At a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth, on the 28th day of September 1965 the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964, that, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of that section, the municipal districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council adjust the boundaries of a fire district; and whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th August, 1963, the Governor did adjust the boundaries of the Metropolitan Fire District by (*inter alia*) substituting that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Gosnells described in the First Schedule to that Order in Council; and whereas it is deemed expedient to further adjust the boundaries of the Metropolitan Fire District: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Metropolitan Fire District which district is referred to in column one of Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Gosnells described in the schedule to the said Order in Council so published on the 16th August, 1963, the portion of the municipal district of that Shire set out in the schedule to this Order in Council.

Gosnells Fire District.

westernmost corner of that location; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that location and onwards to the north-western boundary of location 11; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the westernmost corner of lot 30 of location 11 as shown on Land Titles Office Diagram 18609; thence south-easterly along the south-western boundary of that lot to its southernmost corner; thence south-easterly to the westernmost corner of lot 105 of location 11 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3380; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern side of Park Road to the northern alignment of Kenwick Road; thence generally easterly along that alignment to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the south-eastern side of Lalor Road; thence south-westerly to and along that side to the eastern side of Belmont Road; thence southerly along that side to the north-western boundary of lot 2 of location 13 as shown on Land Titles Office diagram 263; thence north-easterly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot to the northern corner of lot 3; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that lot and the south-western side of Kelvin Road and onwards to the southern side of Maddington Road; thence westerly and south-westerly along that side to the north-eastern side of Weston Street; thence south-easterly along that side and onwards to the south-eastern side of Helm Street; thence south-westerly along that side to the northern corner of location 14; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of that location and onwards to and along the north-eastern side of Lewis Road (road number 11470) and onwards to the south-eastern side of Station Street (road number 4494); thence south-westerly along that side to the right bank of the Canning River; thence generally south-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the south-eastern side of a road passing along the south-eastern boundary of lot 1045 of location 16 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2568; thence generally south-westerly to and along that side, the south-eastern side of Astley Street (road number 10485) and onwards to and along the south-eastern side of Eileen Street to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the centre line of Corfield Street; thence generally north-westerly to and along that centre line and the centre line of Prince Street to the centre line of Fremantle Road (road number 304); thence generally north-westerly along that centre line and the centre line of Spencer Road (road number 125) to the centre line of Hume Road; thence south-westerly along that centre line to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of lot 28 of location 17 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 6844; thence generally north-westerly to and along north-eastern boundaries of that lot and location 1749 (Reserve 24981) and onwards to the centre line of Berehaven Avenue; thence generally north-easterly along that centre line to the centre line of Spencer Road aforesaid; thence generally north-westerly along that centre line to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern side of Spring Road; thence generally north-easterly to and along that side and the western side of Royal Street to the centre line of Rupert Street (road number 6247); thence generally north-westerly along that centre line and onwards to and along the centre line of Wimbledon Street to the southern alignment of Albany Highway; thence westerly along that alignment to the centre line of Highbury Crescent; thence southerly, generally south-westerly and north-westerly along that centre line to the south-eastern side of Nicholson Road; thence generally south-westerly along that side to the right bank of the Canning River aforesaid; thence generally north-westerly downwards along that bank to the north-western boundary of location 6, a point on the boundary of the Shire of Gosnells aforesaid, and thence generally north-easterly along that Shire boundary to the starting point. Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 14 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, classify explosives and declare any specified explosive to be an authorised explosive for the purposes of that Act and that the Governor shall not so classify or declare any explosive until he has defined the composition, quality and character of that explosive; but such definition in respect of the explosive is not required to be published in the Order in Council classifying that explosive; and whereas it is further enacted that an Order in Council made under the said section may be cancelled or from time to time varied by a subsequent Order in Council; and whereas certain explosives were declared authorised explosives by an Order in Council made by the Governor on the 22nd day of July, 1964, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 31st day of July, 1964; and whereas it is deemed expedient to vary that Order in Council in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Explosives and Dangerous Goods Act, 1961, do hereby vary the abovementioned Order in Council by—

- (a) deleting therefrom the word "Nil" under the heading CLASS 2—NITRATE MIXTURE, and adding thereto under that heading the explosive specified in Part A of the Schedule hereunder; and
- (b) adding thereto under the heading CLASS 3—NITRO-COMPOUND in the Divisions stated, the explosives specified in Part B of the Schedule hereunder,

and declare those explosives to be authorised explosives for the purposes of the said Act, with effect from and including the day of the publication of notice of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*.

- (ii) to bulldoze or otherwise clear of all inflammable materials, firebreaks not less than fifteen feet wide, around the perimeter of all bush land which has been bulldozed or otherwise prepared for clearing by means of burning, and to ensure that all debris resultant therefrom is placed on the side of such firebreaks which adjoin the areas intended to be burned;
- (iii) to clear of any accumulation of inflammable materials—
 - (a) the immediate surrounds of all farm buildings and haystacks;
 - (b) all townsite lots within the Shire;

and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks and areas clear of all inflammable material until the 1st day of April, 1966.

Mt. Marshall Shire Council.

Notice to All Owners and/or Occupiers of Land within the Shire of Mt. Marshall.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 33 of the above Act, all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Mt. Marshall are hereby required on or before the 21st day of October, 1965, to clear firebreaks 10 feet wide inside and along the boundaries of all cleared land on each location, and thereafter to maintain such firebreaks clear of all inflammable material until the 30th day of April, 1966. Where any of the above specified land adjoins a railway reserve the firebreaks shall be double the above width inside and along the common boundary between the land and railway reserve.

Townsites.

If buildings are erected on the land, such buildings shall on or before the 21st day of October, 1965, be immediately surrounded by a firebreak at least three feet in width, such firebreak to be maintained clear of all inflammable material until the 30th day of April, 1966.

Maximum penalty for non-compliance with this order £100.

Firebreaks.

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, notice is hereby given that all owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of West Arthur must prepare firebreaks before 12th November, 1965.

The firebreaks are not to be less than six (6) feet wide, and must be provided around all clearing within farm boundaries, and within 5 chains of the perimeter of any building or group of buildings or hay stacks.

IT is hereby notified for Public information, in accordance with section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1962 that the Hon. the Minister for Town Planning approved the Shire of Bassendean Town Planning Scheme No. 1. South of Walter Road Town Planning Scheme, on the 1st day of October, 1965.

SHIRE OF BASSENDEAN.

Town Planning Scheme No. 1.

South of Walter Road Scheme.

RESOLVED that the Bassendean Shire Council in pursuance of Section 7 of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), prepare the above Town Planning Scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the Shire of Bassendean and enclosed within the inner edge of a blue border on a plan now produced to the council and marked and certified by the Shire Clerk under his hand dated the 22nd July, 1964, as Plan No. 1 and Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4.

Details of Scheme.

1. Responsible Authority: The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Bassendean (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. Area: The Scheme shall apply to the lands contained within blue borders on Plan No. 1 and on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4. The said lands are collectively referred to as "the Area".

3. General Objects: The general objects of the Scheme are—

- (a) To improve and develop the Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make provision for the better use of the land within the Area for building purposes.
- (c) To make better provision for roads and traffic within the Area.
- (d) To drain the low lying land within the Area.

4. Works to be Carried Out: The following works shall be carried out within the Area:—

- (a) The Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4.
- (b) The lands shown as roads on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 of which the proposed carriageway is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earth works undertaken.
- (c) The area shall be drained and all necessary drainage works shall be carried out.
- (d) The land coloured light blue on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 shall be set aside for drainage reserves and drainage works shall be undertaken.
- (e) The rights-of-way shown on Plan No. 1 and not shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 shall be closed and the land shall form part of the lots or used for the purposes shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4.
- (f) The land the subject of the drainage reserves shown on Plan No. 1 and not shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 shall cease to be drainage reserves and shall form part of the lots or used for the purposes shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4.

5. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

6. Valuations: The land within the Area shown on Plan No. 1 with the exception of the rights-of-way (hereinafter called "the acquired land") shall be valued as at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme.

7. The lots created by the re-survey of the Area in accordance with Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this Scheme have been carried out.

8. The valuation shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to

ascertain the unimproved value as defined by Section 533 (3) of the Local Government Act, 1960-1962.

9. Costs of Scheme: The costs of the Scheme shall be as follows:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of the works to be carried out.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under clause 23 hereof.
- (e) The costs of acquisition of any land within the Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.

10. Net Cost per lot: The sum total of the costs of the Scheme and the value of the "acquired land" ascertained in accordance with clause 6 shall be divided by the number of new lots created by the re-survey as shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4. The resultant figure shall be the "net cost per lot" of the Scheme.

11. In ascertaining the value of the "acquired land" for the purpose of clause 10 if any compensation or other payment has been made or estimated under sub-clauses (c), (d) or (e) of clause 9 the amount of such compensation or payment shall be substituted for the value of such land ascertained in pursuance of clause 6 in respect of which the payment was made or estimated.

12. New Lots: (1) The "new lots" on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 shown in Column No. 2 of the Schedule hereto shall be offered to the owners of the "old lots" or portions thereof being portions of the "acquired land" on Plan No. 1 shown opposite in Column No. 1 of the Schedule. The offer shall be made on the basis that the owner shall in respect of each new lot so offered pay to or be paid by the Council a sum of money ascertained as hereinafter appears.

(2) The average value of each new lot on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 shall be ascertained.

(3) In ascertaining the amount payable by or to be paid to an owner who is offered a new lot in accordance with the terms of this Scheme the owner shall be—

- (a) credited with the value of the land resumed or acquired from him as ascertained by clause 6.
- (b) debited with the "net cost per lot" of the Scheme as ascertained by clause 10.
- (c) credited or debited as the case may be with the amount by which the lot offered to him is less than or exceeds the average value of the new lots within the area as ascertained by clause 12 (2).

13. Nature of Offers: The offers mentioned in clause 12 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot the subject of the offer and the old lot or part thereof in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

If a new lot is one on which a drainage line is or is to be situated as shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4 the new lot shall be offered subject to the condition that the owner shall grant to the Council a drainage easement over so much of the said lot as is shown as a drainage line on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4; or if the Council shall have already granted an easement to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage & Drainage Board then the offer will be subject to that easement.

14. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

15. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall subject to clause 25 hereof be deemed to have been rejected. No acceptance of the offer shall be deemed a valid acceptance unless all rates and taxes owned by the owner in respect of land within the Area have been paid.

16. If the offer be accepted it shall be accepted by the owner in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims for compensation in respect of the resumption from him of the old lot in respect of which the offer was made and otherwise in respect of the operation of this Scheme.

17. Registration of Transfers: The Council shall cause to be prepared and sent to those owners entitled transfers in respect of each offer of a replacement lot which has been accepted by the owner in accordance with this Scheme. If an owner shall fail to complete the transfer in accordance with the Transfer of Land Act 1893-1959 to make the payment of the amount payable by him and return the Transfer to the Council for registration within twenty-eight (28) days after having been called upon to do so by notice served by registered post on the owner at his address last known to the Council (which notice may be served with the transfer) the Council may rescind any agreement whereby such owner is entitled to have the land the subject of the transfer transferred to him and thereupon such owner shall have a claim against the Council only for compensation for the resumption of the land in respect of which the offer of the replacement lot or lots was made and the land the subject of the transfer shall be treated as a rejected lot.

18. Rejected Lots: If an owner does not accept an offer made to him by the Council in accordance with this Scheme or fails to complete a transfer of the said lot in manner aforesaid the Council may deal with the lots so affected as hereinafter appears.

19. Sale of Rejected Lots: The Council may sell the rejected lots either by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

20. Valuation of Rejected Lots: The Council may instead of selling all or any of the rejected lots ascertain the value of them or those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and may be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

21. Profits of Scheme: In the event of the Scheme showing a profit the amount of such profit shall be equally divided among the replacement lots and shall be paid to the owners who have accepted the offers mentioned in clause 12 hereof. The amount of profit referable to the sale of rejected lots shall be paid to the Council.

22. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation: Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of this Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under clause 17 hereof whichever is the later.

23. Estimate of Compensation: In the event of any claim for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this Scheme the Council may estimate the amount of Compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the Scheme with the net amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

24. Encumbrances on Title: In the event of any land in the Area being subject to a registered mortgage charge or lease or to a caveat to protect the interest of the purchaser mortgagee Chargee or lessee the Council shall not transfer a new lot to the owner unless subject to similar encumbrances or with the consent of all persons entitled to the benefit of the encumbrance.

25. Powers of Council: The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:—

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Area.
- (b) To enter into Agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Area.
- (c) To extend the time within which any offer of replacement lots may be accepted.
- (d) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the area.
- (e) To dispose of any lots to which it becomes entitled as the owner of land within the Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the condition the buildings of a specified character shall within a limited period be constructed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (f) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensation or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (g) If an owner is offered more than one replacement lot and does not desire to accept all lots offered to enter into such agreements with the owner as seem to the Council to be equitable.
- (h) To demolish the buildings in the Area which are shown on Plan No. 1 but which are not shown on Approved Planning Scheme Map No. 4.
- (i) To grant drainage and sewerage easements and dispose of land subject to such easements.
