PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas TO WIT, SAnthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the DOUGLAS ANTHONY KENDREW, Governor. EL.S.J Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honour-Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the monwealth of Australia.

L.G. 222/58.

WHEREAS it is provided (inter alia) by subsection (2) of section 70 of the Local Govern-ment Act, 1960-1965, that where the fourth Saturday in May of a year is a day fixed for the taking of the votes of electors upon a proposed law for the alteration of the Com-monwealth of Australia Constitution Act, the Gov-ernor may, by proclamation published in the Gov-ernor fagette, apoint another Saturday in May of that year, being a Saturday before the fourth Saturday of that month, to be the day for the hold-ing of the annual municipal elections to be held in that year; and whereas it now appears that the fourth Saturday in May of the year nineteen hun-dred and sixty-six is a day fixed for the taking of the votes of electors upon a proposed law for the alteration of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said subsection, do hereby appoint Saturday the 14th day of May, 1966, to be the day for the holding of the annual municipal elections to be held in that vear.

> Local Government Act, 1960. City of Fremantle. Annexation of Outlying Land. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 825/65.

WHEREAS it is provided in subsection (1) of sec-tion 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may, upon presentation to him of a petition from the council of the municipality and at least twenty, or a majority, whichever is the lesser number, of the owners of land within an area of outlying land adjoining the district, and mex that area of outlying land to a district; and whereas there is an area of outlying land adjoin-ing the district of the Municipality of the City of Fremantle as set forth in the schedule hereto; and whereas there are, in fact, no owners of land other than the Crown within the area concerned; and whereas the Council of the Municipality of the City of Fremantle has presented a petition to the Governor in accordance with the provisions of the said section; and whereas it is considered desirable to annex to the district of the City of Fre-mantle the said area of outlying land: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by the said Act doth hereby annex to the district of the Municipality of the City of Fremantle, to form part of the City, Central and South Wards respect-ively to the event ively to the extent that the outlying land abuts thereon, the land described in the schedule hereto.

Declaration of the Extension of the Boundaries of the Townsite of Gnowangerup.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section six hundred and eighty-six of the Local Government Act, 1960, that the Governor may by order, declare land, including land which is privately owned and subdivided to be a townsite, and may vary the boundaries of a townsite; and whereas the boundaries of the Townsite of Gnowangerup where declared by proclamation published in the Government Gazette of the 17th January, 1956; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the boundaries of the said townsite should be varied: Now, therefore, His Excellency, the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said section six hundred and eighty-six, doth hereby declare the land described in the schedule hereto to be an extension of the boundaries of the Townsite of Gnowangerup.

Redivision into Wards and Increase in Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 318/54.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (g), (h) and (j) of subsection (2) of section 12 of the Local Government Act, 1960, that upon the presentation to him of a petition under the Common Seal of

the municipality, the Governor may abolish wholly wards in a district and determine and alter the number of offices of councillor assigned to a municipality; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of the said section that the Governor may give such orders as he thinks necessary to give effect to an alteration in the number of members or to an alteration in the number of Wards; and whereas it is further provided in paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 20 of the said Act that upon the exercise of a power conferred by section 12 the Governor may direct who, if any, of the members whose district is affected shall go out of office and when, and may direct the holding on a day appointed by the order of an election of such members so affected as the case requires; and whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu has presented a petition under its Common Seal praying that the existing Wards shall be abolished and that four new Wards shall be created, being designated the central, North, South and East Wards respectively with boundaries as described in the Schedule hereto, and with Councillors assigned to each Ward as follows:-

Central Ward—3. North Ward—3. South Ward—2.

East Ward-3.

And whereas it is considered expedient that the prayer of the petition should be granted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby—

- (a) abolish the existing Wards of the Municipality of the Shire of Dalwallinu;
- (b) create four new Wards to be known as the Central, North, South and East Wards respecively, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto;
- (c) determine the number of offices of Councillor assigned to the municipality to be eleven allocated to the respective Wards as follows:—

Central Ward—3, North Ward—3, South Ward—2, East Ward—3;

(d) direct that all of the existing members of the Dalwallinu Shire Council shall retire from office on the 14th day of May, 1966, and further direct that on that day an election shall be held to return eleven members.
