WHEREAS it is provided, firstly, by subsection (1) of section 79 of the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, that, where the Governor is satisfied that the law in any country makes provision for the enforcement in that country of maintenance orders made in another country, the Governor may, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, declare that country to be a reciprocating country for the purposes of Part V of the Act; and, secondly, by subsection (3) of that section that the Governor may specify, in relation to the country to which the proclamation applies, a date, which may be before or after or the same day as the date of the proclamation, and declare that maintenance orders made in that country on or after that date shall be enforceable in the State in accordance with the provisions of Division 3 of Part V of the Act; and whereas I, the Lieutenant-Governor, am satisfied that the law of each of the countries set out in the schedule to this proclamation makes provision for the enforcement in that country of maintenance orders made in another country: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Interpretation Act, 1918-1962, declare each of the countries set out in the schedule hereto to be a reciprocating country for the purposes of Part V of the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, and declare that maintenance orders made in each of those countries, on and after the respective dates on which the provisions of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921-1958, were extended to them, shall be enforceable in the State in accordance with Division 3 of that Part.

WHEREAS it is enacted, inter alia, by section two of the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, that the Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation, and that it shall not be necessary to proclaim that the whole Act shall come into operation on one day, and the several parts or sections of the Act may be proclaimed to come into operation on such respective days as are fixed by Proclamation; and whereas it now appears to me desirable tion; and whereas it now appears to me desirable and expedient that the Act, excepting sections 33 to 48, being Division 2 of Part IV of the Act, shall come into operation on the date hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 1st day of March, 1960, as the day on which the Married Persons and Children (Summary Relief) Act, 1965, excepting sections 33 to 48, inclusive, shall come excepting sections 33 to 48, inclusive, shall come into operation.

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of section 17 of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, the moneys, securities for moneys, and goods formerly held by the Queen Elizabeth II Coronation Gift Fund Trust Incorporated are vested in James Gift Fund Trust Incorporated are vested in James Frederick Craig as the Minister of the Crown to whom for the time being the administration of the said Act is committed and are held by him on trust for the charitable purpose of conducting medical research for the benefit of, and primarily upon the ante and post natal care of, mothers and children in this State; and whereas by the provisions of section 17 (2) of the said Act the Governor may by proclamation vary the trusts and may by the same proclamation vest the said moneys. by the same proclamation vest the said moneys, securities or goods or any part thereof in such persons and for such charitable purposes as the Governor shall specify; and whereas the establishment of a research laboratory for the purpose of conducting the medical research havinhefore conducting the medical research hereinbefore mentioned is a charitable purpose within the meaning of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting under the provisions of that section and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby vest the said moneys, securities for moneys, and goods in the King Edward Memorial Hospital Board, established under the provisions of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1955, for the purpose of establishing a research laboratory, to be named the Queen Elizabeth II Gift Fund Laboratory and to be maintained in perpetuity for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned.

Poisons Act. 1964. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John TO WIT, Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964, that the Governor, on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee may at any time and from time to time by proclamation prohibit the sale, supply or use of any poison or substance, whether specified in a Schodula or not either absolutely or warent those Schedule or not, either absolutely or except upon and subject to such conditions and for such period or periods as the Governor may think fit; and whereas the Advisory Committee has recommended to the Governor that the sale or supply of the substances specified in Part A of the Schedule hereunder be prohibited absolutely and that the hereunder be prohibited absolutely and that the sale, supply or use of the substances specified in Part B of that Schedule for human therapeutic use be prohibited except by special permission of the Commissioner of Public Health: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 22 of the Poisons Act, 1964, and on the recommendation of the Advisory Committee, do hereby prohibit the sale or supply of the substances hereby prohibit the sale or supply of the substances specified in Part A of the Schedule hereunder absolutely, and do hereby prohibit the sale, supply or use for human therapeutic use, of the substances specified in Part B of that Schedule except by special permission of the Commissioner of Public Health.

Part A.

AMIDOPYRINE and derivatives thereof, including DIPYRONE, METHYLCINCHOPHEN (methyl ester of phenylcinchoninic acid), ALLYLISO-PROPYLACETYLUREA, and preparations containing any of those substances.

Part B.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section five of the Stock Diseases Act, 1895-1960, that, in any case where he deems it necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction or dis-semination of disease into or in the State, the Governor may, from time to time by proclamation, prohibit or put restrictions on the introduction into the State from any other State of the Commonwealth specified in the proclamation of any infected stock or stock suspected to be infected for such specified period as may appear to him necesary or expedient for the purpose; and whereas a disease known as "Newcastle Disease" being a disease to which poultry are subject has been found in poultry in the States of New South Wales and Queensland and the Governor deems it necessary, for the purposes of preventing the introduction or dissemination of that disease into or in the State, to prohibit the introduction into this State of all poultry and all carcasses and portions of the carcasses of any poultry and all eggs of poultry

from any of the States of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania for the period hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit for a period of six months from and including the date of the publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette, the introduction into this State of all poultry and all carcasses or portions of the carcasses of any poultry and all eggs of poultry from any of the States of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania.

WHEREAS by subsection (8) of section 21 of the Coal Mine Workers (Pensions) Act, 1943-1965, it is provided (inter alia) that the Governor may from time to time by proclamation increase or decrease the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker or by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner, as provided under the said Act; and whereas it is expedient to increase the rate of contribution payable by each mine worker and each owner aforesaid: Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that-

on and after the 29th day of January, 1966, but subject to subsection (5) of section 21 of the said Act, the rates of contribution payable by each mine worker shall be twelve shillings per week and by each owner in respect of each mine worker employed by such owner two pounds five shillings per week.

Land Act, 1933-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reby Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 27998 (Wittenoom Lot 105) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Western Australia Fire Brigades Board to be held in trust for the purpose of a "Fire Station Site": Now,

therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.


