Reserve for Natives.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any reserve so declared; and whereas by Proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th September, 1938, the Governor declared an area at Geraldton, more particularly described as Reserve 21856 and defined in the schedule to such Proclamation, to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and of the power in that behalf conferred by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th September, 1938, as aforesaid.

WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (5) of section (27) of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part

IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time by Proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall extend to and have effect in and throughout any portion of the State to be defined in the Proclamation and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps and marshes situated within that portion of the State specified and defined as aforesaid but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of 30 days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts any such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, swamp, lake or marsh runs or is situate to the intent that before making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised me, the Governor, by Proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to that portion of the State hereinafter mentioned; and whereas notice was duly given to the local authorities concerned and they have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1964, shall extend to and have effect in and throughout that portion of the State lying between the parallels of twenty degrees and twenty-four degrees south latitude and between the meridian of one hundred and twenty-one degrees, thirty minutes east longitude and the Indian Ocean, and shall apply to and have effect in relation to all the rivers, streams, watercourses, lagoons, lakes, swamps and marshes situated within that portion of the State.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 892/17.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 16711 (Trayning Lot 65) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Trayning-Kununoppin-Yelbeni in trust for the purpose of Use and Requirements of the Shire of Trayning-Kununoppin: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Trayning-Kununoppin-Yelbeni in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3591/63.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27668 (Melville Lot 203) should vest in and be held by the City of Nedlands in trust for the purpose of a Kindergarten Site: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the City of Nedlands in trust for a Kindergarten Site with power to the said City of Nedlands, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Local Government Act, 1960.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L. and S. Corres. 1199/64 (R1301).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, or acquired, for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control and management of a Council, or land comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of a Council as a public street, and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriageway and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Mandurah has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within the Shire of Mandurah be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such lands shall, from the date of this Order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Extension to Ord River District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 29E of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1954, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, extend any defined part of the State as an Irrigation District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said area defined in the Schedule hereto to assign the name of "Ord Irrigation District" thereto.

Ord Irrigation District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the boundary of the Ord Irrigation District situate 104 degrees 42 minutes 302 chains 71 links from survey mark AR36 on the Carlton Reach Base Line and extending 41 degrees 43 minutes 81 chains 1 link; thence 00 degrees 00 minutes 500 chains 35 and seven-tenths links; thence 90 degrees 00 minutes 214 chains 82 and eight-tenths links; thence 359 degrees 42 minutes 140 chains 1 and nine-tenths links; thence 89 degrees 42 minutes 320 chains 3 and one-tenth links; thence 179 degrees 43 minutes 300 chains and 3 and eight-tenths links; thence south-westerly about 772 chains to the easternmost north-eastern corner of the Ord Irrigation District aforesaid and thence west and north along boundaries of that district to the starting point.

Shires of Nyabing-Pingrup and Lake Grace.

Alteration and Adjustment of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 117/65.

WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (f) of sub-section (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor, upon the presentation of a petition under the Common Seal of the districts concerned, may alter and adjust the boundaries of adjoining districts; and whereas the municipalities of the Shires of Lake Grace and Nyabing-Pingrup have presented a joint petition praying that the boundaries of the two districts shall be altered and adjusted as set out in the schedule hereunder; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the districts of the Shires of Lake Grace and Nyabing-Pingrup by—

- (1) severing from the district of the Shire of Lake Grace and annexing to the district of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup to form portion of the North Ward thereof the area described in Schedule A hereto;
- (2) severing from the district of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup and annexing to the district of the Shire of Lake Grace to form portions of the South, Lake Biddy and Newdegate Wards thereof, the area described in Schedule B hereto.

Transfer of Territory between the Shires of Lake Grace and Nyabing-Pingrup.

Transfer of Territory from the Shire of Lake Grace to the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup.

(i) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the easternmost south-eastern corner of Williams Location 15004, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup, and extending northerly along the eastern boundaries of that location and locations 15226 and 13399 to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the north-western boundary of Roe Location 2592; thence north-easterly and south-easterly to and along boundaries of that location to the northern corner of location 2591; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Williams Location 12511, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup aforesaid, and thence westerly, southerly and again westerly along that boundary to the starting point.

(ii) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the north-eastern boundary of Roe Location 2586 situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Williams Location 12511, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup, and extending westerly along the lastmentioned boundary to the north-western boundary of Roe Location 2588;

thence north-easterly along that boundary and the north-western boundaries of locations 2587 and 2607 to the northern corner of the lastmentioned location, and thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of that location and location 2586 aforesaid to the starting point.

(iii) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the northern boundary of Roe Location 2549 situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Williams Location 12511, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup, and extending westerly along the lastmentioned boundary to the north-western boundary of Roe Location 2558; thence north-easterly along that boundary and north-easterly and south-easterly along boundaries of location 2557 to the north-western corner of location 2556 and thence south-easterly along the northern boundaries of that location and location 2549 aforesaid to the starting point.

Transfer of Territory from the Shire of Nyabing-Pingrup to the Shire of Lake Grace.

(i) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the north-eastern boundary of Roe Location 2591 situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Williams Location 12511, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Lake Grace, and extending easterly along the lastmentioned boundary to the north-western boundary of Roe Location 2588; thence south-westerly along that boundary and the north-western boundary of location 2589 to the north-western corner of that location; thence north-westerly to the north-eastern corner of location 2591 aforesaid and thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of that location to the starting point.

(iii) All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point on the northern boundary of Roe Location 2549 situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of Williams Location 12511, a point on the present boundary of the Shire of Lake Grace, and extending easterly along the lastmentioned boundary to the eastern boundary of Roe Location 2547; thence south-westerly along that boundary and onwards to the north-eastern corner of location 2551 and thence north-westerly along the northern boundaries of that location and locations 2550 and 2549 aforesaid to the starting point.

Alteration and Adjustment of Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 145/54.

WHEREAS it is provided in subsection 2 of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, upon effective presentation of a petition under the Common Seal of each municipality which will be directly affected by an order, alter and adjust the boundaries of adjoining districts; and whereas, the municipality of the Shires of Gingin and Dandaragan, respectively, have submitted a joint petition praying that the boundaries between the two said adjoining districts should be altered by severing from the district of the Shire of Dandaragan and annexing to the district of the Shire of Gingin the land specified in the schedule hereto; and whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the districts of the municipalities of the Shires of Gingin and Dandaragan, respectively, by severing from the district of the Shire of Dandaragan and annexing to the district of the Shire of Gingin the land specified in the schedule hereto.
