WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1959, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to revest in Her Majesty as of Her former estate all or any lands, whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietor; and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the land described in the schedule hereto: Now, therefore I, the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revest in Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors the land described in the Schedule hereto as of Her former estate.
