WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the State: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid do by this the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer as from the date of my departure upon the said absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963 that the Governor may by proclamation declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any Reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Welfare Act, 1963 and published in the Government Gazette on the 12th April, 1961, the Governor declared an area at Gascoyne Junction more particularly described as Reserve 25868 and defined in the Schedule to such proclamation to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said Reserve: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 18 of the Native Welfare Act, 1963, do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclemation withinhead the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 12th April, 1961 as aforesaid.

And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Gascoyne Junction: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all that portion of land, Gascoyne Location 26, to be a Reserve for Natives. (No. 27778.)

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, the Governor may by Proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class "A" any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said sections: and whereas it is despecified in the said sections: purposes specified in the said sections: and whereas it is deemed expedient that the addition to Class "A" Reserve 9868 (Swan District) "Protection and Preservation of Caves and Flora, and for Health and Pleasure Resort," comprising Swan Location 7953 should be classified as of Class "A": Now therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation classify as of Class "A" the addition to Class "A" Reserve 9868, comprising Swan Location 7953 and increase the area of the said Reserve to 6281 acres 3 roods 23 perches accord-Reserve to 6281 acres 3 roods 23 perches accordingly.
