AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 2nd day of February, 1966, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1933-1965.

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 3403/97.—That Reserve No. 4569 (Kojonup District) should vest in and be held by The Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia, in trust for the purpose of "Conservation of Flora and Fauna".

Corres. 3661/18.—That Reserve No. 17111 (Kojonup Location 4097) should vest in and be held by The Fauna Protection Advisory Committee of Western Australia, in trust for the purpose of "Conservation of Flora and Fauna".

(The Order in Council issued under Executive Council No. 498 dated 19th February, 1919, is hereby superseded.)

Corres. 4587/47, V2.—That Class "A" Reserve No. 22795 (Esperance District) should vest in and be held by the National Parks Board of Western Australia in trust for the purpose of "National Park".

Corres. 2111/63.—That Reserve No. 27821 (Nelson Locations 12782 and 12783) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Upper Blackwood in trust for the purpose of "Recreation".

Corres. 1463/60.—That Reserve No. 27987 (Swan Location 7009) should vest in and be held by the Town of Melville in trust for the purpose of "Drainage".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes, aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

**ORDER IN COUNCIL.**

Corres. 5067/65.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, body corporate, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of subleasing, and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27980 (Kondinin Lot 229) should vest in and be held by the Shire of Kondinin in trust for the purpose of "Recreation (Drive-In Theatre)": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Shire of Kondinin in trust for "Recreation (Drive-In Theatre)" with power to the said Shire of Kondinin subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

"Direct Buyer" means a person who after the commencement of the Fruit Cases Act Amendment Act, 1962, purchases direct from a grower or growers an aggregate quantity of apples of not less than one hundred bushels during any period of twelve months commencing on the first day of January, for the purpose of selling the same either wholesale or retail.

"Grower" means a person by whom or on whose behalf apples are actually grown or produced for sale, and include a person who carries on the business of processing apples and a person who operates a packing shed for apples.

Every person who purchases apples direct from a grower or growers for the purpose of selling either wholesale or retail shall keep or cause to be kept a record containing the following particulars as to each purchase of apples—

- (a) the name and address of each grower from whom the apples were purchased;
- (b) the date or dates when purchased;
- (c) the prescribed grades of the apples purchased and the quantity of each prescribed grade so purchased;
- (d) such other particulars (if any) as may be prescribed.
