## Stamp Act, 1921-1965. PROCLAMATION

#### WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas DOUGLAS ANTHONY | Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the KENDREW, TO WIT, Governor. [L.S.] L.S.] Most Excellent Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the Second Schedule to the Stamp Act, 1921-1965, and section 4 and the First Schedule to the Decimal Currency Act, 1965, that, on and after the 14th day of February, 1966, the stamp duty payable on any statement written out or caused to be written out by the owner or his agent pursuant to the provisions of the Cattle Industry Compensation Act, 1965, in respect of the sale of any cattle or carcasses of cattle, whether payment of the purchase money therefor is or is not made in full at the time of the sale or is to be made by instalments or is otherwise deferred, shall be, for every \$1 and also for any fractional part of \$1—

- (a) of the purchase money in respect of one animal or one carcass sold singly; or
- (b) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of cattle or carcasses, as the case may be sold in one lot,

five-twelfths of a cent or such amount, not being more than five-twelfths of a cent, as the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation, declare; and whereas it is further enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions hereinbefore referred to, on and after the 14th day of February, 1966, the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one animal, or any one carcass, whether sold singly or as part of a lot shall not exceed the sum of fifty cents or such lesser sum as the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation declare; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, desirable that amounts be so declared: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts first and second abovementioned and section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1962, do hereby declare that, as from and including the 14th day of February, 1966—

- (a) the stamp duty payable for every \$1 and also for any fractional part of \$1---
  - (i) of the purchase money in respect of one animal or one carcass sold singly; or
  - (ii) of the total amount of the purchase money in respect of any number of cattle or carcasses, as the case may be, sold in one lot, shall be one-fifth of a cent; and
- (b) not withstanding the last preceding paragraph, the stamp duty in respect of the amount of the purchase money of any one animal, or any one carcass, whether sold singly or as part of a lot shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five cents.

## Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949. PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949 (*inter alia*) that the Governor may by proclamation vest in the Minister the moneys held for any charitable purpose by or on behalf of any association on being satisfied that a majority of at least three-fourths in number of the persons who are trustees or who have the control of the moneys have consented thereto; and whereas the trustees of the Queen Elizabeth II Coronation Gift Fund Trust Incorporated, being the trustees of a fund held by that association for charitable purposes, have satisfied me that at least three-fourths of them consent to the moneys, securities for moneys, and goods held by the Queen Elizabeth II Coronation Gift Fund Trust Incorporated for the charitable purpose of conducting medical research for the benefit of, and primarily upon the ante and post natal care of, mothers and children of this State being vested under, and for the purposes of, the said Act in James Frederick Craig, the Minister of the Crown to whom for the time being the said Act is com-mitted: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting under the provisions contained in that section and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vest the said moneys, securities for moneys, and goods in the said James Frederick Craig, to be held upon the trusts upon which they were held prior to their being so vested.

#### STATE PUBLIC SERVICE. Public Service Salaries Agreement Amendment, 1966.

#### (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1966.)

THIS Agreement to be known as the Public Service Salaries Agreement Amendment, 1966 (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1966), made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1963, this 28th day of January, 1966, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter referred to as the "Association") of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Commissioner") of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

Whereas the parties hereto being the parties to an Agreement (P.S.C. No. 1 of 1963), dated the 26th day of March, 1963, and published in the Government Gazette (No. 32), dated the 3rd day of May, 1963, and as amended by P.S.C. No. 2 of 1963 and P.S.C. No. 1 of 1965, (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Agreement"), have mutually agreed that the principal Agreement shall be and the same is hereby varied in the manner following, that is to say:—

1. Clause 3-Area and Scope.

Delete the existing clause and substitute the following new clause:—

#### Clause 3—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers employed under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904-1963, whose maximum margins over the basic rate are less than \$3,996 (£1,998) per annum: Provided that persons temporarily employed shall be subject to the rates of pay and to the exclusions referred to in clause 23 of this Agreement.

2. Clause 4—Basic Rate: Interpretation. Delete the existing clause and substitute the following:—

Clause 4—Basic Rate: Interpretation.

(a) In this Agreement the term "basic rate" means in the case of—

(i) Male Officers-

the nearest dollar (\$) (pound  $(\pounds)$ ) to the result obtained by multiplying the male basic wage as declared from time to time by the Industrial Commission of Western Australia, by 52 1/6th;

(ii) Female Officers-

seventy-five per cent. (75%) to the nearest dollar (\$) (pound (£)) of the male basic rate as determined in paragraph (i) of this subclause.

3. Clause 5—Male Officers: Classes and Grades. Delete the existing clause and substitute the following new clause:—

Clause 5—Male Officers: Classes and Grades.

The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay expressed in this Agreement is the rate payable under the provisions of subclause (a) of Clause 8 to a male clerical division officer at the age of 26 years or during the sixth year of adult service. This rate was determined on the 8th January, 1965, at a margin of \$960 (£480) per annum over the basic rate.

17. Clause 20.-Adjustment of Rates of Pay

(b) the margin of \$960 (£480) per annum payable to an officer at age 26 years or in the sixth year of adult service in the male clerical automatic range as precribed in subclause (a) of clause 8.

Provided that if the amount determined would result in an adjustment of less than  $10 (\pounds 5)$  per annum from the current adjustment, if any, no variation shall be made.

- (ii) Male officers in receipt of rates of pay below a margin of \$960 (£480) per annum
  - that proportion, to the nearest \$ (£) of the adjustment applicable to male officers on a margin of \$960 (£480) per annum, which the appropriate gross rate of pay (margin plus basic rate) bears to the gross rate of pay (margin plus basic rate) payable in the metropolitan area to a male clerical officer at age 26 years or in the sixth year of adult service in the male clerical automatic range.
- (iii) Female officers in receipt of a margin of \$748 (£374) per annum and above—
  - Seventy-five per cent. (75%)to the nearest \$ (£) of the adjustment applicable to male officers on a margin of \$960 (£480) per annum, provided that female professional and General officers who are paid the same margins as those prescribed for male professional or General officers in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (e) and (f) of clause 13, shall be subject to the same adjustments as apply to male officers on a margin of \$960 (£480) per annum.
- (iv) Female officers in receipt of rates of pay below a margin of \$748 (£374) per annum—
