WHEREAS it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (1) of section 122 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1964, that no licensee shall have or keep his licensed premises open for the sale of liquor, or sell any liquor or permit or suffer any liquor to be drunk or consumed in or upon his licensed premises, upon any Sunday, except under the authority of an airport license; and whereas it is enacted (*inter alia*) by subsection (2) of that section, that the provisions of the section shall not prohibit the sale of liquor to, or the consumption of liquor by, any person on a Sunday, not being Anzac Day or Christmas Day, on premises which are the subject of a publican's general license, a limited hotel license, a canteen license or a wayside-house license, and are at least twenty miles distant from the Town Hall in Perth when measured by the shortest road route or are situate on Rottnest Island, if the liquor is sold and consumed between the hours of 12 noon and 1 p.m. or the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 p.m.; and whereas it is enacted by the proviso to paragraph (c) of the subsection last mentioned that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court, by Proclamation from time to time extend, reduce or vary the hours hereinbefore mentioned in any licensing district or part of a district within the Goldfields District and that the hours so extended,

reduced or varied shall in that licensing district or part of a district thereupon have effect; and whereas the Licensing Court has recommended to me, the Governor, that the hours hereinbefore mentioned should be extended and varied in the manner hereinafter appearing in respect of those parts of the licensing district of Pilbara, specified in the schedule hereunder: Now, therefore I, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Licensing Court and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby extend and vary the hours referred to in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 122 of the Licensing Act, 1911-1964, in the case of those parts of the licensing district of Pilbara, specified in the schedule hereunder, which premises are the subject of a canteen license under that Act, to the hours on a Sunday, not being Anzac Day or Christmas Day, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon, of 4 p.m. and 6 p.m., and of 7.30 p.m. and 10 p.m.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 710/64, L. & S. 1524/64.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 28th day of October, 1964, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament resolutions were passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown

Land as State Forest No. 52 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the schedule hereto.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 525/65.

L. & S. Corres. 3169/65 (R1327).

WHEREAS by section 288 of the Local Government Act, 1960, it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, or acquired, for use by the public or used by the public as a street, way, public place, bridge or thoroughfare, under the care, control and management of a Council, or land comprised in a private street, constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of a Council as a public street, and if the Council thinks fit, that the Governor shall declare the width of the carriage way and footpaths of the public street; and whereas the Shire of Mundaring has requested that certain lands named and described in the schedule hereunder, which have been reserved for a street within the Shire of Mundaring be declared a public street: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare the said lands to be a public street, and such lands shall, from the date of this order, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Milk Act, 1946-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (1) of section 9 of the Milk Act, 1946-1964, that the Governor may from time to time on the recommendation of the Minister, by Order in Council, divide any dairy area into districts, define the boundaries of a district, alter the boundaries of a district, and subdivide any district into two or more districts; and whereas by an Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th April, 1947, the Governor did, *inter alia*, divide the Metropolitan Dairy Area constituted and declared by that Order in Council into the districts specified and defined in the Second Schedule thereto; and whereas the districts so specified and defined included (*inter*

alia) the South Perth, Leederville and Inglewood Districts; and whereas by an Order in Council dated the 10th May, 1965, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st May, 1965, the boundaries of the Inglewood District were altered and the district subdivided into several districts including (*inter alia*) Inglewood No. 35 District and Inglewood No. 36 District; and whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the South Perth and Leederville Districts and subdivide each of those districts as amended by such alteration of boundaries into several districts and to alter the boundaries of the Inglewood No. 35 District and Inglewood No. 36 District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister, doth hereby in pursuance of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 9 of the said Act—

- (a) alter the boundaries of the South Perth District by substituting for the area of land comprising the South Perth Road District specified in the Second Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, as defining that district, the area of land defined and described in Part I of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (b) alter the boundaries of the Leederville District by substituting for the area of land comprising that district as defined in the Second Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 18th April, 1947, the area of land defined and described in Part II of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (c) alter the boundaries of the Inglewood No. 35 District by substituting for the area of land comprising that district as defined and described in Schedule "C" to the Order in Council dated the 10th May, 1965, the area of land defined and described in Part III of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (d) alter the boundaries of the Inglewood No. 36 District by substituting for the area of land comprising that district as defined and described in Schedule "C" to the Order in Council dated the 10th May, 1965, the area of land defined and described in Part IV of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council;
- (e) subdivide the South Perth District as defined and described in Part I of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council into the several districts specified and defined in Schedule "B" to this Order in Council; and
- (f) subdivide the Leederville District as defined and described in Part II of Schedule "A" to this Order in Council into the several districts specified and defined in Schedule "C" to this Order in Council.

IT is hereby notified that the Hon. Where the area of the land on which the proposed burning is to take place exceeds one-half an acre, bush may only be burnt provided that a permit to burn is first obtained from an officer appointed by the Fire Brigades Board under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942, and amendments, and stationed within the Metropolitan Fire District as defined under that Act and that the conditions prescribed in the permit are complied with.

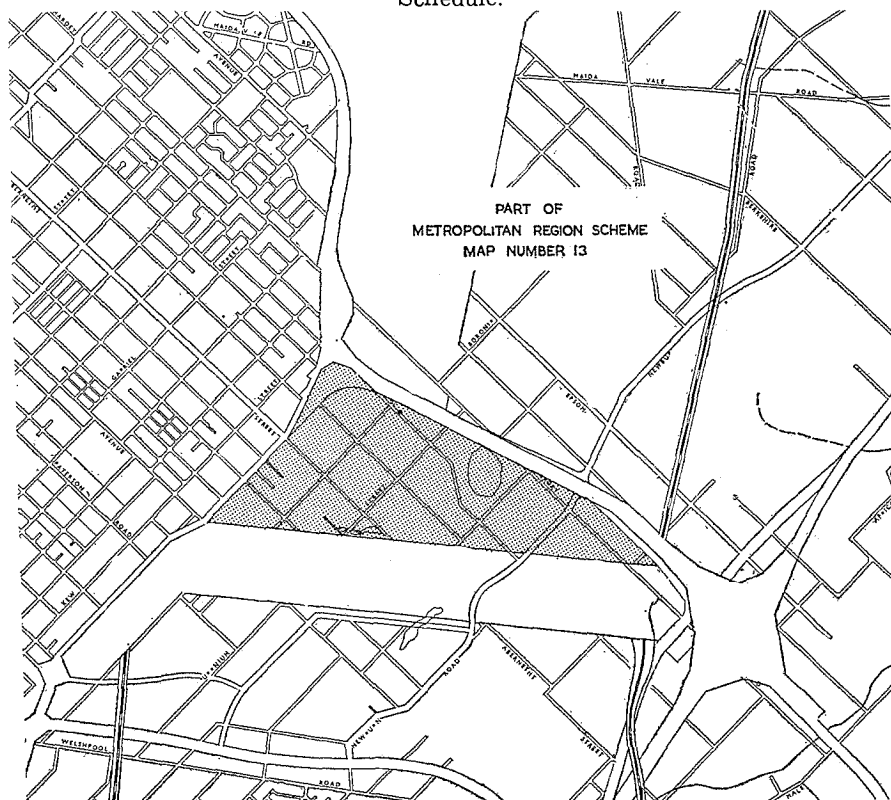
