WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1961, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided and should be entered and departed from at specified places only, he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that if of opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may, by proclamation, proclaim the controlled access road and the places only at which the controlled access road may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided as hereinafter described and has made a recommendation to the Governor accordingly; and whereas, I, the Governor of the said State am of opinion that such recommendation should be given effect; now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the parcels of land coloured green in Plan M.R.D.W.A. 2545 and which together are more particularly described in schedule hereunder shall be a Controlled Access Road.

WHEREAS it is provided (*inter alia*), by section 5 of the Factories and Shops Act, 1963-1965, that "public holiday" means (in addition to the days therein specified) any day appointed by the Governor by proclamation to be a public holiday throughout the State and in relation to a district or locality includes any day so appointed to be a public holiday in the district or locality specified in the proclamation; and whereas it appears to me, the Governor, expedient that the day hereinafter mentioned should be appointed a public holiday and a half-holiday, respectively, in the parts of the State set forth hereunder: Now therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the 9th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six to be a public holiday in every part of the State, except the Municipality of the Shire of Mandurah and to be a half-holiday in the Municipality of the Shire of Mandurah; and all shops (except small shops and exempted shops) and warehouses, shall, according to the area in which they are situated, be kept shut on that day or after the hour of twelve noon on that day.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth, the 8th day of March, 1966, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Land Act, 1933-1965. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, it is *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole

or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient, as follows:—

Corres. 1224/65.—That Reserve No. 28012 (Denmark Lot 943) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Australian Pensioners' League Western Australia (Incorporated) to be held in trust for "Pensioners' Homes Site."

Corres. 3813/62.—That Reserve No. 28029 (Swan Location 7788) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to The Perth Diocesan Trustees to be held in trust for "Aged Persons Homes."

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid bodies, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject to the conditions that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

1. Responsible Authority: The Authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this scheme is the Shire of Canning (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

2. Scheme Area: The scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a blue border on each of Map No. 2 the Land Use Map and Map No. 3 the Scheme Proposals Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

3. General Objects: The general objects of the scheme are—

- (a) To improve and develop the Scheme Area to the best possible advantage.
- (b) To make suitable provision for the use of the land within the Scheme Area for building purposes.

- (c) To make suitable provision for roads within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To ensure proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
- (e) To make provision for public open space within the Scheme Area.
- (f) To make provision for the widening of Manning Road where it adjoins the Scheme Area.

4. Scheme Works: The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:—

- (a) The Scheme Area shall be re-surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Proposals Map with such minor variations as may be determined by the Council.
- (b) The roads of which the proposed carriageway is coloured yellow on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be constructed and drained.
- (c) The footways shown on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be formed paved and fenced.
- (d) The footbridge shown on the Scheme Proposals Map shall be constructed.
- (e) Those outbuildings or fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision shall be demolished or otherwise removed.

5. Acquisition of Land: The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is necessary to implement the scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council.

6. Valuations: The lots shown on the Land Use Map (hereinafter called "old lots") shall be valued as at the 28th September, 1964, on which date the Council passed a resolution deciding to prepare the scheme and each owner will as soon as the valuation has been made be notified of the value so placed on his old lot.

7. The lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area in accordance with the Scheme Proposals Map (hereinafter called "new lots") shall be valued on the basis that all works to be undertaken as part of this scheme have been carried out.

8. The valuations shall be made by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia or by some person appointed by him to ascertain the value of the land assuming that there are no buildings structures or fences thereon.

9. If an owner objects to the value placed on his old lot he may give notice of such objection to the Council within twenty-eight (28) days after having been served with notice of the said value or revised value. If the valuer does not agree to change the value the value shall be determined by the arbitration of a single arbitrator in the manner provided by the Arbitration Act, 1895. If the parties fail to agree upon any one arbitrator he shall be nominated by the Council.

10. If a value placed on a lot shall be changed as the result of an objection the valuer may reconsider the values placed on the other lots and make such re-valuations as he considers just and equitable. The owners affected shall forthwith be notified of any changes in value so made.

11. Increase Value Ratio.—From the sum of the values of the new lots shall be deducted the costs or estimated costs of the scheme and the figure so ascertained is the net value of the new

12. Owners Interest in Scheme.—Each owner of an old lot or portion of an old lot in the Scheme Area shall be deemed to be entitled to an interest in this scheme of a value equal to the value of his old lot or the portion thereof within the Scheme Area increased in the ratio of the increase value ratio determined in accordance with paragraph 11 hereof.

13. Costs of Scheme.—The Scheme shall be debited with—

- (a) The administration costs of the scheme including an amount to reimburse the Council for such overhead and supervision costs as may be incurred in the implementation of the scheme.
- (b) The costs of the works to be carried out.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) The estimated compensation and costs payable under Clause 14 hereof.
- (e) The cost of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.
- (f) The cost of altering existing electricity water sewerage drainage or telephone services or of providing exceptional services rendered necessary by the scheme to the extent to which and in cases where the Council considers the cost justified.

14. Estimate of Compensation.—In the event of any claims for compensation not having been settled at the time when the Council is ready to transfer lots in pursuance of this scheme the Council may estimate the amount of compensation payable and the costs relating thereto and debit the scheme with the amount so estimated. In the event of the Council so doing the difference between the estimated and the actual compensation payable shall be received or paid by the Council as the case may be.

15. Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.—Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of this scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption or the issue of a notice of rescission under clause 25 hereof whichever is the later.

16. Allocation and Disposal of New Lots.—The new lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) The Council shall set aside sufficient lots (hereinafter called "saleable lots") in order that the costs of the scheme may be paid from the sale of them.
- (b) The remaining new lots shall be apportioned among the owners of the old lots as equitably as possible and offered to such owners. Each owner of an old lot within the Scheme Area will be offered a new lot or lots as nearly as may be in the same position as his old lot and where possible having the same amenities of view corner position and the like.
- (c) The offer mentioned in subclause (b) hereof will be made either with an offer of payment of money or subject to the owner making a payment of money in order that the total value of the new lots offered and the value of any old lot or portion thereof not acquired by the Council and retained by the owner together with or subject to a payment in money is equal to the owners interest in the scheme as ascertained in accordance with Clause 12 hereof. The offer may be made in the alternative giving the owner the right to accept either a lot or lots subject to a

payment by him or to accept no lots or a lesser number of lots with a payment by the Council to him.

17. Nature of Offers.—The offers mentioned in clause 16 hereof shall be made in writing to each of the said owners and served by certified post on him at his address as appearing in the Rate Book of the Council and shall specify the new lot or lots the subject of the offer and the old lot in respect of which the offer is made. It shall also specify the owners interest in the scheme, how the offer is calculated, the valuations placed on the said lots and the payment to be made or received as the case may be.

18. If a pipe drain has been laid across land within a new lot such new lot may be offered or sold expressly subject to the condition that the transferee shall grant to the Council or to the Metropolitan Water Supply Sewerage and Drainage Board as decided by the Council, a drainage easement over so much of the lot as is required for the drain. If the Council shall itself have granted an easement to the said Board the lot shall be transferred subject to such easement.

19. The offer shall specify a date not being less than twenty-eight (28) days after the posting of the said offer within which the offer may be accepted.

20. The offer may be accepted by notice in writing to the Council at any time before the date specified in the said offer and if not accepted within such time shall unless the time shall have been extended by the Council be deemed to have been rejected.
