the City with the Board.

The original zoning plan was signed by the Mayor and Town Clerk of the City on the 3rd day of June, 1958. The zoning plan (as amended from time to time) and this regulation shall be read in conjunction with each other and the zoning plan shall form part of this Regulation.

4. Clause 6 of "City of Fremantle Town Planning Scheme No. 1 Regulation" is repealed and the following new clause 6 is substituted:—

6. The area to which the scheme is to apply is the Municipal District of the City of Fremantle as gazetted on the 28th day of June, 1963.

(i) All three plans show the land comprising the North Fremantle Ward of the City of Fremantle (hereafter referred to as "the said land").

(ii) Plan No. 1.—In this plan is shown how the said land is at present zoned by by-law made pursuant to section 248 of the Local Government Act, 1960, and Amendments, by the Town of North Fremantle before the union and by City of Fremantle after the union.

(iii) Plan No. 2.—In this is shown the land use of the said land as at the 30th day of June, 1964.
