(3a) Identification tablets or number plates issued in respect of a farm vehicle for which a license is issued, under section 11 of the Act without payment of a fee, shall have indicated thereon the characters prescribed by subregulation (2) or subregulation (3), as the case may require, of this regulation together with, but below, those characters, the word, "FARM", in lettering approximately 2 in. in height.

Strong Wind Warning Signals.

IT is hereby notified for the information of mariners and persons in charge of small craft particularly, that when a strong wind warning has been issued by the Perth Weather Bureau, and winds with a speed in excess of 20 knots are forecast, the following signals will be exhibited from the mast of the Signal Station situated on top of the Port Authority administration building:—

By Day—A red square flag over a black diamond shape.

By Night—A green light over a red light suspended perpendicular six feet apart.

The foregoing signal will remain exhibited until otherwise directed by the Harbour Master.

3. From Industrial Zone provisions delete existing clause (b) and insert in lieu:—

(b) No person shall in a light industrial zone or a general industrial zone use the land between the set back line and the street alignment for any purpose except one or more of the following:—

- (i) a means of access,
- (ii) for loading and unloading of vehicles,

- (iii) for lawns and gardens,
- (iv) the daily parking of vehicles used by customers,
- (v) for trade display purposes approved by the Council. Such trade display must not cover more than one-fifth of the area and must not be within 10ft. of the road or street.
