- (6) The local authority or duly authorised bush fire control officer may refuse to issue a permit or may grant a permit subject to such conditions or requisitions as he considers necessary and specifies in the Where a permit subject to specipermit. fied conditions or requisitions is issued a person shall not carry out the burning authorised by the permit unless he complies with the conditions and requisitions specified.
- (7) The area to be burned on any one day under any one permit shall not exceed the area specified by the issuing officer of the permit to burn contained in accordance with paragraph 3.
