WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by section 5 of the Local Courts Act, 1904-1964, that the Governor may, by Proclamation, order that courts to be called Local Courts shall be held at such places as he thinks fit; and whereas it is further enacted (*inter alia*) by section 10 of the Act that the Court shall be held in the place appointed by the Governor once at least in such period of time as the Governor directs by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby order that a Local Court shall be held at Boyup Brook and further I direct that such Court shall be held once at least in each period of three months.

- (b) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown land or a reserve and the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than six (6) feet wide on the Crown land or reserve along the common boundary.

## 2. Townsite Lands.—

boundaries of all cleared and part-cleared land owned or occupied by them and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable material until the 15th day of April, 1966. Where holdings or locations comprise more than 500 acres of such land, additional firebreaks must be provided to divide the land into areas of not more than 500 acres each, surrounded by a firebreak. Where land is in crop the area in crop shall be surrounded by a firebreak not less than ten (10) feet in width.

Where cleared or part-cleared land abuts onto or is dissected by a roadway, railway, river or any area of uncleared land, a firebreak of not less than ten (10) feet in width must be provided and maintained during the specified period parallel to the common boundary of the cleared or part cleared land with the roadway, railway, river or uncleared land.

**Buildings and Hay Stacks.**—A firebreak of not less than ten (10) feet wide shall be provided one chain from the perimeter of all buildings, haystacks and homesteads by the 15th October, 1965, and the area between the firebreak and building or haystack shall be maintained free of inflammable material until the 15th day of April 1966.

**Townsites.**—On or before the 15th day of October, 1965, all town lots within the Shire of Dumbleyung are required to be cleaned of all debris of an inflammable nature and maintained free of such material until the 15th day of April, 1966.

If it is impracticable for any reason to provide the firebreaks in the positions or by the dates specified in the notice, application must be made in writing to the Dumbleyung Shire Council on or before the 15th day of October, 1965, for permission to place the firebreaks in an alternative position or to complete the provision of such firebreaks by a later date.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in section 33 of the above Act, you are hereby required, on or before the date referred to below, to clear firebreaks in accordance with the following and thereafter to maintain the firebreaks clear of inflammable material up to and including the 31st day of March, 1966:—

1. (a) Where land owned or occupied by you is cleared or partly cleared you shall, on or before the 1st day of October, 1965, clear firebreaks not less than 10 feet wide inside and parallel to the boundaries of that part of the land which is cleared or partly cleared. The outside perimeter of the firebreak required by this section is to be situated within five chains of the boundary of the cleared or part-cleared land.
- (b) Where the land owned or occupied by you has buildings or haystacks situated on the land you shall, on or before the 1st day of October, 1965, clear a firebreak at least 10 feet wide within 10 chains of the perimeter of all such buildings or haystacks on the land so as to completely surround with the firebreak, the building or group of buildings or haystacks.

Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained, or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) you shall on or before the 31st day of October, 1965, clear a firebreak not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which the bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

3. Where the bush on land owned or occupied by you has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether you intend to burn the bush or not) and such bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush is completed after the 31st October, 1965, you shall, within 28 days of completing the bulldozing, chaining or preparing of the bush, clear a firebreak not less than one chain wide immediately inside the external boundaries of the land on which bulldozed, chained or otherwise prepared bush is situated.

If it is considered to be impractical for any reason to clear firebreaks as required by this notice, you may apply to the Council or your local bush fire control officer, not later than the 15th day of September, 1965, in respect of land referred to in paragraph 1 herein, and not later than the 15th day of October, 1965, in respect of land referred to in paragraph 2 herein, or not later than 14 days prior to the date by which firebreaks are required to be completed in respect of land referred to in paragraph 3 herein, for permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or by an alternative date. If permission is not granted by the Council or your local bush fire control officer you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than £5 nor more than £100 and a person in default is also liable, whether prosecuted or not to pay the cost of performing the work directed in this notice if it is not carried out by the owner or occupier by the date required by this notice.

If you propose to carry out the requirements of this notice by burning the necessary firebreaks, and the burning is to be carried out between the 1st day of October, 1965, and the 31st day of October, 1965, or between the 1st day of February, 1966, and the 31st day of May, 1966, a permit for the burning would be required under section 18 of the Bush Fires Act. The burning would be subject to any conditions stated in the permit and to all other relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act. All burning is prohibited within the Shire of Ravens-thorpe from the 1st day of November, 1965, until the 31st day of January, 1966 (both dates inclusive).

## PART I.—GENERAL.

1. The salary scales set out in this schedule are  
fixed in relation to the annual equivalent of the  
weekly basic wage declared by the Industrial Com-  
mission of Western Australia, and the classifica-  
tion contained in the schedule is based on the an-  
nual equivalent of £793 as on the 1st July, 1964.

2. The salary scales for adult male teachers and  
officers set out in Part II of this schedule shall be  
subject to adjustment after that date either up  
or down to the nearest £1 of the annual equivalent  
of the weekly basic rate declared from time to time  
by the Commission.

3. The salaries of male junior officers whose  
rates are less than the basic wage shall be adjusted  
pro rata with the adult male minimum rate cal-  
culated to the nearest £1.

4. No male teacher of the age of 21 years shall  
receive less than the basic wage rate.

5. The salaries of female teachers (category A)  
shall be subject to adjustment either up or down  
at the rate of 75 per cent. to the nearest £1 of any  
adjustment applicable to the salaries of male  
teachers and the salaries of female teachers (cate-  
gory B) shall be subject to adjustment either up  
or down at the rate of 80 per cent. to the nearest  
£1 of any adjustment applicable to the salaries of  
male teachers.

Female teachers (category B) are women teachers who are employed on "permanent" or "supply" conditions and have completed or complete fifteen years' continuous full-time service as teachers with the Education Department of Western Australia (exclusive of periods spent in training). Female teachers (category A) are women teachers who do not possess such service qualification.

#### PART III.—PLACEMENT ON THE BASIC SCALE.

##### Division 1.—Primary, Secondary, Teacher Training and Special Services Divisions.

1. (a) Students who obtain the Teachers' Certificate at the completion of training at a Teachers' College are eligible in accordance with subregulation (3) of regulation 201 of the Education Regulations, 1960, upon their appointment, to salary grades as follows:—

(b) Students who obtain the Teachers' Certificate (Conditional) shall be placed on grades lower than those specified above at the discretion of the Director-General.

2. (a) Except as provided in any other subparagraph of this paragraph, progression along the salary scale shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

(b) A teacher may not advance further than three annual increments from date of leaving a Teachers' College unless he has obtained an efficiency mark of not less than 77 in the final year.

(c) A teacher shall not proceed beyond Grade 9 unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate.

(d) A teacher may not proceed beyond seven grades from his grade of appointment ex Teachers' College unless over the previous two years he has obtained an average efficiency mark of not less than 80 and a mark of not less than 80 in the final year.

(e) A teacher who has not obtained the Teachers' Higher Certificate or its equivalent may not proceed beyond Grade 15, provided, however, that a teacher who has fulfilled the service and teaching mark requirements for a Teachers' Higher Certificate and who has—

(i) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and a University Degree or its equivalent may proceed to Grade 17; or

(ii) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and one of the following qualifications:—

Passes in seven full units towards a Bachelors' Degree of the University of Western Australia; the Art Teachers' Diploma (Perth Technical College); a Diploma of the Perth Technical College, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the qualifications for corporate membership of the Australian Institute of Cost Accountants or The Chartered Institute of Secretaries, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the L.Mus.A., the L.A.S.A., or such other qualifications as the Director-General approves for this purpose may proceed to Grade 16.

(f) A teacher who obtains a promotion to a position carrying additional responsibility allowance shall continue his normal progression on the basic scale and shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance of his new position that will give him an increase in salary as a result of his promotion.

3. (a) Teachers who have added to their qualifications after leaving a Teachers' College or after appointment to the teaching service in certain cases where the appointment is not ex College may be given accelerated progression along the basic salary scale. Progression under this paragraph is governed by the restrictions imposed in subparagraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) of paragraph 2 of this Part and can only be made once in respect to any particular qualification.

Special progression under this paragraph is made in addition to any annual increments to which a teacher is entitled.

(b) Progression through qualifications is awarded as follows:—

(i) On obtaining one of the qualifications listed in clause (ii) of subparagraph (e) of paragraph 2—

If progression has already been awarded under clause (ii) or clause (iii) of this subparagraph—no increments.

If progression has not already been awarded under clause (ii) or clause (iii) of this subparagraph—

Two-year trained teachers—one increment (except that only one increment can be obtained under this clause).

(ii) On obtaining a University Bachelor's Degree or its equivalent—

If progression has already been awarded under clause (i) of this subparagraph—one increment.

If progression has already been awarded under clause (iii) of this subparagraph below—no increment.

If progression has not been awarded under clauses (i) or (iii) of this subparagraph—

Two-year trained teachers—two increments.

Three-year trained teachers—one increment.

(iii) On obtaining a Teachers' Higher Certificate, or its equivalent—

If progression has already been awarded under clause (i) but not under clause (ii) of this subparagraph—two increments.

If progression has already been awarded under clause (ii) of this subparagraph—one increment.

If progression has not been awarded under clauses (i) or (ii) of this subparagraph—

Two-year trained teachers—three increments.

Three-year trained teachers—two increments.

Four and five-year trained teachers—one increment.

- (iv) On obtaining a University Master's Degree, Doctoral Degree or a second Bachelor's Degree—one increment (except that only one increment can be obtained under this clause).

- (v) Teachers with the Teachers' Certificate (Conditional)—

Teachers who in their first year ex College obtain the necessary teaching mark to complete the requirements for the Teachers' Certificate—one increment.

Teachers other than the above who obtain the Teachers' Certificate—one increment, except that teachers who obtain the Teachers' Certificate within a period of three years after leaving a Teachers' College shall receive two increments if they commenced two grades below the normal commencing grade and three increments if they commence three grades below the normal commencing grade.

Teachers of commercial subjects in secondary schools (other than those appointed from Teachers' College), whose first appointments are on Grade 3 or below, on obtaining the Teachers' Certificate (Technical)—one increment.

#### Division 2.—Technical Division.

4. (a) The basic scale of salaries for teachers in the Technical Division shall be that prescribed in Part II of this schedule.

(b) Except as provided in paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 of this Part, progression along the salary scale shall be by annual increments and shall be dependent upon satisfactory service.

5. (a) On first appointment to the Technical Division teachers, other than trade instructors, will be placed on the basic scale as determined by the Director-General taking into consideration their qualifications and experience.

(b) (i) Trade instructors with five years' post apprenticeship experience will be placed on Grade 9.

(ii) Trade instructors with special additional experience, or with higher technical qualifications, may be placed on grades higher than Grade 9 at the discretion of the Director-General.

(iii) Trade instructors with less than five years' post apprenticeship experience will be placed on grades lower than Grade 9. Such placement will be determined by the number of years by which the experience is less than five years.

6. (a) A teacher other than a trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 9 or two increments from the grade on appointment to the Department, whichever is the greater, unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) or its equivalent, and a satisfactory report on teaching skill.

(b) A teacher other than a trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 or four increments from the grade on appointment to the Department, whichever is the greater, unless he has obtained a satisfactory report on teaching skill, and—

- (i) has completed the examination requirements of the Teachers' Higher Certificate; or
- (ii) is a lecturer who holds an honours, or higher, degree and has completed the Education examination for the Teachers' Higher Certificate or an Education thesis or an approved alternative,

provided, however, that a teacher who has fulfilled the service and teaching mark requirements for a Teachers' Higher Certificate and who has—

- (iii) obtained the Teachers' Certificate and a University Degree or its equivalent may proceed to Grade 17; or

- (iv) obtained the Teachers' Certificate, and one of the following qualifications: Passes in seven full units towards a Bachelors' Degree of the University of Western Australia; the Art Teachers' Diploma (Perth Technical College); a Diploma of the Perth Technical College, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the qualifications for corporate membership of the Australian Institute of Cost Accountants or the Chartered Institute of Secretaries, together with a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent; the L.Mus.A., the L.A.S.A., or such other qualifications as the Director-General approves for this purpose, may proceed to Grade 16.

(c) A trade instructor shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 unless he has obtained the Teachers' Certificate (Technical) or its equivalent and a satisfactory report on teaching skill; and as from 1st July, 1968, shall not proceed beyond Grade 15 without a Technical Education Diploma of the Education Department of Western Australia or other equivalent qualification.

(d) A teacher who obtains a promotion to a position carrying additional responsibility allowance shall continue his normal progression on the basic scale and shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance of his new position that will give an increase in salary as a result of his promotion; but a trade instructor appointed to any other classification in the service shall be subject to re-assessment of grades according to qualification, experience and service. Where the appointment is promotional he shall receive in addition the appropriate responsibility allowance that will give him an increase of salary as a result of his promotion.

7. (a) Teachers who have added to their qualifications while holding appointments in the Technical Division may be given accelerated progression along the basic salary scale. Progression under this paragraph is governed by the restrictions imposed by paragraphs 5 and 6 of this Part and can only be made once in respect to any particular qualification.

Special progression under this paragraph is made in addition to any annual increments to which a teacher is entitled.

If progression has already been awarded under clause (iv) of this subparagraph—no increment.

If progression has not been awarded under clauses (i) or (iv) of this subparagraph—two increments.

- (iii) On obtaining a University Masters' Degree, a Doctoral Degree or a second Bachelor's Degree—one increment (except that only one increment may be obtained under this clause).

- (iv) On obtaining the Teachers' Higher Certificate—

If progression has already been awarded under clause (i) but not under clause (ii) of this subparagraph—two increments.

If progression has already been awarded under clause (ii) of this subparagraph—one increment.

If progression has not been awarded under clause (i) and clause (ii) of this subparagraph—three increments.

- (v) In the case of teachers of commercial subjects whose first appointments are on Grade 3 or below, on obtaining the Teachers' Certificate or the Teachers' Certificate (Technical)—one increment.

#### Division 3.—General Definitions.

#### 8. For purposes of this Part—

“five-year trained teacher” means a teacher who has had a minimum of five years' full time tertiary training including at least one year spent in training at an approved teachers' college and either—

- (a) in addition, obtained a degree of a recognised university, other than the Bachelor of Education degree of the University of Western Australia, for which the minimum requirements are four years' full time study; or

- (b) in addition, obtained a degree of a recognised university for which the minimum requirements are three years' full time study, and at the conclusion thereof passed at least one year's post-graduate study.

“tertiary training” means undertaking a course at an approved university, technical institution or teachers' college for which the pre-requisite is a Leaving Certificate or its equivalent.
