WHEREAS by section 15 of the Pig Industry Compensation Act, 1942-1965, it is provided that in respect of every sale of any pig or carcass there shall be payable stamp duty of such amount as the Governor may by proclamation prescribe; and whereas by proclamation dated the 7th December, 1960, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 16th December, 1960, the stamp duty payable in respect of every such sale was prescribed to be one half-penny for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings; and whereas it is deemed expedient to cancel that proclamation and in lieu thereof to make this proclamation prescribing other provisions as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby cancel the proclamation so published and do hereby proclaim in lieu thereof that the stamp duty payable on every sale of any pig or carcass shall until the 14th February, 1966, be one half-penny for every pound or part of a pound exceeding ten shillings, and on and after that date be one-fifth of a cent for every dollar or part of a dollar exceeding fifty cents,—

- (a) of the amount of the purchase money in respect of one pig or one carcass sold singly; or
- (b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of pigs or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot;

but so that the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one pig or any one carcass, as the case may be, whether sold singly or as part of a lot, shall not exceed five shillings, or on and after the 14th February, 1966, fifty cents.

WHEREAS section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1963, provides that the Governor in Council may vest in Heads of Departments, or other officers or persons within the State, power to make minor appointments; and whereas it is desirable that power of appointment of foremen and other persons employed at a daily rate of wage on works under the control of the Department of Public Works, and of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage (exclusive of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board) should be vested in Brian O'Connell: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby vests in Brian O'Connell the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed on such works at a daily rate of wage.

Child Welfare Act, 1947-1962.

WHEREAS by section 19 (2) (a) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947-1962, it is provided that the Governor may appoint such persons, male or female, as he may think fit, to be members of any particular Children's Court and may determine the respective seniorities of such members; and whereas by section 19 (1) (b) (ii) of the said Act the Governor may amend, vary or revoke any such appointment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby appoint the persons named in the First Schedule hereto to be Members of the Children's Court at the place mentioned and doth hereby revoke the appointments of the persons named in the Second Schedule hereto as Members of the Children's Court at the place mentioned.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1964, that, subject to the provisions of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by order in council adjust the boundaries of a fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby adjust the boundaries of Moora Fire District which is referred to in column one of Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act by substituting for the Road District of Moora set out in column two of such Part opposite the Moora Fire District as amended by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th November, 1944, the portion of land described and set out in the schedule to this Order in Council.

Schedule.

Moora Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the north-western corner of Moora Town Lot 219 and extending easterly along the southern side of McKinley Street and onwards to the western side of the Moora-Geraldton Railway; thence southerly along that side to the southern side of Clarke Street; thence easterly along the prolongation of the lastmentioned side to the eastern side of Tootra Street; thence southerly along that side to the north-western corner of Lot 196 of Melbourne Location 908 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3553; thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot and southerly along the eastern boundary of lot 195 and onwards to the northern boundary of reserve 4131; thence easterly along that boundary and onwards to the south-western corner of Lot 220; thence generally northerly along the western boundaries of that lot and northerly, easterly and southerly along boundaries of Lot 219 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of lot 158; thence easterly to and along that boundary to the north-western corner of Lot 174; thence southerly and easterly

along boundaries of that lot to the western side of Ranfurly Street; thence southerly along that side to the northern side of Atbara Street; thence westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation northerly of the eastern boundary of Lot 16 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3223; thence southerly and westerly along boundaries of that lot to the north-eastern corner of Lot 20; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of that lot and Lot 21 and westerly along the southern boundary of the lastmentioned lot to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the south-western boundary of Lot 13; thence south-easterly to and along that boundary to the northern corner of Lot 24; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along boundaries of that lot to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the south-eastern boundary of Lot 37; thence south-westerly to and along that boundary and the south-eastern boundary of lot 88 as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 3166 and onwards to the south-western side of Geraldton Highway; thence north-westerly along that side to the southern side of Sheridan Street; thence westerly along that side and onwards to the western side of Padbury Street; thence northerly along that side to the southern side of Stack Street; thence westerly along that side to the eastern side of Long Street and thence generally northerly along that side, the eastern boundary of Lot 164 and again the eastern side of Long Street to the starting point.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and
Drainage Act, 1909-1963.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 361832/65.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1963, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Board to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply and Main Drainage.

Shire of Perth.

Yokine No. 1 Artesian Bore (Homer Street) 18-inch Diameter Pressure Main and Ancillary Works.

(a) The sinking of an artesian bore to an approximate depth of 2,500 feet using 12-inch, 10-inch and possibly 8-inch diameter casing together with all necessary valves and appurtenances.

(b) The construction of an 18-inch diameter composite steel and concrete pressure main (length approximately 6,050 feet) complete with all necessary valves and appurtenances.

(c) The construction of a compensating basin complete with all necessary structures and appurtenances.

(d) The construction of an open drain outlet (length approximately 2,600 feet) complete with all necessary appurtenances.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 31st day of December, 1965.

Bunbury Water Board—Proposed Loan of £52,225.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 317/53.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, a Water Board may with the approval of the Governor, borrow money for the construction of works for the storage, distribution and supply of water: Now, therefore His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby approves, under the provisions of section 113 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1964, of the Bunbury Water Board borrowing the sum of fifty two thousand two hundred and twenty five pounds (£52,225) from the Commonwealth Savings Bank, repayable with interest by thirty (30) half-yearly instalments over a period of fifteen (15) years, with interest at the rate of five pounds fifteen shillings (£5 15s.) per annum for the purpose of financing the works referred to as Bunbury Water Board Plan No. 136, and approved by Order in Council on 24th November, 1965, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd December, 1965, subject to the said works being commenced not later than the first day of July, 1966.

- (b) Where the land of an owner or occupier abuts on Crown Land or Reserve the owner or occupier has cleared a firebreak not less than six (6) feet wide, on the Crown Lands or Reserve along the common boundary.

2. Townsite Lands.

(a) Townsite Lots having an area of not more than a half acre shall be completely cleared of all debris of an inflammable nature and maintained free of such material.

(b) On Townsite Lots having an area of more than half acre, firebreaks not less than 6 feet in width shall be provided and maintained inside and along the boundaries of the lots. Where several adjoining lots are held or used by the one owner and/or occupier, the firebreaks may be provided inside and along the external boundaries of the group of lots.

If for any reason it is considered impracticable to comply with any provision of this notice, a written application for a variation may be made to the Shire Council and must reach the Shire Clerk by 21st December, 1965.

Any such application must bear the signature of the fire control officer of the area signifying this agreement to the variation. If permission for variation is not granted the terms of this notice must be complied with.

The penalty for failure to comply with this notice is a fine of not less than £5 nor more than £100 in addition to which the Council may have the work carried out and may recover the cost of such work from the owner and/or occupier.
