WHEREAS it is enacted by section 17 of the Courts of Session Act, 1921, that the Governor may, by proclamation, *inter alia*, fix the times at which periodical sittings of Courts of Session shall be held: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the days appearing in the third column of the Schedule hereto as the days on which the periodical sittings of the Courts of Session Division appearing in the correspondingly opposite position in the first column thereof at the places mentioned in the second column, shall commence, during the year 1966.

SUPREME COURT ACT, 1935-1964.

### Rule of Court.

(Sittings and Winter Vacation for 1966.)

WE, the Honourable Sir Albert Asher Wolff, K.C.M.G., Chief Justice of Western Australia, the Honourable Sir Lawrence Walter Jackson, Kt., Senior Puisne Judge, and the Honourable John Evenden Virtue, the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, the Honourable Gordon Bede D'Arcy, the Honourable John Hale, and the Honourable Oscar Joseph Negus, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance of the powers contained in the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1964, and the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, and of every other power enabling us in this behalf, hereby order as follows:—

### 1.—CIVIL SITTINGS.

The Civil Sittings of the Supreme Court for the trial of actions and issues of fact during the year 1966 shall be eleven in number and shall commence on the days hereunder mentioned, that is to say—

Tuesday, 1st March.  
Tuesday, 5th April.  
Tuesday, 3rd May.  
Tuesday, 7th June.  
Tuesday, 19th July.

## 2.—FULL COURT.

The Sittings of the Full Court for the year 1966 shall be eight in number, and shall commence on the third Tuesday in the months of March, April, May, June, August, September, October and November.

The Full Court shall sit on such other days, or at such other times as the Full Court may think fit to sit.

## 3.—CIRCUIT COURTS.

(a) Sittings of the Supreme Court in the respective circuit districts referred to in the table hereunder, for the transaction of all such business as may be brought before it, shall be held during the year 1966 at the places and commencing on the days shown in the said table.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, this 8th day of December, 1965, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fisheries Act, 1905-1965.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section 35G of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1965, it is provided (*inter alia*) that every person to whom a processor's license is granted, and every licensee of a processor's of a processor's license that is renewed, shall pay to the Director as an annual fee for that license a sum calculated on the gross amount of the value of the fish caught, and the moneys paid or payable for fish purchased, for processing in the processing establishment during the period ending the thirtieth day of June next preceding the commencement of that year equal to such percentage, not exceeding one per centum, of that gross amount as the Governor by Order in Council determines; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the Governor determine the percentage of that gross amount as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the percentage of the gross amount of the value of the fish caught, and the moneys paid or payable for fish purchased, for processing in a processing establishment during the period hereinbefore referred to payable as an annual fee for a processor's license, shall be three-quarters per centum of that gross amount.

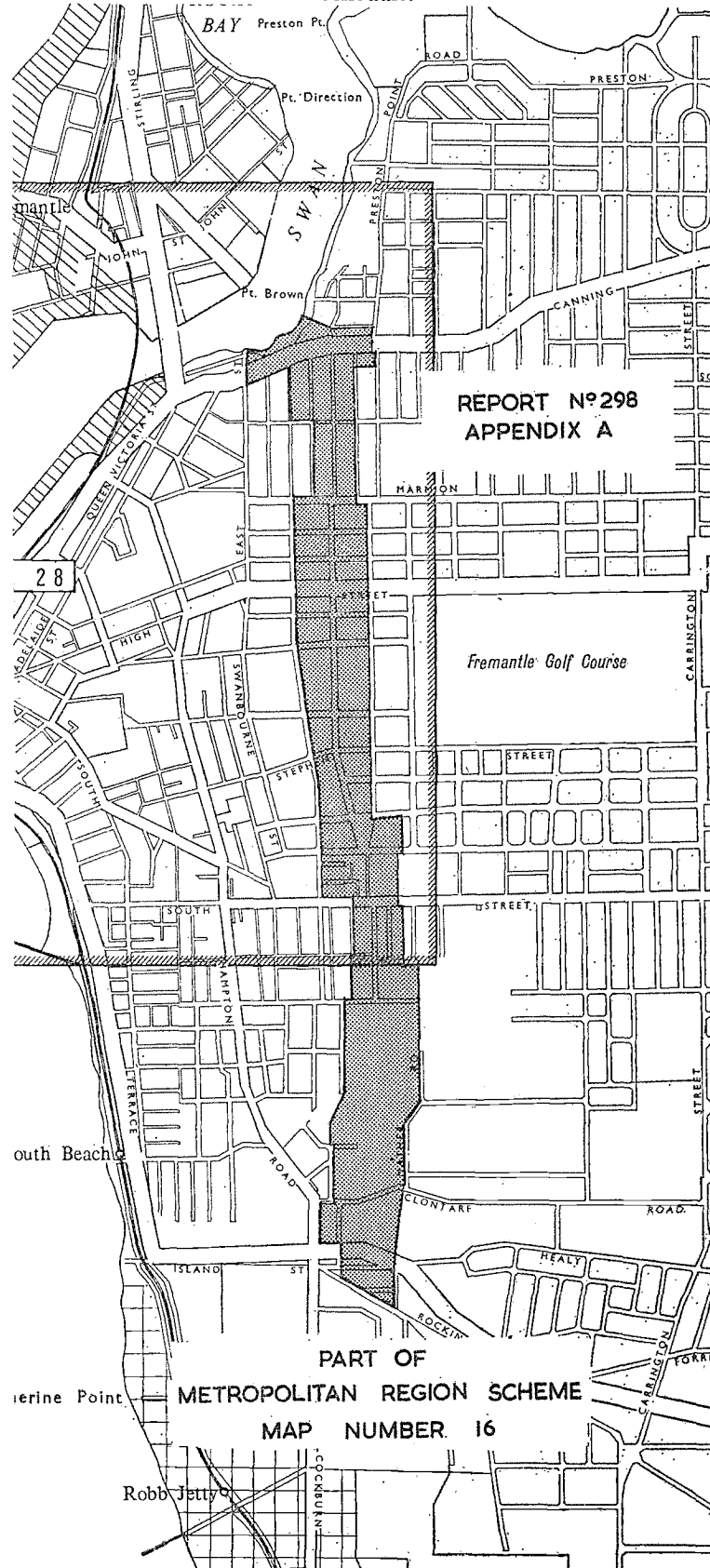
