Land Act, 1933-1963.

### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. 1486/30, Vol. 2.—That Reserve No. 20606 (at Geraldton) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for the purpose of Harbour Purposes.

Corres. 5171/52.—That Reserve No. 23663 (Point Samson Lot 76) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Roebourne in trust for the purpose of Caravan Park and Camping.

Corres. 365/57.—That Reserve No. 24948 (Kalamunda Lots 423 and 428) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kalamunda in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Corres. 8145/04, Vol. 2.—That Reserve No. 27714 (Hamel Lot 166) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Waroona in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1598/60.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purposes for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 25795 (Perenjori Lot 116) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Returned Sailors', Soldiers' and Airmen's Imperial League of Australia (W.A. Branch) Incorporated to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hall Site (R.S.L.): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned

reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 5171/56.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1963, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27673 (Point Samson Lot 119 and portion of lot 47) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for the purpose of Harbour Purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Minister for Works in trust for Harbour Purposes with power to the said Minister for Works to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Local Government Act, 1960.

#### ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of a Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, or acquired, for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control and management of a Council, or land comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of a Council as a public street, and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriage way and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Councils mentioned in the schedule hereunder have requested that certain lands named and described in the said schedule, which have been reserved for streets within the said Council be declared public streets: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be public streets, and such lands shall, from the date of this order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as streets within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.
