WHEREAS by section 109 of the Land Act, 1933-1965, the Governor may resume, for any purpose as in the public interest he may think fit any portion of land held as a pastoral lease; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the portions of Pastoral Leases 394/414 and 394/415 described in the schedules hereto should be resumed for the purposes of a "Water Supply" and "Railway Purposes" respectively: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portions of Pastoral Leases 394/414 and 394/415 for the purposes aforemid poses aforesaid.

## Schedule 1.

All that portion of Pastoral Lease 394/414, containing 1,974 acres, bounded by lines starting from a point on a northern boundary of that lease situate 188 chains 25 links west of the south-western corner of Pastoral Lease 394/734 and extending 162 degrees 8 minutes, 204 chains 55 links; thence 252 degrees 8 minutes, 121 chains 21 links; thence 342 degrees 8 minutes, 121 chains 21 links, and thence 37 degrees 42 minutes, 143 chains 94 links to the starting point.

Constitution Act, 1889.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1224/60.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government ment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Act of Legislature or by Order in Council may be vested in the heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in Pebert James Department or any person appointed in Robert James Donovan, or any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby vests in Robert James Donovan and any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages.
